Dear Parishioners.

"The seed is the Word of God."

This weekend we recall the parable of the "the Sower of the Seed". This beautiful parable reminds us that Our Lord is the Sower, who generously spreads the seed, everywhere, even in the most inhospitable places in hopes that despite the chances, the seed may take root.

If we look into our hearts, there

are places within us that yearn for the seed of faith. In the life of the parish, our many ministries attempt to plant the seed of faith in the hearts of our children, to cultivate the seed of faith in our adults, to nurture the seed of faith for those who grieve or suffer in any way.

We have all been recipients of the seed and we spend a lifetime learning how to cultivate this gift. There are many forces that can diminish the power of the seed of faith. We can become distracted, we can lose interest, or we can ignore the seed of faith that is seeking to shape and form us as a disciple.

Despite the limitations of the pandemic, the parish is deeply committed to the spreading and the fostering of the seed of faith. In the early weeks of this new program year, there are many opportunities to avail yourself to the deepening of your spiritual life. Regular participation in the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation are central. Finding space everyday to encounter the Lord in a prayer of gratitude makes a big difference. Deepening my knowledge of faith and my Catholic tradition is important. Acts of kindness and charity moves us from hearers of the Word to doers of the Word. Calling myself to accountability when I gossip, speak ill of others or am selfish.

Today we observe Catechist Sunday. Today we acknowledge that all of us are in some way a catechist. We hand on the faith by our actions and words. We call others to Christ by the way we live.

There are among us, men and women who are commissioned to be catechists of our young people in our Religious Education (RE) program. I am very grateful to all those who have come forward to participate in this critical ministry. We begin the year with close to five hundred students. Given the pandemic and the number of new families that have recently moved into Glenview, please encourage parents of grammar school age children to look into our RE Program. Margaret Waldron and her staff have put together a great year of growing the "seed of faith" in the lives of our Religious Education families.

If you would like to explore your faith, get away from it all, focus on our spirituality, I cannot recommend highly enough the many programs offered at the Bellarmine Retreat House in Barrington, IL. It is just 40 minutes away and is an oasis. It has gone



through a major renovation and has so much to offer, Check out their website: https://jesuitretreat.org.

Erin Maiorca is the Executive Director and an OLPH parishioner. It is a blessed place. (See page 15 of this Bulletin for current retreat information)

Our parishioner Clare Sullivan is the Director of Scholarships for the Archdiocese of Chicago. She coordinates the Tax Credit Scholarship program that allows a taxpayer to donate money to a nonprofit scholarship granting organization



and then take a 75% tax credit on their state income taxes. A \$1000 donation results in a \$750 tax credit. Last year 2,970 students attending Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Chicago received an average scholarship of \$5,965. One of the moments of pride for us at OLPH was at the recent Olympics in Tokyo. OLPH Grad Dr. Monica Rho served as the physician for




the USA Women's National Soccer Team. Way to go Monica! You make us so proud!


Book Club is Back! 7:00 pm, Mon, Oct. 4

Hi, my name is Moira Hathcock. I have been teaching 1st grade Religious Education for the past 12 years. I love teaching the kids during their early years of learning about our religion. They are so curious and full of wonder! We all learn something new each year. The best part is I often teach their little brothers and sisters the next year. It is so much fun seeing the families around town (i.e. the dairy bar). I am thrilled when I get a wave at Mass during the Sign of Peace. Teaching Religious Education has truly been a blessing in my life.

Gerri King – Catechist for 2nd Grade: I am one of ten children (Irish Catholic) and as an adult I realized that the greatest gift my parents gave me was my Catholic faith. Congratulations to our Class of 2024 (current sixth grade) for winning our Shoot for the "A" Challenge for the 2020-2021 school year!


