

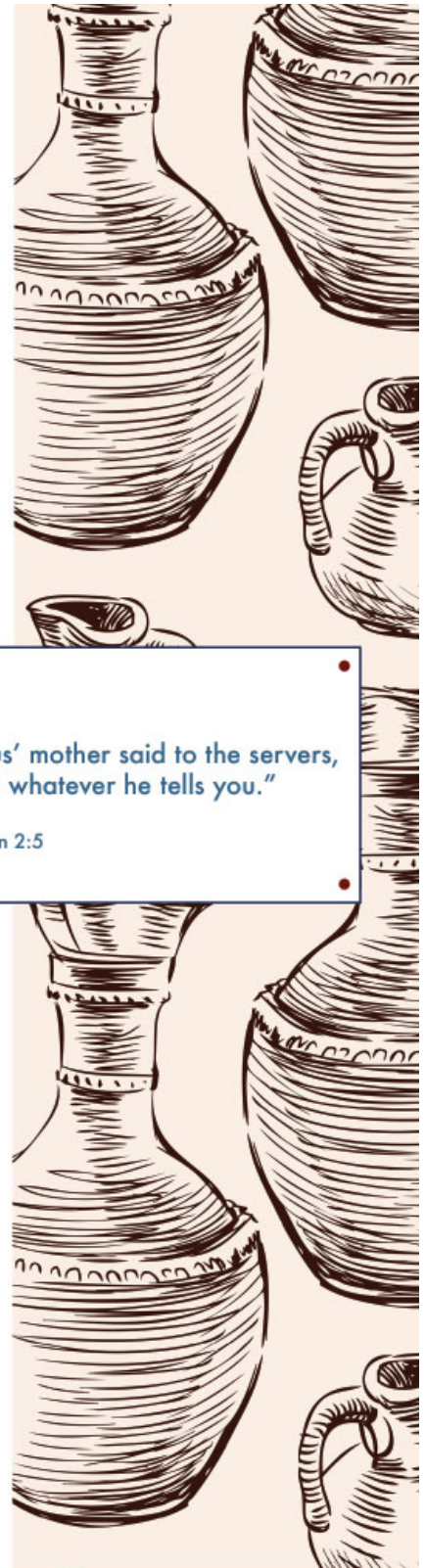

SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

In today's second reading, Saint Paul makes a list of gifts dispensed to members of the Christian community by the Holy Spirit. Each gift bestowed has a specific purpose for the person for whom it is intended: wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, mighty deeds, prophecy, discernment, tongues, and interpretation. Good stewards know these gifts are not meant to be kept hidden by the recipient but to be shared with the community and beyond. As we begin a new year, let us reflect on the gift the Holy Spirit has given to each of us. Do we recognize this gift? How was it intended that we use this gift? Are we being good stewards of this gift?

Dear Parishioners,

"there are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit"

We read this weekend from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, in which he reflects on the many gifts we all possess. Though different they all come from the same Spirit.

Last week I shared in a wonderful gathering called the "Evening of Pentecost". It is a crucial part of the Christ Renews His Parish/Welcome process. After attending the weekend retreat and completing the formation process, folks are invited to reflect on what can I bring to the parish community? During the evening there are powerful witnesses given on parishioner's experiences of the ministries they are involved in and what a difference this experience has made on their spiritual life. These ministries have made these parishioners feel much more connected to the mission of our parish.

As I sat back and listened I was reminded how expansive the reach of this parish is, its blest history of engaging the Word, how generous parishioners have been in giving of themselves in building up the Kingdom. **Mary Mulae** spoke of her longtime involvement with SPRED, our outreach to children with special needs. **Margaret Pasquesi** spoke of the impact Parent Effectiveness Training has had on her role as a parent and now she is an instructor. **Charmaine Conaghan** spoke of the blessedness of being a Minister of Care and how much more she receives that gives. **Marty Kearney** spoke about the Men's Club and the camaraderie and service to the parish that has resulted. **Janet Pomillo** reflected on her involvement with Bereavement Ministry and the special blessing it is to be with families amid grief.

"To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit", Paul reminds us that we all have something to give and something to receive. Our sharing in the gifts of the spirit brings incredible grace to the community of faith. These parishioners that witnessed that night invoked in me a deep sense of gratitude for the gift of ministry. Getting involved in parish life beyond worship brings so many rewards and helps to make our faith community alive and vital. Maybe one of your New Year's resolutions was to get more involved. Please explore that! We need you! From Greeter/Ushers, to Sharing Room helpers to Religious Education catechists, we have so many opportunities. If you would like to explore how you might get more involved, don't hesitate to call myself, the priests or the staff and we can help steer you in the right direction.

Last year the Engagement Committee invited us to consider, "Each One Bring One" as a practical way of evangelizing. Most people get involved after feeling that they have been invited. Our web site is a great place to start to discern where the Spirit may be leading you in the coming year.

Our parish staff had an extended meeting that was facilitated by **Dr. Rich Blue**. He is a therapist and helped us to explore ways of deepening our care and concern for one another. These are such challenging days in the life of the Church. For those on the "front line" of ministry there can be a fair amount of stress. I am blessed to be ministering with such deeply committed people.

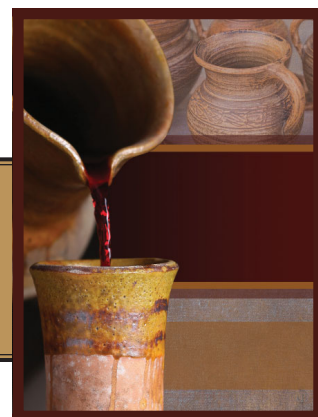

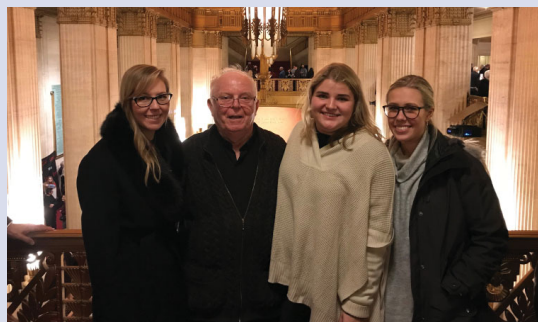

Even the general audience of mostly older people felt like the music of the opera took them into a different place, even a different culture. But there was no mistaking the powerful attraction of a truly beautiful performance.

One of our great needs as human beings is to let beauty impact us. Much of the time our young people are bombarded by growling sounds that overwhelm them. The music of the opera was beautiful, as was the whole production. But the coming together of a big international cast with some of the world's greatest singers was an experience of immersion in beauty. I am most grateful to the people who contribute generously to our efforts so that we can give our young people a great cultural experience.

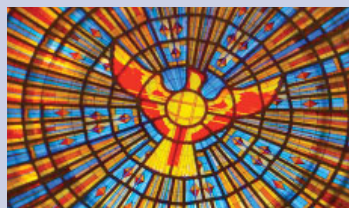

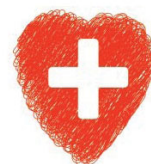

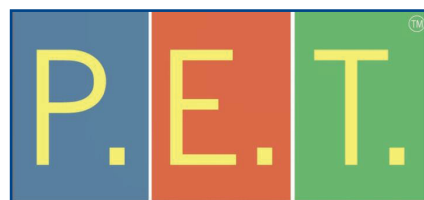
