Thoughts on the Sunday Scriptures

Today we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit, the birth of the Church and the beginning of its mission in the world.

Pentecost Sunday reminds us that our lives are filled with the Holy Spirit and that God has accomplished creative things in us through this gift. We have been entrusted with this great gift of the Holy Spirit.

This great gift empowers us to be bold proclaimers of the Gospel in word and deed. It urges us to speak truth to power. It encourages us to use words and exhortations and even arguments that are meant to heal, show care and compassion and to reconcile.

Now is a good time to ask: Are we being good stewards of this gift of the Holy Spirit? What creative things have we done to glorify God's accomplishments in us?

Dear Parishioners,

"the fruit of the Spirit is love, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, and gentleness."

The Feast of Pentecost commemorates the birthday of the Church. We recall that extraordinary moment when the Spirit descended upon the apostles, huddled in the Upper Room.

Each year as we celebrate Pentecost, we are invited to share in the rebirth of the Church as we face new challenges in proclaiming the Good News.

In a time when our country is divided, when so many have suffered as a result of the pandemic, when many feel a sense of uncertainty, the fruit of the Holy Spirit described in this weekend's scriptures is a gracious gift.

When communities are deeply divided, when we encounter daily the culture of complaint, when we see the scourge of racism and greed, we know we are far from the fruit of the Holy Spirit. Yet the Gospel compels us to witness the fruit of the Holy Spirit.

Pentecost reminds us that the Church is in constant need of renewal. The reality of sin can so easily divide us. We need to return to that moment when the Church was born of the Spirit. This year I have been more keenly aware of the Spirit as I have had the privilege of presiding at so many confirmations. If the Church had not been unable to receive each year the gift of Pentecost, the Church would have never survived.

Last week I shared with you the news that we here at OLPH are participating in the next wave of Renew My Church, along with St. Catherine and the Catholic Community of Northbrook. We are about to enter an intense period of assessment, of dreaming, of collaborating in the confident hope that a direction can be determined that will result in an even stronger, more vital presence of the Church. We are much more than buildings and mortar; we are the People of God.

The timing for this process could not be better. The reopening of our parishes, along with the strategic planning for the future as we encounter a new Pentecost is fortuitous. The goal of Renew My Church is to "build a new reality" of how we can reinvigorate our sense of mission.

I will soon be establishing a steering committee that will work closely with the other two parishes. There will be opportunities for the parish at large to be updated on the progress of the process and to give feedback.

I invite all of you to participate in a program called Renew My Church 101. On Tuesday, June 8, there will be a Zoom/In-person meeting in which **Sara Pekar** from the Archdiocese will give an overview of the Renew My Church process, what is involved, what is the purpose. She will also be able to respond to your questions and concerns. The meeting will last about 1 1/2 hours. Please mark your calendars! Further information will be available next week.

The process of reopening the parish is happening! I am aware that the process of reopening is as complicated and stressful as the "stay in place" moment was at the beginning. I must plead for patience. As of this writing, the situation is very fluid, and it will require a lot of planning so we can move forward in an orderly fashion. Minimally, we hope to double our occupancy by June 1.

We will be receiving guidance on the opening of our facility. By mid to late summer, we will be significantly open to pre-COVID parish life. As protocols change, we will communicate them through Eblasts and our website.

One of the significant meetings I attend every year is the joint meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council. From time to time, I deliver what might be called, the "State of the Union" of the parish, so to speak. At this meeting, I hear a "State of the Parish" from the parishioners' point of view. These two councils are the main governance structures upon which I rely. I have been blessed over and over with the members of these two councils. This year, **Susan Logan** was President of the PPC, and **Bob Michels** was President of the Finance Council.

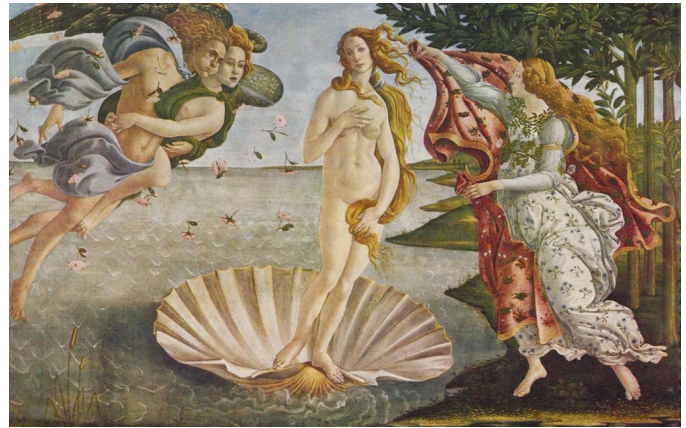

Stewardship Report

To all parishioners: We will soon be approaching our fiscal year end and we would like to take a moment to thank you for your on-going generosity during a very uncertain and trying year.

Since Catch-Up Sunday, in October 2020, and through March 2021, through your continued support, we have been able to stay within 5%, up or down, of last year's monthly collection figures, although month to month vs our current year budget we have fluctuated over 50% upwards to 41% downwards in various months. The month of April, as presented in the chart, shows we are on a downward swing again, compared to April 2020, where both of those months include the Easter Offering, and where 2021 was down approximately \$25,000.

Year-to-date figures, while slightly ahead of budget for most of the year, are now just even with the cumulative budget. Through most of the year this performance has certainly allowed OLPH to operate in a consistent manner, providing for all necessities. We have only you to thank for your overwhelming continued support! As we approach year end, we would like to mention that our general offertory budget sits at just under \$500,000, in total, for the remaining months of May and June.

It would be wonderful if we could end the year having met our budgeted goal for the year, which would allow us to move into the new fiscal year, confident that we are moving forward on a positive note, ensuring that we maintain a strong financial base to support our parish responsibilities towards Catholic faith and education. Please review the Stewardship Report below and, also, please refer to the GiveCentral information, for an easy way to donate online. Once again, we are ever grateful for all that you do for OLPH. May you be ever blest for your generous giving of time, talent and treasure!

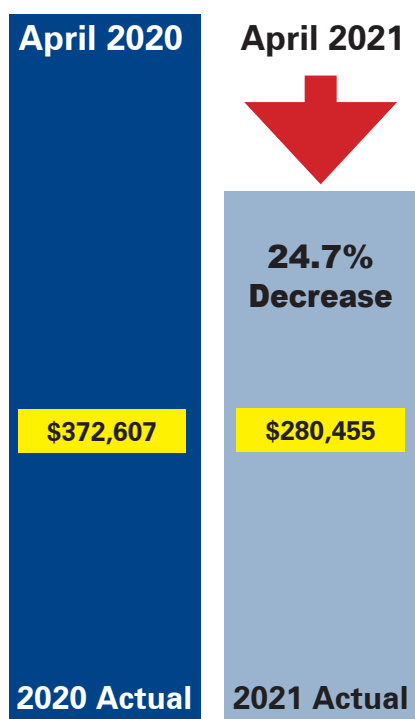

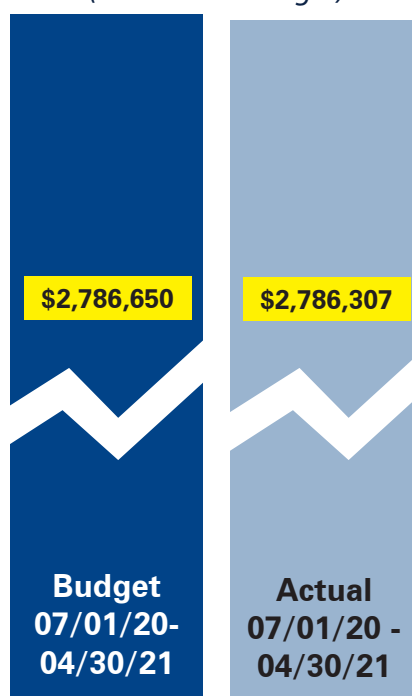

April Results

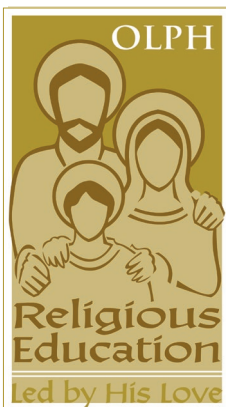


Budget Results

("Even" with Budget)

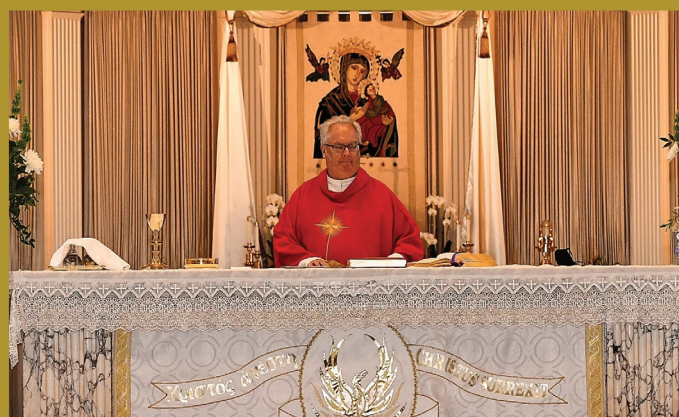

I was deeply influenced by the Franciscan spirituality and prayer offered at St. Peter's Church in the Loop when I worked downtown for many years, which included Marian devotion.
