Dear Parishioners,

"the Kingdom of heaven can be likened to"

The gospels during these summer weeks are focused on Jesus' parables. This was a teaching method popular with preachers at the time. The Hebrew scriptures were full of parables that in the Jewish tradition were called, "mashalim", simple stories to illustrate a deeper truth.

Jesus was a master at taking simple, ordinary examples and leading his listeners to an often surprising and profound conclusion.

Today we are treated to several of his parables that assure us that God is at work in the world. Amid the difficulties and challenges we face, the God of Life is calling us to mercy, generosity, and a sense of the sacred.

The Lord calls us to name the evil that can so easily seize us and lean into the light of hope and compassion. Considering the current pandemic, we can all be on edge, quick to criticize. Impatience can get the best of us because our routines and expectations have been so disrupted. We can easily be convinced that our take on things is the only way.

Let us let the power of the parables form us! As the Lord instructs in this weekend's gospel, "the righteous will shine like the sun".

I am pleased to announce the appointment of our new Director of Religious Education. Margaret Waldron comes to us from St. Athanasius Parish in Evanston where she has served for many years as the DRE. She brings a wealth of experience. She has an MBA and a Masters in Pastoral Studies from Loyola University. She completed the Certification in Lay Ecclesial Ministry from the University of St. Mary of the Lake. Margaret is a hands-on leader with extensive experience in religious education, faith formation and catechist formation. She is well versed in e-learning and family centered faith formation. Welcome Margaret! She will begin on July 27th.

We continue to hold in our prayers the repose of the soul of **Cherie DiCesare** who led our program for many years. I want to thank Randy McGraw who served as our Interim Director. I will be forever grateful to our Religious Education Board that held the program together during these months of transition. Thank you to our catechists and parents who went above and beyond to support the faith formation of our children.

I want to assure Religious Education parents of First Communicants and Confirmation candidates that we will soon be celebrating these sacraments in the coming weeks. Someone asked me when would confirmation be? Because of social distancing and occupancy limits we will be celebrating 18 separate liturgies in the Church to accommodate all our First Communicants and Confirmandi.

Our reopening process continues to move forward. We have expanded the occupancy for liturgies from 50 to 82. The drive-in Masses have been great. We had over 300 participate last Saturday. We had adoration this past Friday and hope to include Benediction next Friday. We are hoping to add a Sunday mass in the Playdium that could accommodate well over 100 people. We are slowly getting there. Thank you for your patience and support. As you can imagine, the process is more complicated than it might seem. I will not compromise in doing the very best to keep us all safe. We keep learning how to do this more effectively after each liturgy.

Thank you for all your efforts to continue to financially support us at this time when the regular ways of contributing have been disrupted. We are experiencing a decline in our weekly giving and all fundraising came to a standstill since mid-March. There is an article in the bulletin on the PPP program that allowed us to keep our 130 employees without having to furlough or lay off anyone. This program has stabilized our ability to pay our salaries amid declines in our income as a result of the pandemic. We will do everything possible to support our mission during these unprecedented times.

Parish Reopening News

a lot happening!

In coordination with the Archdiocese, we are continuing to seek out ways that will allow our parishioners to celebrate their faith here on the campus of OLPH. It has taken a lot of creativity and teamwork among staff and volunteers to make this happen. We thank the efforts of all involved for their dedication to our parish.

Here are the most recent developments:

Adoration begins this Friday, July 17

Adoration begins Friday from 3:00pm - 6:00pm in the church. Please enter from the Church St. doors.

We hope to expand the hours for Adoration next Friday. Please see the daily eblasts and next week's Bulletin for updates.

Saturday 5:00 pm Drive-in Mass will continue

Our Drive-In Masses have been extremely popular and so they will continue through August and possibly into the autumn. Please note that logistically it has not been possible for us to livestream the Drive-In Mass. The only way to experience it is to attend in person.

We can accept up to 160 car reservations. We are counting cars not the number of people attending. Unless you are bringing more than one car, please do not change the number in the Quantity field for the Saturday Masses.

You must remain in your car and you will be able to hear the mass on your car radio. The Mass will be celebrated on the porch of the Ministry Center, rain or shine. You will be able to receive communion.

9:30 am Sunday Mass in the Playdium begins July 26

Starting Sunday, July 26, there will be three Sunday morning Masses:

- 9:30 am in the Church; max attendance: 82
- 9:30 am in the Playdium; max attendance: 140
- 11:30 am in the Church; max attendance: 82

Please note that we will be able to accommodate 140 people in the Playdium. Chairs will be set up six feet apart for proper social distancing. However, families will be allowed to sit together.

Sign-Up Genius

The Sign Up Genius link for all Masses is being sent out in our Daily Eblasts. For those who do not have access to a computer, contact the parish office, at 847-729-1525, for assistance.

R.E. First Communion and Confirmation

We appreciate how difficult it has been for R.E. children and families who have not been able to celebrate the sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation. The reopening process has been complicated and up until now, we have been unable to put a schedule in place. We can now begin the planning process.

With about 90 children in both programs this is a daunting task given the severe seating restrictions in the Church. We can only have 82 people, which translates to eight candidates plus nine guests.

This means 18 separate celebrations!

Dates/times will be announced soon. All celebrations will take place in August and September. Families will sign up for their preferred date. Fr. Boland will have to preside at all of the Confirmations since only the pastors have been delegated to confirm.

Please watch the Bulletin and the daily eblast for sign up information. It will be available very soon.

Volunteers Needed!

We have formed a Greeter/Usher Committee to help with Reopening Our Church.

The Greeter/Usher welcomes the parishioners and guests into the Church, makes sure that they are wearing a face mask, squirts sanitizer into their hands, and leads them to a spot in the church marked with a sign, "Please Sit Here." These signs are socially distanced six feet apart.

We are in need of some helpers for Mon-Fri 8:30 am Mass, Sat. 5:00 pm Drive-in Mass; and Sun. Masses at 9:30 am and 11:30am,

We also need Greeters/Ushers for Funerals (Mon -Sat, usually at 10:00 am); Weddings (Sat at 1:00 pm or 3:00 pm), Baptisms (Sun at 2:00 pm or 3:30 pm) and Reconciliation (Sat 4 pm)

There has been interest among parishioners about the government's **Paycheck Protection Program** as it relates to the Archdiocese of Chicago and specifically to OLPH. Please check out the Q & A below for answers to some commonly asked questions.

Why is our parish receiving CARES Act loans through the Paycheck Protection Program?

Our parish has experienced a significant decrease in operating income resulting from the absence of regular offertory contributions due to the suspension of weekend Masses and public liturgies. Additionally, our parish has experienced financial losses from the absence of an Easter collection, which provides an important part of our overall annual offertory. Our parish has also had to cancel a number of fundraising events which contribute monetary support to our budget each year. In fact, the pandemic hit the week before the night of our annual St. Patrick's Day party, which then had to be cancelled, and of course every event since then has been cancelled. As we move closer to Fall, so many of our favorite parish celebrations are typically scheduled and our ability to hold these future fundraising events is also in doubt.

The uncertainty related to the economic situation of our parish made the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan necessary for the ongoing operations of our parish. In accordance with the provisions of the CARES Act, our parish had to use the PPP funds to pay for payroll and utility expenses only.

With public Masses suspended, what has been the financial impact on our parish?

Sunday offertory is \$7000 below the weekly average since March 15. Because our parish already operates on thin margins, any reduction in offertory is significant and negatively impacts our ability to meet payroll. Please note that our parish employs about 120 people, including parish staff, teachers, and maintenance staff.

What services is our parish providing during this time?

Our parish employees are providing a significant number of services and resources during this time, including but not limited to:

- Providing livestreamed Masses and liturgies;
- Celebrating outdoor "Drive-In" Saturday Masses;
- Eblasting updated information on a daily basis to subscribers of our newsletter, as well posting updates on Facebook and other social media;
- Facilitating virtual prayer groups and faith formation opportunities online;
- Conducting outreach to parish families and senior citizens, such as hosting/collecting food drives, providing emotional and spiritual support, ensuring that the most vulnerable have access to vital resources; and
- Educating more than 850 students in our school and 600 students in our religious education program.

Why is our Catholic school receiving CARES Act loans through the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)?

Most Catholic schools in our system receive subsidies from their parishes to satisfy operational expenses such as payroll because their costs per-student exceed the price of tuition. The decrease in parish offertory contributions resulting from the suspension of public Masses, together with a drop in tuition payments and cancellation of fundraising initiatives as a result of COVID-19, has had a negative impact on our schools' finances.

Til the end of the school year in June, our Catholic school staff and educators continued to work each school day to provide quality online instruction to our students and the PPP loan was necessary to support the payroll needs of our school staff and educators.

Do faith-based organizations such as the parishes and schools of the Archdiocese of Chicago qualify for a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan?

Yes. The CARES Act contained specific provisions which made our parishes and schools eligible for PPP loans. Each parish and school maintains its own budget for staff payroll and operating expenses. Given the current economic uncertainty and long-term negative financial impact of COVID-19, the PPP loan request was necessary to support ongoing operations of our parishes and schools.

Are we using any parish savings?

Yes, parishes have had no choice but to access available savings to address operating expenses. In addition, the Paycheck Protection Program loan was sought because of current economic uncertainty about our ability to satisfy payroll and other operating expenses, as well as the uncertainty surrounding the long-term negative financial impact resulting from decreased offertory and the cancellation of fundraising events.

How much money did our parish receive through the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan?

Based on the rules of the CARES Act, all PPP loan applications are based on a 2.5 month multiple of our average payroll expenses for the previous 12 months, which for our parish equates to \$1.4 million. This money was to be used for payroll and utility expenses only.

NEW for Sunday Mass: Virtual Worship Aides!


We are now providing parishioners with virtual worship aides.

Technology Update

Transitioning from pre-recorded to livestreamed Mass

Over the last couple of weeks, under the Reopening plan that we have received from the Archdiocese, we begun to celebrate Mass in our church with a limited number of parishioners in attendance. With this change, we have transitioned from pre-recorded Masses to livestreamed Masses. This transition has resulted in changes in the way we present the Mass online and that has lead to some issues for parishioners in their ability to find the Masses.

Prior to the limited Reopening in June, we pre-recorded the online Masses. They could be viewed from the "Featured Mass" playlist on our YouTube Channel at any time after 6:30 am. The following day the Mass (and the Homily) would be transferred to the "Archived Mass" and "Archived Homily" playlists respectively.

Now that we are livestreaming Mass, the way to view Mass is a little bit different. We livestream one Mass per day. The livestream starts about 15 minutes before Mass time. The 8:30 am weekday Masses normally go live around 8:15 am. The Sunday 9:30 Mass goes live around 9:15. The link to the livestream is sent out in every eblast and it is on the homepage of our website. After the Mass has ended and as soon as we are able, we make the Mass available on the "Featured Mass" playlist. Then, as before, it is available for viewing the next day and thereafter from the "Archived Masses" playlist.

Each Saturday at 5:00 pm throughout the rest of the summer, we will celebrate a "drive-in" Mass. Parishioners who register via Sign-Up Genius can attend Mass in their car and listen to the service on their car radio. Communion will be delivered to each car by our priest and deacons as they walk throughout the parking lot. The radio audio broadcast is available to those cars in attendance.

We appreciate your understanding, patience, and support, as we are striving for continuous improvement in the ways we utilize technology to bring the Mass to you. Our goal is to maintain and, in fact, grow our spiritual community even during these times of pandemic.

Fall Religious Education Registration is now open!



Religious Education Registration for the fall of 2020 is here!

With the Covid pandemic, our first priority at OLPH is the health and safety of everyone. OLPH Religious Education will follow public health, government and Archdiocesan recommendations and protocols.

Three new class days

In order to limit the number of students in each class and on the campus at the same time, we offer three additional class days this year. When we know numbers and what families prefer, we will assign classes. (If we do not have enough students for a particular day or time, a second choice may be necessary.) The new Sunday class, between Masses is only 50 minutes long. Those attending Sunday morning classes will meet 30 times instead of 24 and attend a special event each semester.

Appeal for Catechists

With smaller classes and three new days of class, we are in great need for Catechists. Times are Mon., Tue., Wed., 4:30-6:00 pm; Tue. 6:30-8:00 pm; Sat. 9:00-10:30 am; Sun. 8:40-9:30 am; and one Friday evening and Sunday per month for the Gather and Grow program. All grade levels needed. Have your own class or be a team teacher. Young and old welcome to volunteer.

Additional Options for traditional in classroom sessions

Options other than the traditional classroom 24 session classes are Gather and Grow (a family program involving parents and children), e-learning, and Home Schooling. Gather and Grow has its own curriculum. With e-learning and Home Schooling, the curriculum would be the same as the traditional classroom program. Children signed up for e-learning and Home Schooling would be expected to join other students for two activities per semester.

Seventh and Eighth graders are not eligible for e-learning or Home School options as they are preparing for Confirmation and part of the dynamic is sharing the process with their classmates.

Fees remain the same this year

Fees for Religious Education are the same as last year. A limited number of scholarships are available. Ability to pay should NEVER keep you from enrolling your family in any of the programs. Please contact the Rel. Ed. Office to discuss scholarships, payment plans and financial issues.

Registration for our online fall Scripture Study, From Genesis to Jesus, begins July 28.


GENESIS to JESUS






