Dear Parishioners,

"the love of God has been poured into our hearts" Romans 5:5

These early weekends of summer are filled with many celebrations and feasts in the aftermath of Pentecost. This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

One of the most challenging courses one must take in seminary graduate school, is a course entitled; "Trinity, Creation and Grace". It was a complex overview of the historical and theological evolution of the Catholic doctrine on the trinity. It was one of those courses that ended a lot of seminary careers because of its rigor.

I was always tormented on how to address the doctrine of the trinity from a preaching perspective. Fortunately, in the early years of my ministry, a priest who mentored me in many ways shared with me

the insight that ultimately the trinity is all about relationship. The Father, Son and Spirit are in an eternal relationship. They invite all of us into a relationship with them through baptism.

Relationships matter! We all know the turmoil in our lives when a significant relationship in our lives is in distress. We all know the intense pain that follows a relationship that ended badly or one that just faded away. This weekend's second reading invites us to reflect on the powerful reality that God has poured His love into our hearts and we need to witness to that love to one another.

On this Father's Day weekend, we recall the role our fathers have in our lives. We acknowledge the profound relationship a father has with his children. We pray today for all our fathers, living and deceased.

This Saturday, there will be a celebration of jubilarians at the Chapel of St. Joseph at the Motherhouse in Milwaukee. One of those being honored is **Sister Paulanne**. She is marking the 60th Anniversary of her entering the community of the School Sisters of St. Francis. We have been so blessed by her ministry in our midst.

What a grace that her whole ministry has been here at OLPH! From the classroom, to the Sharing Room and everywhere in between she has been and continues to be a profound influence on this faith community. Everybody knows the "nun" from Glenview. We praise God for her ministry and pray that she will celebrate many, many more years of ministry in our midst. We will be having a celebration later in the summer. SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH

The word "trinity" occurs nowhere in scripture, but the doctrine of the Trinity is basic to everything Christians believe. How did the church come to believe that the one God exists as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? This complicated story is an example of the church being taught by the "Spirit of truth."

In today's first reading we hear that Wisdom is God's "craftsman," helping execute God's plan for creation. The text is not about a helper god; it is an imaginative portrayal of Wisdom being both "of God" and external to God. We could say that Wisdom is God's self-gift poured into creation, a sign that God loves creation, delights in it, and (in Genesis chapter 1) pronounces it "good."

THE MYSTERY OF FAITH

John's Gospel begins, "In the beginning was the Word . . . and the Word was God"; John later adds "the Word became flesh" (John 1:14). This is more than poetic imagery. Here John makes a very bold claim. The prophets proclaimed God's word, but Jesus is God's Word—coming from God to us who are not God.

It took more than two hundred years before a universal Council declared that Jesus was "... true God from true God, begotten not made, consubstantial with the Father . . ." Slowly, the church was working toward a doctrine of the Trinity. The doctrine doesn't explain the Trinity, but it does express the incomprehensible mystery of the God whose love overflows into the glories of creation, the messiness of our human condition, and the Spirit of truth that still guides the Church today.



Parent Effectiveness Training SAVE THE DATES: September18 - November 6, 2019




Stewardship Report

EASTER Collection 2019


Thank you for your generosity during our Easter Offertory. We were not, however, able to match or exceed our 2018 Easter Collection.

EvOLve Adult Education Ministry

"Splendors of the Vatican Museums" Tue., June 18, 7:00 - 8:30pm, **McDonnell Hall**

Art historian, Jeff Mishur, is returning with another enriching program featuring art from the Vatican museums that offers some tangible expressions of Church history. Jeff will examine objects from the Early Christian, Renaissance and Baroque periods. He will discuss how these works would have been read by contemporaries and will also focus on iconography and patronage. Some of the less familiar objects to be discussed include the 3rd-5th century Mandylion of Edessa-one of the oldest known depictions of Christ's face- as well as an 8th-9th century Annunciation on silk.

The majority of Jeff's presentation features works in the Vatican collections by Michaelangelo, Leonardo, Raphael and Caravaggio. Come join us for a brief sojourn to Rome and one of the world's greatest art collections. Buon Viaggio!

Creation Care Ministry News

Air Quality Index (AQI) and How You Can Help

What is the AQI?

The AQI is an index for reporting daily air quality. It tells you how clean or unhealthy your air is, and what associated health effects might be a concern. The AQI focuses on health effects you may experience within



a few hours or days after breathing unhealthy air. The AQI is calculated for four major air pollutants regulated by the Clean Air Act: ground level ozone, particle pollution, carbon monoxide, and sulfur dioxide. For each of these pollutants, EPA has established national air quality standards to protect public health.

The purpose of the AQI is to help you understand what local air quality means to your health. To make it easier to understand, the AQI is divided into six levels of health concern:

Air Quality Index (AQI) Values	Levels of Health Concern	Colors	
When the AQI is in this range:	air quality conditions are:	as symbolized by this color:	
0 to 50	Good	Green	
51 to 100	Moderate	Yellow	
101 to 150	Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups	Orange	
151 to 200	Unhealthy	Red	
201 to 300	Very Unhealthy	Purple	
301 to 500	Hazardous Maroon		

Where can you find the AQI? The AQI is regularly reported on weather channels on TV and the Internet. Additionally, you can now find it on Apple Maps in the lower right corner.

How can you help?

Local governments may declare Ozone Action Days when the AQI reachs unhealthy levels. Many manufacturing facilities have agreed to take action on those days, but you can do your part too.



Basic steps in limiting ground ozone during Ozone Action Days are:

- 1 Controlling of auto emissions
 - · Eliminate excessive engine idling
 - Avoid rush hour when slowdowns on roads are most common
 - Park and go inside instead of drive-thru lines at school, fast-food restaurants, and pharmacies
 - · Avoid unnecessary driving by combining trips and carpooling
 - Refuel after 6:00 pm (or after dusk)
 - Do not 'top off'; stop fueling once the nozzle has stopped
- 2 Limit the use of lawn mowers and outdoor grills to after 6:00 pm, or even better, utilize push mowers, manual rakes and brooms
- 3 Limit the use of aerosol cans around the home (for example, hair gel instead of hair spray)
 - · Dispose of the aerosol can properly
- 4 Conserve energy
 - Turn home air conditioning thermostat up to at least 78 as the EPA recommends
 - Utilize fans, turn the thermostat up when not at home, close blinds to reduce sun penetration
 - Turn off or unplug electrical devices when not in usecomputers especially can heat up rooms
 - Install LED lights that utilize less energy. The prices of the lights are now affordable and many electric companies offer subsidized pricing at local stores such as Home Depot, Lowes and Ace Hardware

Join in a Scripture Study meeting. Attend Stations of the Cross with the teens. Help stuff envelopes for mailings. Be a chaperone for a Cubs, Sox or Blackhawks outing. Attend a Teen Mass. Supervise fun night activities in the Playdium. Go bowling. Participate in Habitat for Humanity. Attend an overnight high school retreat. Attend a Confirmation Retreat, Share your story and your faith on an informal basis. You have lots of opportunities.


Summer Dodgeball Returns!

Immigrant Teens from Central America Need Our Help

Last summer and into the fall, so many of you gave generously to the 55 unaccompanied teenagers from Central America who were safely cared for by Maryville Academy. These teenagers were fortunately placed with U.S. sponsors by the government's Office of Refugee Resettlement.

Sr. Cathy Ryan and her staff at Maryville have done a wonderful job caring for these kids, and as a result, Maryville Academy has been asked to house an additional 50 kids from Central America. This summer the need has doubled, there are 100 immigrant teenagers being cared for at one time. Again, they can use our help!

The boys and girls are between the ages of 13 & 17 who have made the long treacherous journey without a parent. Their shoes are worn out and are in need of a new pair of gym shoes, and a new 20" duffle bag (not a backpack) for their final journey to their sponsor's home.

These items can be dropped off at the OLPH Sharing Room. Kindly mark the new shoes or new duffle bag (airline carry-on size) for the Immigrant Kids. 
