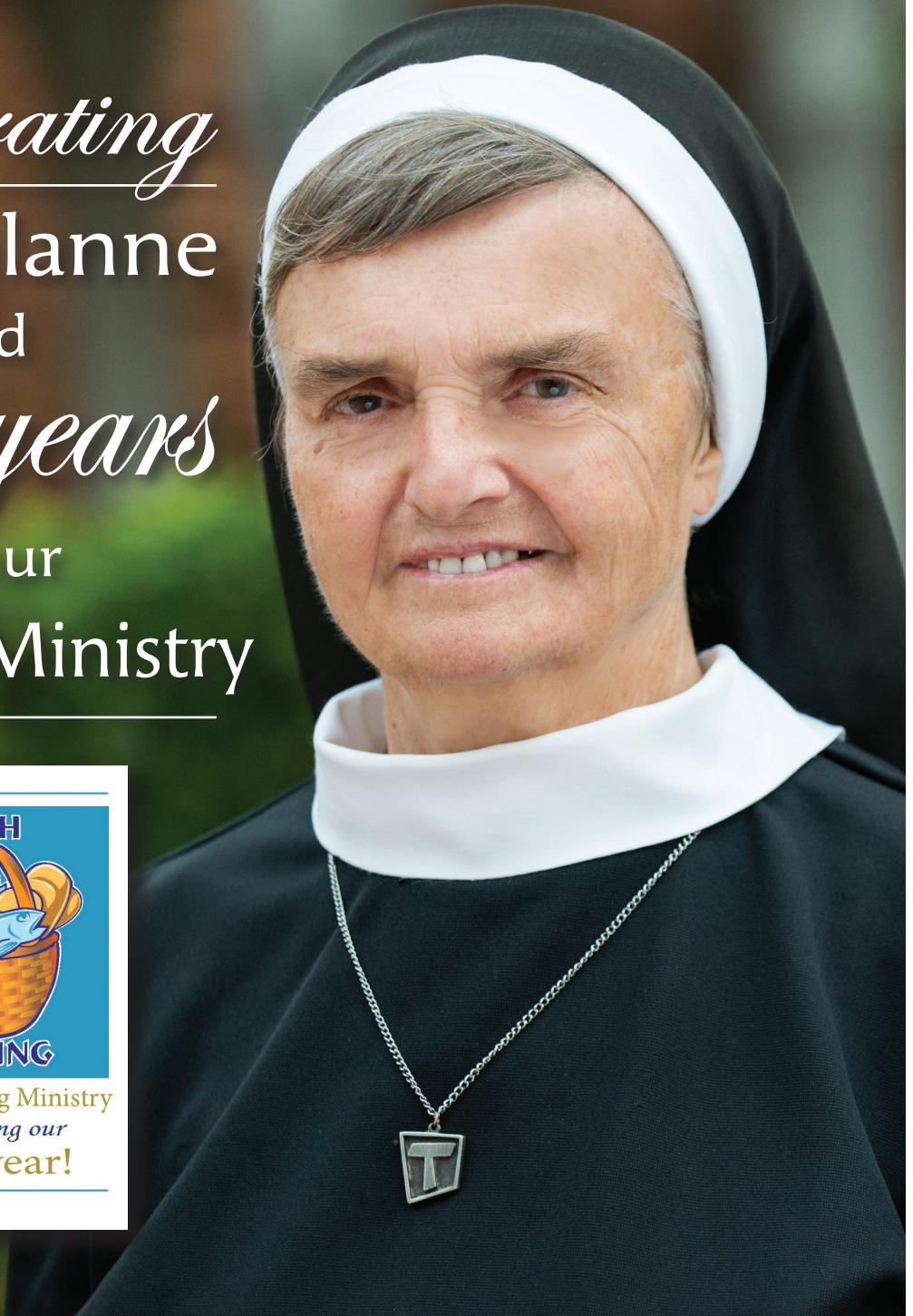

Dear Parishioners,

"The Lord stood by me and gave me strength"

This passage taken from this week's second reading speaks to me of the power of standing with one another. Just as the Lord stands by us, he invites us to do the same for one another. We are a better parish when we stand with one another.

We not only stand with another as a parish community, but we also reach out to others beyond our boundaries. The Church calls us to look beyond and see ourselves as part of a much larger reality.

One of the most tangible signs of this willingness to stand with others is our Sharing Ministry. For the next several weeks we will be celebrating the 40th anniversary of our Sharing Ministry. It has been an extraordinary effort of our parish that has had a blessed impact on how we see ourselves and how we define our mission as a parish.

It all started with the appointment of **Fr. Myles McDonnell** as pastor. Fr. McDonnell had spent much of his priesthood in economically disadvantaged communities, most recently at that time at Old Saint James in the city. He wanted to build a bridge between OLPH and St. James. Could we share the bounty of our blessings with those who had to deal with hunger and poverty?

Sr. Paulanne Held was deeply moved by this concept and helped Fr. McDonnell implement his dream. She invited parishioner **Rich Tilghman** to head a committee to organize this project. Not only was this a remarkable project here at OLPH, but it became a prototype of connecting parishes in need with parishes that were in a stronger financial situation.

This remarkable beginning 40 years ago would eventually introduce me to OLPH as a newly ordained priest. **Cardinal John Cody** was taken by this vision of connecting parishes and building friendships between parishes of different racial, economic, and cultural backgrounds. This could only strengthen the Archdiocese with these kinds of bonds.

Out of the OLPH experience he established a policy that called for every parish to be linked with another parish, especially parishes of means with those that were

challenged. He established the first Sharing Commission to overlook the program and begin establishing a network of sharing parishes and policies to govern the program.

I was a newly ordained priest at St. James in Arlington Heights and a member of the Presbyteral Council. At the time we had a relationship with St. Malachy on the west side of Chicago. I was appointed as member of this newly found commission representing the Presbyteral Council along with Sr. Paulanne and Rich Tilghman. The first home I ever visited in Glenview was the Tilghman's. This would begin a lifelong friendship for me with Sr. Paulanne. I was so amazed by what OLPH was doing with Old St. James. OLPH and St. James became the prototype of what a sharing relationship should look like. What was ingenious about the OLPH - St. James relationship was its encouragement of forging relationships between the two parishes and not just the sending of a check.

It started with a monthly food drive. People would bring brown paper bags full of non-perishable food products that would be brought to the food pantry at Old St. James. It expanded over the years and in addition to find many ways to support the mission of Old St. James, tremendous friendships developed.

Over time three other parishes would become sharing partners with OLPH. It would not be possible to determine the amount of financial assistance, families fed, and mutual celebrations experienced over the past 40 years. The Sharing Program has been a transformative influence on the life of OLPH.

From its humble beginnings of being housed in a broken-down red building to a state-of-the-art Sharing Resource Center, from brown paper bags to a system that organizes and delivers hundreds and hundreds of food products, clothes, and housewares each week, our Sharing Ministry is a blessing. Today, **Betty Collins**, **Bill Lynch** and **Lenore Pettinger** and a remarkable committee keep the Sharing Program thriving. In addition to the collection and distribution of much needed food and materials the parish contributes thousands of dollars each year to our four sharing parishes. We have sharing relationships with; St. James, St. Sabina, St. Josephine Bakhita, and Mother of the Americas.

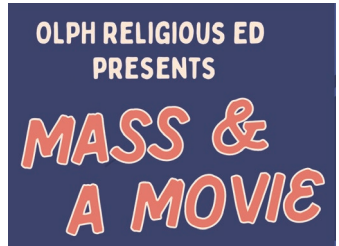

Reflecting on Our Past, Embracing Our Future

Sister Paulanne Reflects on 40 Years of Sharing

This year our parish commemorates the 40th Anniversary of our Sharing Ministry with “Reflecting on Our Past, Embracing Our Future”. For the next six weekends, you will read reflections in the Bulletin from those who have built, have joined, have sustained, and have loved this ministry from its conception until today.

In addition to our bulletin articles, we will also honor the Sharing Ministry at the 5:00pm Mass on Saturday, November 26. **Fr. John Edmunds**, Pastor of St. James; **Fr. Thomas Balanger**, Pastor of Josephine Bakhita; and **Fr. Tom Boharic**, Pastor of Mother of the Americas, will concelebrate the Mass with our **Fr. Jeremiah Boland**. There will be a reception after Mass in McDonnell Hall.

We cannot commemorate 40 years of our Sharing Ministry, without also honoring 40 years of **Sr. Paulanne Held’s** involvement in Sharing. As everyone at OLPH knows, “Sharing” and “Sr. Paulanne” are linked so intrinsically that you cannot think about one without thinking of the other. Recently, I asked Sr. Paulanne to reflect on the past 40 years and also what she envisions for the future.

When asked about the beginnings, Sister said the roots of the Sharing Ministry date back to 1971 when **Fr. Myles McDonnell** arrived at OLPH from St. James Church on Wabash Avenue in Chicago where he had been Pastor. She said Fr. McDonnell would often give homilies about the importance of helping others and supporting parishes who have little to sustain themselves. As a result of these homilies, we as a parish began sending food and clothing to St. James as well as to St. Ludmilla’s Parish.

A few years later, the Archdiocese began matching thriving parishes with parishes in need in order to build relationships between suburban and inner-city parishes. In 1975, our first deacon, **Michael Pfleger**, was ordained and assigned to St. Sabina Parish in the city. It was in the early 1980’s that we also began offering support to St. Sabina and

St. Lawrence’s parishes, and it was Fr. Pfleger who initiated the special envelope for Sharing every month.

Sr. Paulanne attributes Sharing becoming an official ministry to the Renew Program and with **Rich Tilghman** being appointed the first Chair. Rich held this position for many years, and under his leadership, Sharing was able to move forward as a more structured, hands-on organization. Many more parishioners began taking part, bringing with them new knowledge and energy. Even today, Sister acknowledges growth with the addition of more new faces with great ideas. She points out that

parishioners devote hours of their time taking food, clothing, and more to our Sharing Parishes—hands-on help that continues to grow!

Sister’s passion to help those in need comes from her desire to live the message of the Gospel by feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, housing the homeless, and educating

our children. She strongly believes that homelessness and a lack of education should never be tolerated, and that we have a responsibility to change our society, our government, and our communities by using our inner-strength, talent, and vision to build a better world. Sister contends that our communities are better when we have strong family values and respect for one another, when we motivate children in a strong faith-filled and educational environment, and when we create sufficient job opportunities and provide basic necessities for all.

Sister recalls that Fr. McDonnell began the Needy Family Fund in the mid 1980’s in order to help families in our Parish as well as those in our community. He wanted families to have hope even as they dealt with job loss, illness, and death. Again, Sister saw parishioners step up and make an incredible impact in giving to those in need.

Some favorite memories for Sr. Paulanne are of the annual picnics when families from our Sharing parishes would

come to enjoy a summer afternoon in the parking lot and in the gym. Relationships among parishes grew as a result of these picnics as well as the sharing of liturgies, planning fundraisers, and helping individual families during the holidays.

The Sharing Ministry, according to Sister, has had a tremendous impact on the lives of those in our community as well as in the lives of the parishes we serve. She sees a world in great turmoil with people's lives getting harder with challenges due to Covid and with many families not able to afford basic items such as food, clothing, and hygiene products. She firmly believes that it is our responsibility to empower those in need, helping them to move forward.

When asked about the future of Sharing, Sister said that the school and religious education students understand so much about the poor because of the great example they see in their parents. The students bring McDonald's gift cards for the homeless, donate hats and gloves for Sharing Parishes at Christmas, bring items to places in need, and take part in grade-level service projects. She cited a program called "Change, Changes the World," where several times a year students are asked to bring coins for good causes, such as Mother of Perpetual Help in Puerto Rico, Connection of the Homeless in Evanston, and so many other worthwhile programs.

Sister feels that participating in these programs makes children aware of the needs in their community as well as in their world. She feels strongly that we must be the model for our children—the more we can raise their awareness, the more they will care about others. Bringing food to the altar at our weekend Masses is a concrete, hands-on way to teach them that many do not have enough to eat. The more children learn, the more ways they can help, and the more they will change our communities for the better.

With the passion of Sister Paulanne leading the way, it is no surprise that the Sharing Ministry has thrived for 40 years! Her drive and her determination as well as her love for those in need, continue to make this a vital ministry in our parish. Sr. Paulanne and our Sharing Ministry are both Pearls of Great Price for which we are all so grateful.

The Beginning of the Sharing Ministry

In the late 1970's and early 1980's, OLPH was just finishing the Renew Program, which was intended to vitalize the parish faith life. As a result of Renew, there was a step called an "action response," which asked the parish to put their faith into some concrete actions. At the time we had two "twinning parishes" with whom we shared almost exclusively financial resources.

Sr. Paulanne challenged our parish to add two additional parishes and to improve our connections with them beyond mere financial help. This challenge was the beginning of what was called the Sharing Committee for many years. It was my honor and privilege to chair the committee for 30 years.

The committee was initially about 20 people willing to connect with our now four "sharing parishes" on a much more personal level. Interestingly enough, the pastor of one of those four parishes at this time was none other than **Fr Tom Hickey**. There were food and clothing drives, a sharing picnic, choir exchanges, be-friend-a-family, and many other activities which brought OLPH together with the four parishes. Hence, a bond was formed of sharing beyond just financial resources.

It is very gratifying to see the growth of Sharing over the past forty years. I think it has helped brand our parish in the Archdiocese. So many of our wonderful parishioners have contributed their time, talent and treasure to the sharing effort over these many years. They have shown incredible generosity.

Sister Paulanne's challenge forty years ago continues to be answered by our wonderful parish today.

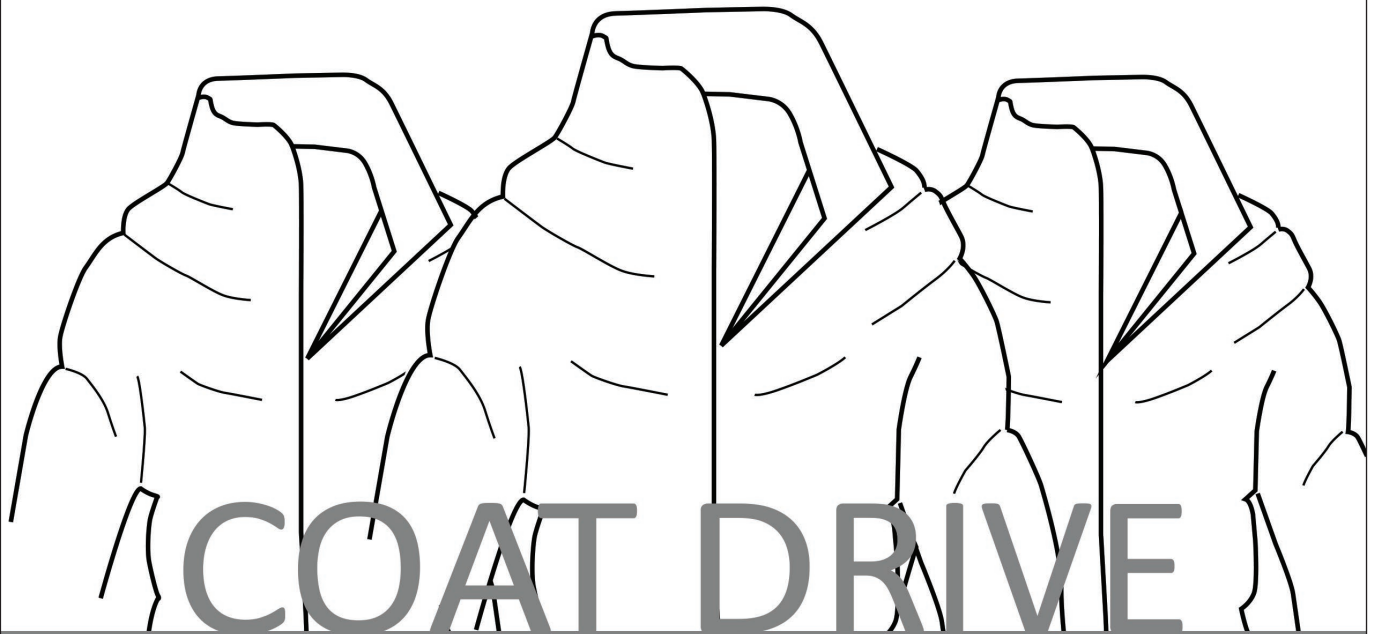

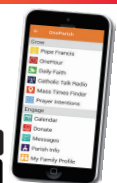
