Dear Parishioners,

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish was established in 1919 by Cardinal Mundelein. We had been a mission of St. Joseph's in Wilmette since 1906. When informed of his assignment as the first pastor, Fr. Martin Schmidt asked Cardinal Mundelein, "where is Glenview?" The Cardinal responded, "I have no idea, you better get a map".

Thank God Fr. Schmidt found Glenview!

Many of our earliest parishioners were German immigrants from the Moselle Valley which is in the southwest region of Germany.

Fr. Joseph Vattman who assisted in those earliest days is responsible for naming our parish, Our Lady of Perpetual Help. He had been deeply moved by visiting the original icon at the Church of St. Alphonsus in Rome and bought a blessed image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help to be hung in the original mission church. Before there was a brick church, Mass was celebrated on the second floor of the Glenview Public House.

This weekend is one of the most highly anticipated events. We begin with Mass on the rectory lawn followed by a wonderful gathering organized by the Men's Club. This event kicks off a new program year, but in many ways, it is the annual celebration of our parish community.

As we begin anew this weekend, it is important to pause and praise God for all the blessings he has bestowed upon us. How blest we are! OLPH has established itself as a vibrant and highly respected community of faith.

If Father Schmidt came upon Church and Grove Streets, I suspect he would be blown away at what came of that little mission church he established as a parish.

So much has happened since we celebrated last September! We have begun the implementation of the Parish Transformation Initiative which has already resulted in new life and energy. We embarked on the "To Teach Who Christ Is" Capital Campaign and raised over 5 million dollars!

Many have hoped and prayed for a youth ministry program that would reach out to the thousands of teenagers that have little connection to our parish. Randy McGraw is off and running as our new youth minister.

With funds raised by the capital campaign, we have invested in significant improvements around our campus. We have provided a new apartment for our Sisters who we all love. The apartment is designed so that it will meet their needs as their health or age changes. Hickey Hall is an awesome meeting space. We are putting the final touches on a state of the art STEM Lab in the school. Our new Religious Education Center is beautiful and serves as a great resource for the almost 1000 children in the program. We have made major upgrades in the church regarding the sound system. Soon, the steps and plaza in front of the Church, and improved parking access to the ramp and elevator, will be enhanced.

In recent months, there have been changes to our staff. We welcome Jim Dollard as our new Director of Finance and Operations, Melissa Conroy as our new Director of Communications, Mike Hrvojevic as our Director of Facilities and Patricia Musker as an assistant principal. We also welcome our new seminarians, Justin Agbir from the Diocese of Tucson and Michael Lingaur from the Diocese of Gaylord.

It is going to be a great year! Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Pray for Us!

World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

On Thursday evening, OLPH was honored to host a Solemn Vespers for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. Begun three years ago, this annual ecumenical event celebrates a meeting of minds and wills between members of the Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches in relation to our God-entrusted responsibility to care for the world and its environment. In attendance were Bishop Francis J. Kane, who presided at the ceremony, and Bishop Demetrios of Mokissos, the chancellor of the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Chicago. Clergy and faithful from both the Catholic and Orthodox churches were present at the event which was followed by a reception and talk by Mr. Bob Langert, a former executive at McDonalds and expert in sustainability.



The evening was permeated by a sense of goodwill and brotherhood, and I've since received numerous comments of gratitude from our Orthodox brothers and sisters who were in attendance. Throughout the night, I kept thinking back to the words of the psalmist: "Behold, how good and pleasant it is for brothers to dwell together in unity." (Psalm 133) I am grateful for the peace of that evening, and left the ceremonies more mindful of the common task of humankind to care for our world.

Our Parish has much to offer, and we all have talents to offer our community. As we read in Scripture, let's not hide them under a bushel but, instead, let our lights shine!

Throughout the coming year, OLPH will embrace "Each One, Bring One," by encouraging each of us to accompany someone to Mass, to a ministry meeting, or to a church activity. As Christ asks us to follow him and then accompanies us on our journey, we must carry out His mission by leading others to Christ. Let us reach out to one another as brothers and sisters, as children of God. Let us be a faith community that is gathered in Christ's loving embrace. "Each One, Bring One"—ask and accompany.

Training for Extraordinary Ministers of Eucharist to the Sick

Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to parishioners who are homebound, living in nursing homes or hospitals. They share the word of God in scripture, join in prayer and offer companionship. Through the Ministry of Care, we strive to keep long-time parishioners of OLPH connected and active in our faith community.



This Ministry is open to all members of our parish community. A training course for new Ministers of Care will begin Wednesday, September 27 and continue for five successive Wednesday evenings. Each session focuses on a specific aspect of the Ministry of Care; however, the unifying thread woven through all is a commitment to helping you develop the skills and confidence needed to be a source of comfort to those who are sick. Each weekly session is two hours and will be facilitated by Rick Nash, as well as retired priests from Presence St. Benedict Home. Completion of this course qualifies you to receive the Archdiocesan mandate to bring Communion to the sick, homebound and hospitalized of our parish.

- Rehearses on Tuesdays, 5:45-6:30 PM. in the new Music Office (former Dussman Room).
- Rehearsals begin Tuesday September 26.

Cantors

- Cantors audition from the choir and are then trained.
- Scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability.
- A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors sings periodically at the Saturday 5PM or Sunday 6PM Mass

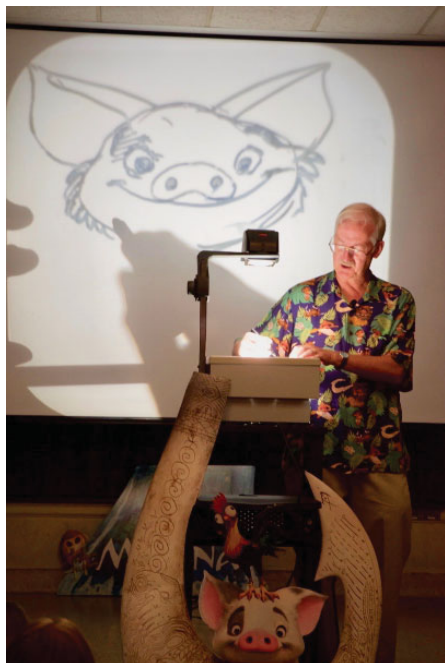

Thomas Merton's Fascination with Buddhism

September 30 at 9:30 a.m | McDonnell Hall

Thomas Merton was an American Catholic writer, theologian and mystic. A Trappist monk and priest of the Abbey of Gethsemani, Kentucky, he was a poet, social activist and student of comparative religion.

Merton was a keen proponent of interfaith understanding. He embodied the concept of "mutual irradiation" i.e. that one can stay deeply rooted in one's own faith tradition and yet receive wisdom and enlightenment from learning about other spiritual paths.

He pioneered dialogue with prominent Asian spiritual figures, including the Dalai Lama, the Japanese writer D.T. Suzuki, and the Vietnamese monk Thich Nhat Hanh. Merton had studied the Desert Fathers and other Christian mystics and he found many parallels between the language of these Christian mystics and the language of Zen philosophy. He was deeply interested in what each said of the depth of human experience.

In this presentation, Jim will trace the essential lines of Thomas Merton's long inquiry into Buddhist thought and spiritual practice. Along the way, we will glance at his correspondence and meeting with the great Zen Buddhist sage, D.T. Suzuki. Then we will talk about his encounter with the Vietnamese Buddhist teacher, Thich Nhat Hanh. Finally, we'll explore his rich interaction with His Holiness, the Dalai Lama. How important was Buddhism to Thomas Merton? The question is central to modern interreligious understanding.

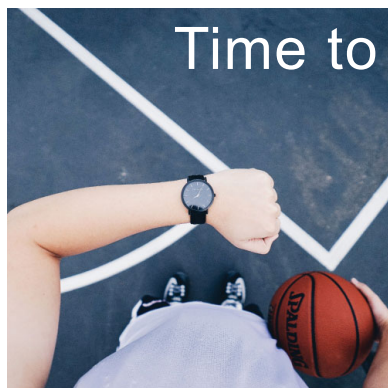
