Dear Parishioners,

"Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house"

The above quote is the theme of my 40th Anniversary celebration this weekend. This anniversary invites me to reflect on the many "living stones" that have helped to build my spiritual house and has led me to this milestone in my priestly journey. Many living stones have shaped me throughout my life. Today I

praise God for all those living stones.

I first call to mind my parents, **Michael and Eileen** who would have celebrated their 67th wedding anniversary this weekend. My earliest memories are their love for me and my brothers. They were firmly rooted in faith and much of our life centered on our parish St. Gall on the South Side.

I was blessed with 4 brothers and 3 awesome sisters-inlaw. To Msgr. Mike, Rich and Barb, Tim and Patty, and Joe and Judy you have been my rock! To my nieces and nephews, Maggie, Megan, Sue, Annie, Joey and Jack, I love you beyond words and am so proud of you.

This week I went on a trip down memory lane and was overwhelmed by the legion of living stones that I have built my life on.

I began the day at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception at Mundelein where I was ordained a priest on May 13, 1981. The chapel is a sacred place where I found tremendous encouragement in my years of study. I was blest with an outstanding faculty and an awesome group of seminarians discerning the call to priesthood. I began visiting the parishes that have formed over the years, not in chronological order but geographic.

I visited Holy Cross in Deerfield where I served for seven years, what a great parish where I always felt welcomed and was so open to me. I journeyed to St. James in Arlington Heights, my first assignment. It was a Vatican II parish that emboldened me on the power of what a parish can be. I lived with great priests and the energy of the parish was so compelling.

I then made my way to Mary, Seat of Wisdom in Park Ridge. I was deeply impacted there by a parish with a rich history and a passionate community. I made friends for life there.

Next I visited the Chapel of St. James at the Quigley Center. One of Chicago's great treasures. I was in Diocesan Administration for 25 years and worked closely with Cardinal Bernardin and Cardinal George. I work in priest personnel and saw firsthand the extraordinary priests that have served this Archdiocese.

I then made it to my beloved Holy Family on Roosevelt Road where I served for 12 years. What a parish! I learned so much. I also remember Holy Family in a special way this weekend as we recall the 150th Anniversary of the Great Chicago Fire. Holy Family was only 1 of 5 public buildings to survive the fire. The "miracle on Roosevelt Road"! Next I visited the parish of St. Michael's in Orland Park where I served as a deacon. I just loved that parish.

I ended up at the glorious parish of Our Lady of Perpetual Help where I have been so very blessed to serve as pastor. **Cardinal Gregory** always refers to OLPH as the crown jewel of parishes. I couldn't agree more!

As you can see, I am profoundly blest! I wouldn't change a thing about where I have served. I left every parish kicking and screaming with the fear I will never be this happy again only to be so graciously received at my new assignment. Deo Gratias.

Much is going on here these days. Scripture Study is in full swing! Fr. Barrett's Book Club is launched. I learned that Fr. Patrick and Fr. Larry are "dog whisperers" after all the pet blessings last week. The OLPHun Run was a terrific success. Special thanks to Maggie Wycklendt and her fantastic committee. Knit for Life knit several blankets to be used by patients at the Journey Care Hospice Center. It is homecoming weekend at OLPH School, Go Warriors!

I am delighted to announce that on October 22, we will be hosting Solemn Vespers for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. We celebrate the 5th anniversary of the publication of **Pope Francis'** historic encyclical, "Laudato Si". 





Did you know about:

SAINT MARY OF THE LAKE (PART 2)

The chapel at the University of Saint Mary of the Lake is dedicated to the Immaculate Conception. For the exterior, the architect Joseph W. McCarthy, modeled the chapel on the First Congregational Church of Litchfield, Connecticut.

For the interior, McCarthy and Cardinal Mundelein created a beautiful fusion of the Catholic worship tradition and the American style of architecture. Cardinal Mundelein was a great collector of fine European art. Accordingly, the image behind the altar is of the Holy Family, painted by the Spanish master Francisco de Zubaran (1598-1664).



Within the main body of the

chapel, McCarthy incorporated a crystal chandelier styled after the chandelier in the East Room of the White House. But he also included the Latin names of the Blessed Mother from her litany. The result is a striking example of truly American-Catholic architecture – one that the parishioners of Our Lady of Perpetual Help can appreciate as being exemplified in our own church.

Under the high altar in the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, down a few steps, is the tomb of George Cardinal Mundelein. He was so dedicated to his seminarians and the importance of providing his flock in Chicago with good priests, that he wanted his body to be placed for all eternity beneath the sanctuary where those very priests would be ordained. One other Cardinal is buried at the seminary: Albert Gregory Meyer. He was a noted scholar who, after studying in Rome, taught Greek, Latin, Scripture, Theology, and Archeology at St. Francis Seminary where he was also the rector. When he was diagnosed with a brain tumor, Cardinal Meyer requested burial in the seminarians' cemetery at Saint Mary of the Lake. His grave is marked with a statue of the Angel Gabriel holding his horn; the inscription on Cardinal Meyer's memorial stone calls on seminarians to prepare themselves in seriousness and devotion.

This indicates the importance that Mundelein Seminary and the University of Saint Mary of the Lake have had for the Archdiocese of Chicago, as well as for dioceses across the country, whose priests have studied there. In 1929, Cardinal Mundelein received permission from the Vatican to grant Pontifical Degrees, the first institution in America to be given the honor of having a Pontifical Faculty of Theology. Today, the University of Saint Mary of the Lake is home to various academic institutes. It is where those pursuing ordination as (cont. on pg. 10

Reflections

All four of our priests here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help studied at Mundelein Seminary. It has often been called 'The Enchanted Forest' because of its beautiful natural surroundings. At the same time, 'Mundelein' is synonymous with the profound priestly formation that each man receives and the fraternal friendships he builds.


Here are a couple of reflections from Fr. Jim and Fr. Jerry about their favorites memories of their time at Mundelein.

Fr. Jim Barrett: "I have many fond memories of Mundelein. I never wanted to see it from the rearview mirror. At Mundelein I met many fine seminarians who have become excellent priests, and I met other seminarians who left Mundelein and are making a great contribution to the Church. Too, I had an excellent education from some of the finest priests who were committed to forming us as (small "P") pastors. They were compassionate in their formation of priests who will serve God's people. Also I had a lot of fun and good laughs. I enjoyed walks around the lake and canoe trips on Lake St. Mary Lake All in all, I had a wonderful experience in my four years at the seminary."

Fr. Jerry Boland: "My favorite year at Mundelein was my third year, which would have been 1979. That was the year Pope John Paul II visited Chicago. The seminarians at Mundelein were to play a major role in most of the major events surrounding the papal visit. We just could not believe that the Pope was coming to Chicago. He had visited Mundelein some years previously when he was the Archbishop of Krakow. For those of you who were around at that time, Pope John Paul had taken the world by storm with his youthfulness and energy.

Mundelein was recognized as a Pontifical University with the authority to grant the Papal decrees of the Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology, the Licentiate in Sacred Theology, and of course a Doctorate in Sacred Theology. Achieving this recognition was a singular accomplishment of Cardinal Mundelein. Both the Cardinal's Residence in Chicago and his residence at Mundelein had papal throne rooms in case the Pope dropped by!

Cardinal Mundelein designed Mundelein to have a colonial feel because he wanted the seminarians to be aware of our American heritage. He also wanted many features to remind us of our lineage to Rome. Outside of the Main Chapel is a column in honor of the Immaculate Conception (see image on page 10), which is a duplicate of the original which is in the Piazza di Spagna in Rome. In the ceilings are engravings of the Barberini Bees take from the Coat of Arms of the Barberini Popes. Cardinal Mundelein studied in the Barberini Palace in Rome. We were all so moved by that experience! The following Spring I was ordained a deacon. What a year!"

permanent deacons study. It offers a Doctorate in Ministry for laypeople and priests seeking to advance their studies in spiritual care. It hosts a liturgical institute in conjunction with serving as a center for significant academic conferences and international gatherings. When Pope Francis requested all the bishops of the United States to gather in a special retreat, America's pastoral leaders came together at Saint Mary of the Lake, praying and hearing reflections in the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception.

In that same sacred space, Fr. Myles McDonnell was ordained early, in order to make him and his classmates available for service as chaplains in the Second World War. Fr. John Flavin studied at Saint Mary of the Lake-Mundelein Seminary, though he was ordained in Rome. Fr. Tom Hickey served as the Dean of Formation at Mundelein Seminary for ten years, leading the spiritual and pastoral education of future priests. Fr. Jim Barrett has great memories of Mundelein, which he took with him as pastor of several different parishes. Fr. Barrett was ordained in 1982.

But one year earlier, on May 13, 1981, the very day that Pope John Paul II was nearly assassinated in St. Peter's Square, Jeremiah Michael John Boland prostrated himself in the sanctuary of the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, over the tomb of George Cardinal Mundelein, and in the presence of Cardinal Mundelein's successor, John Cardinal Cody. Though Saint John Paul II survived and lived for many more years, Fr. Boland's class would be the last that Cardinal Cody ordained; he died a few months later.

The Master of Ceremonies assisting Cardinal Cody at Fr. Boland's ordination was a young priest who had served for three years as associate pastor at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, before he was named a professor of liturgy at Mundelein. He would go on to be created a Cardinal himself -Wilton Gregory.

It is customary for priests to join together at ordinations and lay their hands in blessing on the seminarians about to be ordained. It is also customary for the newly ordained priests to bless those same priests after the ceremony, as part of their 'first blessings.' On that day in May of 1981, in attendance at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, was Fr. Myles McDonnell, pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. He was present to lay hands on a parishioner who was being ordained.

Thus, on a day of great tragedy, that was turned into a celebration of hope; and in a bishop's final act of providing pastors for his people, Fr. Jerry Boland was ordained a priest of Jesus Christ in the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception at the University of Saint Mary of the Lake. Though he did not know it at the time, he was blessed by, and gave a blessing to a future Cardinal of the Church, and the much-loved pastor whom he would eventually succeed at Our Lady of Perpetual Help.
