This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. We gather to remember that extraordinary moment in the ministry of Our Lord. In his transfigured presence, he revealed in such a profound way, his divine nature. Peter wanted to hold on to the moment if he could.

If we think about it, there are many moments we might wish we could hold on to for as long as possible; catching up with a dear friend we haven't seen in a long time, witnessing an awesome achievement of one of our children, experiencing a spectacular sunset.

August days can be filled with such moments! Many families are on vacation or spending quality time together. There is a sense of urgency to make the most of these early days of August before college students begin returning to their college campuses and the start of school appears on the horizon.

This past year we began a great new venture by having a Catholic Charities social worker on campus two days a week to assist Sr. Paulanne and the Needy Family Fund assess the best outreach to people who are in need. Beatriz Mandanas-Camasosa has been of great assistance in helping folks develop a plan to face the issues that are creating a crisis in their life. Beatriz has developed action plans for almost 100 clients this past year. She has really helped us make sure that every dollar raised for the Needy Family Fund goes to where it will make the biggest difference.

On October 13, Sr. Paulanne will be the 2017 recipient of the Catholic Charities, Heart of Charity Award. There could not be a more deserving awardee!

There are many projects in full swing here on campus. Several projects funded by the capital campaign are in progress; the second floor of the new parish center will have offices and meeting space, the upgraded sound system for the church will soon be installed, the STEM lab in the school should be ready by the beginning of the school year. Construction on the plaza and steps of the Church will begin shortly. The new Youth Ministry Center will soon be open.

Speaking of the Youth Ministry Center, please join me in welcoming our new Youth Minister, Randy McGraw. He will be introducing himself at all the masses soon and will be hosting open houses in the new youth ministry center on the lower level of the parish ministry center this month. Randy has great ideas for the future and will be gathering students and parents to begin hearing about dreams and hopes for our outreach to our young people, our greatest treasure!

I am excited and blessed to be Youth Minister at OLPH! It feels like God has brought my life full circle and has given me this awesome opportunity to serve Him, our Church, and all the teens and young people of OLPH.

My journey began on a farm in Iowa. As a boy, I read the story of Fr. Damian of Molokai, a missionary to the Hawaiian Islands. His biography inspired me to join Divine Word Missionaries after high school and eventually ask for assignment to Ghana, W. Africa. After five years as a priest in Africa, I returned to Divine Word Missionaries headquarters at Techny as Director of Communications and Fundraising. Because I loved parish work, I helped out with daily and weekend Masses at Holy Cross in Deerfield where I met Fr. Jack Thinnis and Fr. Jerry Boland.

Though I loved being a priest, I also felt called to be married and raise a family. After 20 years with Divine Word, I left the active priesthood. Sometime later, I met the love of my life, Gery Thomas, a native of Glenview and OLPH. When we married, Gery had four children, ages 16, 14, 12, and 10. Two years later, our son Ted was born and we adopted our sixth, Tim, now 17. So I have a very deep appreciation and understanding for the parents of teenagers!

I then worked as a mental health counselor and therapist at Good Shepherd and Alexian Brothers hospitals and as program manager at a residential treatment center for children and adolescents. Eventually, I became a high school guidance counselor and after one year at Amundson High School in the city, I was hired at Glenbrook South where I worked as a counselor for the past 14 years. I really enjoyed my students and serving as a mentor, advisor, and trusted adult.

Our family moved to Glenview two years ago. During my first discussion with Fr. Boland, he shared the hope of finding a director of youth ministry for OLPH. A seed was planted. I wondered then if I might be called to work with the teens of our parish.

The goal of every encounter and activity in Youth Ministry will be to help each young person recognize that not only do they belong at Our Lady of Perpetual Help; they are very important to our parish! We want our teens and young people to share their lives of faith with us and with each other. Whether from OLPH, Loyola, GBS, Regina, Attea, Notre Dame, Springman, New Trier, St. Ignatius, or another school, we need their insight, inquiries, passion and compassion. We invite them to create community and be involved in service and outreach.

With a Masters of Divinity from Catholic Theological Union, I have background in Theology and Scripture. As youth minister, my focus will include the faith and spiritual development needs of our teens. I have given junior high and high school retreats and the past 25 years have taught junior high religious education classes. As a parent and school counselor, I've learned and appreciate the ups and downs of adolescence and honed my ability to listen, encourage, teach, support and challenge.





- Anyone who has not been baptized
- Anyone who has been baptized in a different faith community but wishes to join the Catholic Church
- Anyone who has been baptized in the Catholic Church but hasn't received other sacraments
- Parishioners who want to learn more about the Church and share their faith with others



While RCIA is open to the whole parish, it is especially aimed at those who are new to the faith and those who will be received into full communion with the Church. Those who wish to be part of this journey of faith will learn more about Catholic doctrine, share their faith experiences with one another, be edified by the value of the Christian life, and be instructed in the manner we worship as a Church.


Our parish will soon begin a new journey into the faith for those interested in joining our Catholic family. Sessions begin Thursday September 14.



Guatemala Mission Trip...Making a Difference



From July 13-20, six adults and ten young people from OLPH joined with almost 30 other participants on a week-long mission trip to the Central Highlands of Guatemala to visit an orphanage home operated by Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH), which is Spanish for Our Little Brothers and Sisters.

While on the trip, participants performed various chores and projects around the orphanage home's large campus. These chores included working on the farm, assisting in the kitchen, helping in English language classes, etc. The most important service task, however, was to build relationships and bridges of intercultural understanding with the children who live at NPH Guatemala.

NPH Guatemala provides services to 263 orphaned, abandoned and disadvantaged children. It is one of nine homes in the NPH network that provides 3,200 children across Latin America and the Caribbean with a home, unconditional love, and all the opportunities they need to grow into productive citizens and to break the cycle of poverty that has plagued their families and communities for generations.
