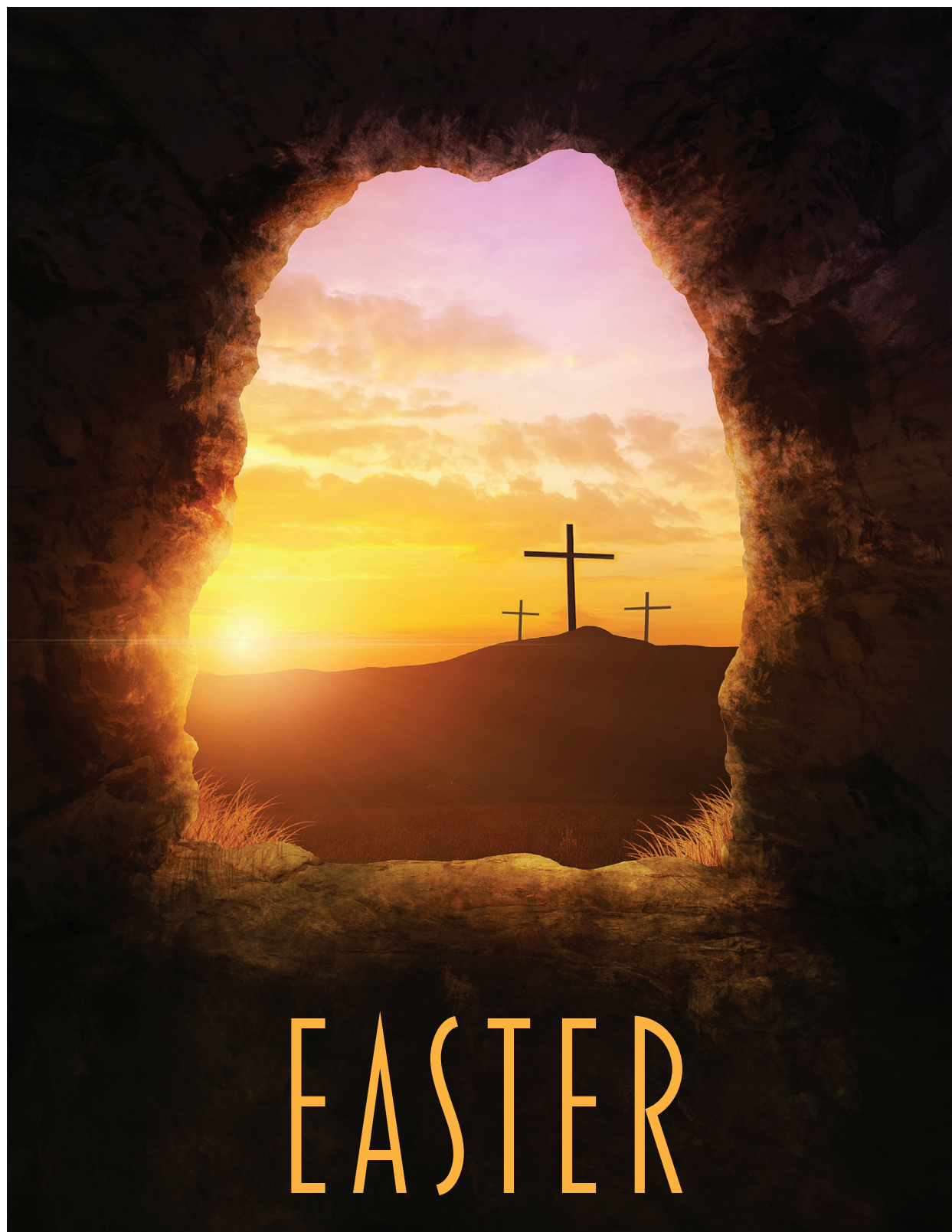

Thoughts on the

Sunday Scriptures

There is a brevity, a certain terseness, in the scripture readings for Easter Sunday. Peter's speech in Acts is built of direct, pointed sentences. Paul's letters are based on straightforward creed-like statements. Even the Gospel story only briefly recounts what will turn out to be one of the most remarkable events in human history—the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

Scripture scholars call them kerygmata, or “kernels” of our faith. Actually, “kernels” or “seeds” are good terms for these statements, since throughout the Easter season, we will hear in the accounts of the days following the Resurrection exactly how these kerygmata began to flower, how they continued to grow through the life of the early church. May these Easter “seeds” of faith serve a similar purpose for us, too, so that the life of the Risen Christ will flourish in us and through our witness in the coming days.

Dear Parishioners,

The Lord is Risen from the dead! Alleluia!

This was the ancient greeting of the Church during the Easter Season. It exudes the joy of the believer that the Lord has risen from the dead. The “tree of his defeat has become the tree of his victory”.

Easter Sunday is always an occasion of joy and celebration. This Easter shows us how much we need Easter!

Easter Sunday is an acknowledgement that hope has been realized through the blessed Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World.

I have been reflecting on the difference between optimism and hope. In some ways these emotions are similar but in many ways they are different.

Optimism is the belief that things are going to get better; that in the end everything will work out, possibly even better than what was. It is important to be optimistic, especially during this time of uncertainty and fear. While there are many things that can cause discouragement, not a day goes by that we don't hear extraordinary stories of people's courage, generosity and kindness.

Hope is different. Hope in the Christian context is the unconditional conviction that together we believe the world can be transformed. The belief that in proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ, we participate in a process of redemption, of transformation, of liberation. Hope is not realized without pain and struggle.

As we face this pandemic together, we hope for a renewal of faith, a deeper appreciation of love, a reassurance that God will never abandon us. Alleluia!

This Easter weekend, our world continues to grapple with the challenges of the Coronavirus. We have all been affected by it. Our mobility is limited, our interactions restricted, our sense of well being altered. Easter comes into our lives inviting us to open our hearts and souls to the profound love God has for us and the blessed hope he entrusts to us.

This Easter, I am missing all of you so much. I find great comfort in your devotion to the Lord and to this parish. I hope in the promise of eternity, I hope that in the midst of the uncertainty we will grow only closer in faith.

This Easter has brought a new appreciation for me of the power of relationships, of community, of faith and the sanctity of life.

Thank you for your thoughtfulness and kindness to me and all who minister here. In this stressful time I am so grateful to my brother priests, our parish staff, to our countless employees, who have gone above and beyond during this time.

Our teachers who have worked so hard at E-Learning. To our Maintenance Staff that have done a deep clean of the entire campus. To everyone involved in the production of our masses over YouTube. Thank you for the extra efforts so many of you have made to support the parish financially in this time of duress.

Divine Mercy Sunday April 19

"Whoever approaches the Fount of Life on this day will be granted complete remission of sins and punishment."

—Jesus to St. Faustina

St. Faustina

Maria Faustyna Kowalska (born Helena Kowalska; 1905–1938), also known as Saint Maria Faustyna Kowalska of the Blessed Sacrament and popularly spelled Faustina, was a Polish Roman Catholic nun and mystic. Her apparitions of Jesus Christ inspired the Roman Catholic devotion to Divine Mercy and earned her the title of "Secretary of Divine Mercy."

Throughout her life, Kowalska reported having visions of Jesus and conversations with him, of which she wrote in her diary, later published as *The Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska: Divine Mercy in My Soul*. Her biography, submitted to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, quoted some of these conversations with Jesus regarding the Divine Mercy devotion.

At the age of 20 years, she joined a convent in Warsaw, was transferred to Płock. Kowalska wrote that on the night of Sunday, February 22, 1931, while she was in her cell in Płock, Jesus appeared wearing a white garment with red and pale rays emanating from his heart. In her diary, she wrote that Jesus told her:

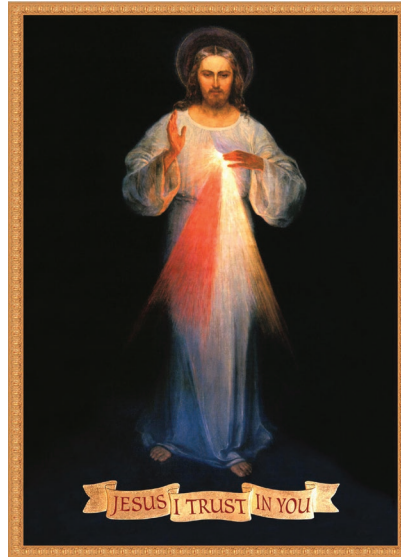
"Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: 'Jesus, I trust in You' (in Polish: 'Jezu, ufam Tobie'). I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and then throughout the world. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish."

Not knowing how to paint, Kowalska approached some other nuns at the convent for help, but she received no assistance. Three years later, after her assignment to Vilnius, Lithuania, the first artistic rendering of the image was performed under her direction.

At Vilnius, she met her confessor Father Michał Sopoćko, who supported her devotion to the Divine Mercy. In January 1934, Fr. Sopoćko introduced her to the artist Eugene Kazimierowski, who happened to live upstairs. By June 1934, Kazimierowski had finished painting the image based on the direction of Kowalska and Sopoćko. A superimposition of the face of Jesus in the Image of Divine Mercy upon that in the already well-known Shroud of Turin shows great similarity.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy

Jesus revealed to St. Faustina a powerful prayer that he wants everyone to say—the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. It's easy to memorize and requires only seven minutes to pray. Saint Faustina prayed the Chaplet almost constantly, especially for the dying, and the Lord urged her to encourage others to say it too, promising extraordinary graces to those who would recite it. A Special Request from Pope Francis to Pray the Chaplet

In response to the pandemic, the Holy Father approved a **plenary indulgence each day** for anyone who prays the

Chaplet of Divine Mercy *"to implore from Almighty God the end of the Covid-19 pandemic, relief for those who are afflicted and eternal salvation for those whom the Lord has called to Himself."* Why did Pope Francis specifically request we pray the Chaplet? Because Jesus promises great graces, especially at the time of death, for anyone who prays this powerful prayer. This is a time of great mercy!

Pray the Divine Mercy Novena beginning Good Friday, April 10 through Saturday, April 18

The Chaplet can be prayed at any time but the Lord specifically asked Saint Faustina that it be recited as a novena which he dictated to her Himself. It begins with a different intention each day for a specific group of souls followed by the Chaplet. It is especially powerful when prayed on the nine days leading up to the Feast of Divine Mercy, which is the Sunday after Easter Sunday. A Whole Ocean of Graces awaits you on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 19

In His very first revelation to St. Faustina, Jesus expressed His desire for this special feast day:

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that

day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy...The Feast of Mercy emerged from the very depths of My tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy."

Even during this time of separation from the sacraments, we can go to Jesus with confidence that He will pour these graces upon us if on Sunday, April 19, we watch Holy Mass on tv, say a sincere Act of Contrition, recite a Spiritual Communion prayer to receive Him into our soul, and be merciful to our neighbor. Most important, we must trust that Jesus will do this for every living soul, for He said: "The graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive."

How to Pray the Chaplet using Rosary beads

1. Make the Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

2. Opening Prayers

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

Then repeat three times:

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!

3, 4 & 5. Pray the Our Father, the Hail Mary, and the Apostle's Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

6. On the Our Father beads pray...

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the 10 Hail Mary beads pray...

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat Steps 6 & 7 for the four remaining decades

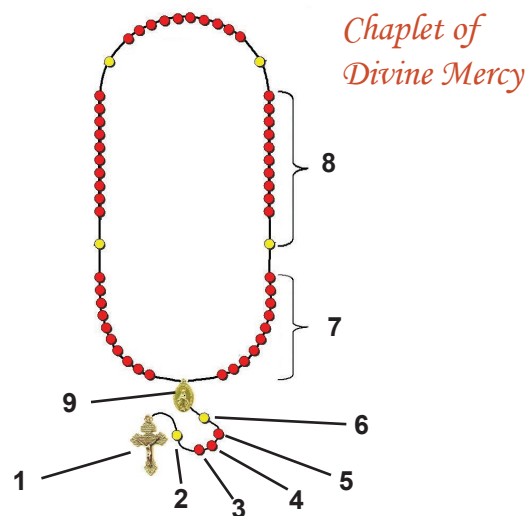
9. Repeat three times...

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

10. Closing Prayer & Sign of the Cross

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself. Jesus, I Trust in You!

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

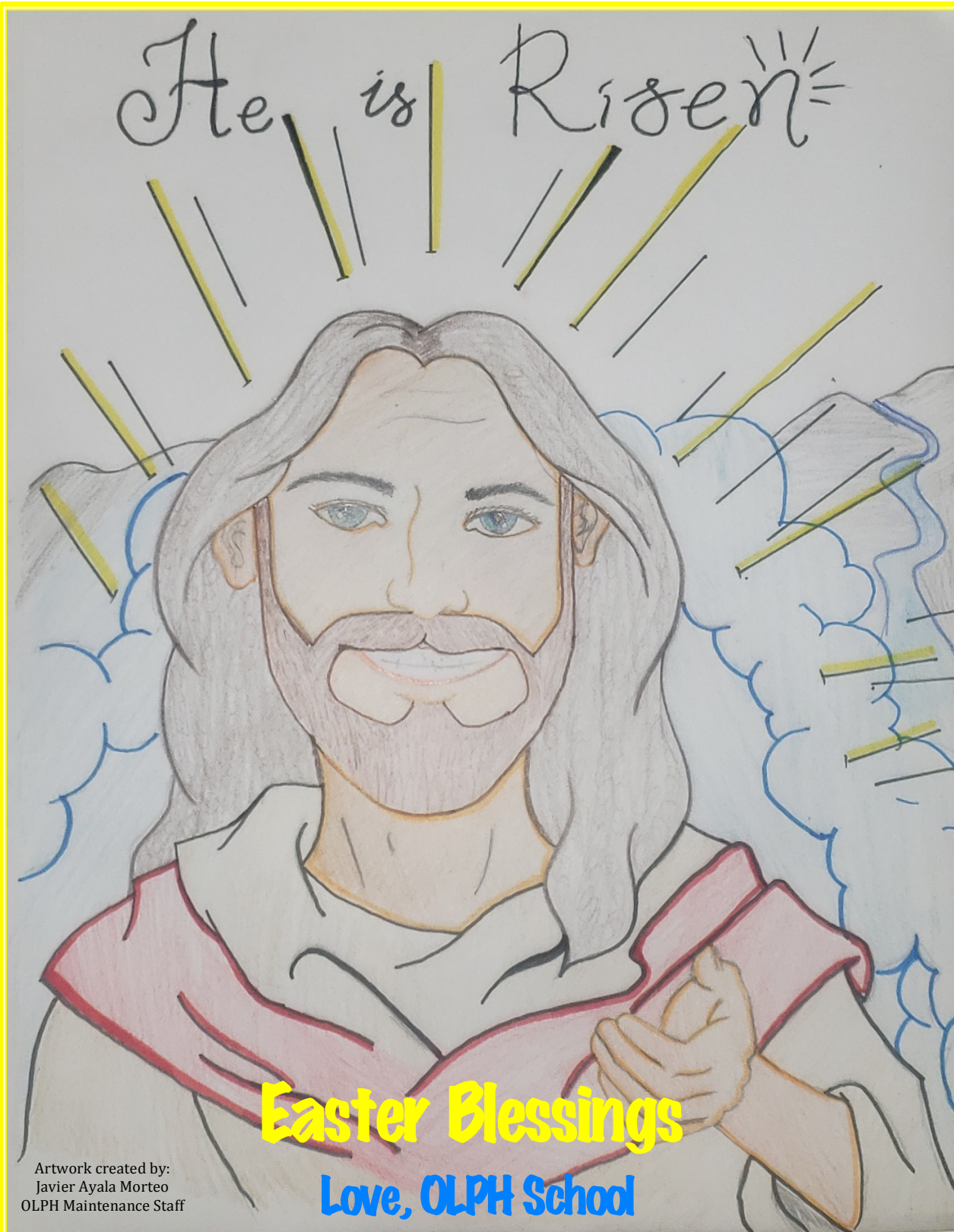
