Dear Parishioners,

First Communion season is just around the corner, one of my favorite seasons of the year. This year we have over two hundred children preparing for First Communion between Religious Education and the School.

I always encourage parents of

First Communicants to really get into the spirit of what their child is discovering about the Eucharist. See the sacrament through their eyes. It will renew your faith as much as theirs.

There is nothing compared to the delight of a First Communicant's reception of the Eucharist. One little girl told me last year, "I want to go to communion every day!"

The centrality of the Eucharist is losing its grip on the community of believers as less people are regularly going to Mass. As wonderful as the virtual Masses were during the pandemic and continue to be these days, there is nothing that can compare with worshipping in person and receiving the Eucharist at communion time.

For many people, the encounter of the risen Lord on the Road to Emmaus is their favorite post Resurrection appearance. There are so many layers to this extraordinary encounter,

expressed most powerfully in the verse, "Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of the bread."

It is in the breaking of the bread that we are fed on our spiritual journey. It is in the breaking of the bread; the Risen Lord is most present to us. It is in the breaking of the bread that we are missioned today to be witnesses to the Resurrection, to announce repentance for our sins and to preach the Good News to all the nations.

Every Friday we have adoration of the Eucharist from 9:00am concluding with Benediction at 3:45pm.

I want to express my sincere gratitude to our Ministers of Care under the leadership of Jim Vlazny and Rick Nash who are our vessels of the Lord's presence as they bring the Eucharist to the homebound and sick. This Saturday, our Ministers of Care are participating in a morning of renewal led by Fr. John Kartje. There is a comfort beyond words for someone unable to come to church to receive the eucharist. Nothing can comfort an anxious patient in a hospital or a resident in assisted living who feels isolated like a visit from a minister of care.

I am grateful to Bob and Penny Pierson who bring the Eucharist to residents at Chestnut Square and Margaret Lovely who brings the Eucharist to residents at the Vi. We are fortunate to have many Ministers of Care in our parish.

We have a wonderful team of catechists in Religious Ed and Teachers in the school that help form our children with

> a deep appreciation of the eucharist in their lives.

> This year we continue to observe the Eucharistic Revival initiated by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. 

What is the OLPH Parish Pastoral Council?

The OLPH Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is an advisory body that supports the Church's concept of shared responsibility among laity, religious, and clergy. The PPC is made up of 15 parishioners and our pastor, Fr. Jerry Boland. Its purpose is to:

- Listen to, identify, and examine the needs, ideas, and hopes of our faith community;
- Engage with over sixty OLPH ministries to understand and affirm their work and help them address their needs and challenges;
- Create a "culture of involvement" within the parish that welcomes and embraces others and encourages the development of leaders across the parish;
- Help envision, shape, and implement the future goals of our parish and monitor our ongoing success as we strive to fulfill the Church's teachings.

The PPC meets throughout the year on the third Monday of every month according to its bylaws. Meetings follow an established agenda defined in advance based on input from Fr. Boland and PPC members. Members also organize and plan the annual Summit and Ministry Appreciation Mass and Reception. PPC members serve a three-year term beginning each July.

We asked several members of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) to share their experience. Here are the responses from PPC Board Member **Laura Roche**:

When did you and your family join OLPH?

My husband Jim and I moved to Glenview in December 1995 and discovered OLPH after our move. When our two children were born several years later, they received their sacraments and completed Religious Ed at OLPH.

When did you first hear about the PPC?

I was aware of the PPC in a general way, but I became more aware of it when **Tom O'Brien** encouraged me to apply to become a member.

What does the PPC do?

The PPC's roles are twofold: outreach and support.

The PPC plans the annual Parish Summit and the annual Ministry Appreciation Mass and dinner. We meet monthly with our pastor to discuss current and future issues facing the parish and provide Father Jerry with feedback. And we connect with the numerous parish ministries at OLPH to provide support when needed.

Is there an aspect of the PPC that you enjoy the most?

I truly enjoy the comraderie of the Council membership and learning about our vibrant parish ministries. It is very faith-affirming to see Jesus in action through the diverse activities and passionate members of our ministries. How would you describe PPC meetings?

The PPC meetings are filled with dynamic discussion and interesting topics surrounding our parish. Our meeting agenda focuses on Father Jerry's updates on OLPH activities. 


