Dear Parishioners,

"Whoever is not against us is for us."

It goes without saying that we live in divisive times. We quickly size people up and are quick to make a judgement, "are they with us or against us?" How a person feels about refugees, COVID, racism, poverty, to name just a few issues, can define them in this politicized world we live in.

People can have great difficulty distinguishing moral perspectives from political perspectives. The Gospels were not based on conservative versus liberal positions or Republican versus Democratic viewpoints.

When I was a young priest people were quite divided over Pope John Paul II's moral judgements against nuclear weapons and the death penalty. Whenever a death sentence was commuted somewhere in the world, he would have the Colosseum in Rome illuminated to acknowledge that a life had been spared in this place notorious for the numbers of people who were tortured and killed there.

Jesus went about a ministry of inclusion, reaching out especially to those who lived on the margins. He saw all his followers as witnesses to his proclamation of the Kingdom. The Scriptures this weekend invite us to reflect on what really motivates our religious values and choices. How have we been co-opted by political or cultural machinations that find no place in the Good News of Jesus Christ. Who are the "theys" in my life? How do I challenge myself not to constantly put myself in "we versus they" thinking? What about "us" as a community of believers?

One of the great challenges these days is seeking to build bridges of unity in a culture that is deeply divided and judgmental. In preaching and ministering, how can I as a pastor transcend the landmines of division? How can we strive to live in a world in which there is a diversity of opinions but to live with the unity that Christ calls us to be? We see the disciples struggling with this in the Gospel.

This weekend is the Annual Seminary Appeal which we support through our First Fruits program. One of the challenges in seminary formation is fostering in our future priests the conviction that as shepherds they must be open to all and to resist the temptation to pastor to the self-righteous and condemn the "heretics". We call all God's people to the table of unity, the Eucharist. Pope Francis has continually called priests and bishops to be pastors, not agents, of political agendas. This is hard!

The world these future priests will be entering yearns for faithful and committed priests. We greet priests who are alwall able to Fr. Jerry Boland

all God's people even when our instinct is to judge or ignore. While a parish like OLPH has a demographic profile that would suggest certain traits of commonality, we are not unlike the national profile of significantly different political and cultural positions that can tear at the fabric of community.

We are blessed with two parishioners that are in formation in our seminaries. Deacon Michael Klatt is in fourth year at Mundelein Seminary and is serving at St. John Brebeuf parish in Niles. He brings a wealth of experience to his ministry having lived and served in Honduras. He is the son of Lorraine Klatt. He will be ordained in June,

Luke Lato is a senior at St. John Vianney College Seminary in Minnesota. He is a compassionate and spiritual young man. He is very respected by his classmates. He is the son of Mark and Vivi Lato.

We are blessed to have 2 Teaching Parish seminarians from Mundelein Seminary. Deacon Jesse Heitt has been with us for three years and now enters his 4th Year. He will be ordained for the Diocese of Springfield Cape Gerardo, in Missouri. Andre Klaes is entering his first year and is a student for the Diocese of Grand Rapids.

I am grateful for the role our Teaching Parish Committee has in this critical outreach of our parish. OLPH has played such an important role in the formation of seminarians and newly ordained priests for many years. Our committee is headed by Tim and Karen Daniels. Members are Ralph and Candy Borkowicz, Tom and Jackie O'Brien, Bill and Michelle McGowan, Lee and Marti Vandervest, Paula and Jim Cantwell and Sally Corbett. Thank you for your commitment to our future priests!

Please check out our Open House for Youth Ministry this weekend. Fr. Patrick, Zoe Sundstrom and our leadership team are awesome and have great plans for the coming year.

Many people are struggling with the issue of mandated vaccinations. Failure to be vaccinated can result in termination of employment. I know this is very personal for people. Several parishioners have met with me to explore a religious exemption. Please review the letter in the Bulletin this weekend by Cardinal Cupich as to why this exemption is not possible from a Catholic doctrinal perspective. The Cardinal points out that Catholics can in good conscience receive the COVID-19 and flu vaccines. Pope Francis has taught that receiving the COVID-19 vaccine is an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

The recent escalation of COVID-19 cases in Illinois is a source of frustration for us all, particularly if we know someone who has been stricken by this virus or has even died from it. Even more disturbing is that with the change of seasons we now are entering a new flu season, which is leading some health officials to warn of a "twindemic."

It is out of a concern for you and your families that I write to encourage everyone to get the COVID-19 and flu vaccines. While one vaccine does not protect both viruses, neither do the vaccines interfere with each other. It is safe to receive both vaccines and in some cases your health care provider or local pharmacy can provide both in

The Catholic Church has been a consistent voice in defense of human life and that must continue in this moment. Everyone at the Archdiocese of Chicago, from pastors to administrators, teachers, principals and custodial staff, has been working hard during the pandemic to ensure that our churches and schools operate safely. We must go that extra step now. Ideally, everyone should be vaccinated for the flu by the end of October.

According to the public health officials, additional considerations for groups of people include:

- · Children should be vaccinated as soon as possible. Some children need two doses of flu vaccine. For those children it is recommended to get the first dose as soon as vaccine is available, because the second dose needs to be given at least four weeks after the first.
- Women who are in the third trimester of pregnancy can be vaccinated for the flu, since doing so will help protect their infants during the first months of life when they are too young to be vaccinated.

Common flu symptoms such as fever, cough, sore throat and extreme fatigue are similar to COVID-19 symptoms. Our health care providers are already overwhelmed by patients infected with the coronavirus, or people mistaking one infection for the other.

Influenza can be, in itself, a deadly illness. More than 200,000 Americans are hospitalized each year with the flu and, while most people recover completely in one to two weeks, some develop potentially life-threatening complications such as pneumonia.

Over the past decade, influenza and pneumonia have been linked to an annual average of 3,500 deaths in Illinois, alone.

Nobody likes getting shots, especially children. But the flu shot is easy to find, inexpensive and recommended for just about everyone, even children over the age of six months. Most insurance plans and public health clinics or pharmacies provide a flu vaccine. I encourage you to contact your health care provider to determine which flu vaccine is right for you.

This week I will roll up my sleeve for the flu vaccination and I encourage you to do the same in order to protect yourselves, your families and your neighbors. It is a small but heroic thing to do. You may just save a life. At the least, you will help make this flu season less deadly for our community.

My prayers are with all of you, and I ask that you pray for me.
