### seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

"May God make you worthy of his calling."

We are all "works in progress". Everyone of us is in the midst of a spiritual journey that began with our baptism and evolves out of our lived experience. There are during our lives, peaks and valleys, sunrises and sunsets, days of sunshine and days of storms. As we accumulate more experiences, our perspective changes.

Things that seemed so important at one stage in life are not so important in the next stage.

Abraham Lincoln is quoted as saying, "and in the end it is not the years in your life that count, it is the life in your years." In the course of our spiritual journey, we hear the words of St. Paul in this weekend's second reading as quite encouraging. God is at work in our lives, God is forming us if we will let him. God keeps challenging us to let go of resentments, self-righteousness, and selfishness. We need to embrace "God's way" not "my way."

God is calling us, inviting us, challenging us to be worthy of his calling. Can we be open? Can we change? Can we risk the prospect of moving from the known to the unknown?

As we enter November, a month of remembrance and the final weeks of the liturgical year, there is a sense of taking an account of where we are at spiritually. We realize, time is fleeting, material things are ultimately of little value, our character matters. How have we demonstrated our "worthiness" of his calling? How are we building one another up and not tearing one another down?

As the leaves fall from the trees, the days shorten and as winter is on the horizon, may we strive to be worthy of his calling.

On the weekend of November 5 & 6, a special second collection is being taken up to support the growing crises of displaced refugees. Thousands of people are fleeing violence, political repression, and poverty in Central and South America. Over 3,000 asylum seekers have arrived in Chicago from the Southern Border with thousands more anticipated. Catholic Charities is serving as the coordinator of our Archdiocesan efforts. Money collected this weekend will assist in meeting the many needs that are being presented. With your help we can respond to the Gospel mandate to welcome the stranger. The stranger as the Cardinal has said, "is hungering and thirsting-Christ presenting himself to us in their need. Thank you for your consideration.

I am published! One of my projects when I was pastor of Holy Family on Roosevelt Road was to serve on a committee that sought to collaborate between the Catholic Church and clergy-abuse survivors. We embarked on creating a Healing Garden that could be a place of public outreach to help heal wounds caused by priests and others who have been abused as children. The Healing Garden itself does not restore trust or heal but it is a space for people to come together in a collaborative way. A place that brings us together in prayer and mutual support.

This small book commemorates the 10th Anniversary of the Garden. I wrote one of the chapters reflecting on my experience of being part of this remarkable project. I met so many heroic people whose courage and resilience has changed me as I got to know the path they undertook to seek healing after having been so profoundly hurt. Copies of the little book are at the exits if you would like one. They are free. If you are ever in the vicinity of Roosevelt and May in Chicago, the Garden is well worth a visit.

Thank you so much for your generous support of the Catch-Up Appeal. We are closing the gap. So many of you are going above and beyond your generous support of OLPH to help us face the headwinds the Pandemic has had on our collections. I am deeply grateful for the additional sacrifices you are making!

We have some great Halloween Family Friendly events this weekend. Friday, October 28 is one of favorite events of the year, "Trunk or Treat". Fr. Larry has been putting the finishing touches on the Rectory's decorated trunk! Saturday is Mass and a Drive-In Move Night. After the 5:00pm Mass our parking Lot becomes a Drive-In Theater. It is free! Religious Education is offering food trucks and popcorn. The event is open to everyone.

Please check out the wonderful display of items commemorating the 40th anniversary of our Sharing Program in the South Vestibule.

Last week's Poker Night sponsored by the Men's Club was a great success. I lost my shirt! It was a great evening.

This coming week we celebrate the Feast of All Saints and The Feast of All Souls. Check the Bulletin for the Mass schedules. We hold in prayer all those families that are grieving the loss of a loved one this past year.

I wish to acknowledge the extraordinary outreach of our Bereavement Ministry. They so faithfully walk with those having to confront the death of a loved one. They so witness to me the mandate, "may you be faithful to his calling."



## The Sharing Ministry - The Early Years

1982 - 1992

Forty years ago, many OLPH parishioners were involved in RENEW, a scripture study program which encouraged living out the faith. A group had gathered in McDonnell Hall, and participants were challenged with coming up with actionable ways to do just that. One table decided to focus on feeding the hungry. Sr. Paulanne Held

was at that table and appointed **Rich Tilghman** to lead the charge, a position he held for the next thirty years!

The seed of Sharing was planted.

Early efforts consisted of collecting food at Mass, loading donations into station wagons and delivering to two sharing parishes, St. Ludmilla and St. Laurence, which the Archdiocese had assigned to OLPH. Fr. Myles McDonnell was pastor at the time and

was aware of two additional parishes, St. James and St. Sabina's, which were in need of support, so soon after our launch, we were working to ease hunger within four innercity parish communities.

It became obvious that OLPH had a heart for the poor as our collection efforts were met with consistent, strong support. At the time, there was an unused, old building standing where the Lafayette building stands today. It had provided space for two classrooms in earlier school-years but had fallen into disrepair when it was no longer needed. It had no heat, no water, drafty windows, and rickety stairs but still had an appeal when The Sharing Ministry decided it

needed storage and a sorting space for the growing volume of donations. Sharing took over this space, using one room for food and the other for clothing/housewares donations that began showing up; though we never put out the word for need.

Our volunteer base grew in tandem with donations. Soon we had a Monday and a Friday crew working several hours each shift, sorting through all that came in. A team of drivers was organized to deliver food



and clothing to the inner city each week. In time, we needed to line up additional outlets for clothing as our Sharing Parishes could not accommodate all we had coming in.

The first decade of Sharing also found us hosting annual picnics in Glenview, inviting parishioners from our sharing parishes, with hundreds turning out each year. We participated in prayer exchanges, praying for one another's intentions, put on baby showers for needy

moms, fed the homeless at soup kitchens, and created shoeboxes of essentials for the homeless (delivering hundreds each year), provided support to women's and children's shelters, put on turkey drives, toy drives, and launched the Be-Friend-a Family Program. God's hand was evident as our ministry grew beyond what we had ever imagined.

So many dedicated people have been involved in building our outreach into what it is today. Some are still with us and some have passed. We are clearly standing on their shoulders as we move forward with our efforts.

I have had the privilege of being a part of the Sharing Ministry for the better part of 40 years. My life has been deeply enriched by those I've encountered at our sharing parishes and by the people I've worked with on our outreach team.

My prayer for the future is that God continues to inspire next generations to answer the cry of the poor. There's no telling what's in store!

#### Decade One Reflections

#### Reflection from Lou Marohn 40-year member of Sharing Ministry

Forty years ago we collected cans of food and boxes of cereal in the little red shed, helped Sister Paulanne stack newspapers in the 40' trailer, and made and served food at Olive Branch Mission. Since then over a million plus cans of food have been donated, and OL has become known as the sharing parish of the archdiocese. Thank you OLPH parishoners for your support. At OL we "Have fed the hungry, clothed the naked, and given drink to the thirsty." May we always remember to continue the Matthew 25:35 work that Jesus taught us.

#### **Reflection from Mary Anne Nash Sebby**

We joined OLPH in 1987, and Father Sullivan suggested I attend a Sharing meeting and, thus, in 1988 it began for me. I delivered food to Our Lady of Tepeyac until returning to fulltime employment. Now I am a liaison for the Our Lady of Tepeyac grade and high schools—beacons of hope in a high crime area. Our leader, Sister Paulanne, is compassionate and tireless in her commitment to help those in need. I am astounded by the generosity in time, treasure, and talent given by our parish. Sister always says, "It's a hand up, not a handout". I continue to be in awe of all Sister Paulanne has accomplished in her mission to serve God and his people.

#### **Reflection from Fred Donnelly**

Since the early 1980's, OLPH has supported Madonna House, which provides housing for abused mothers and their children, by providing monthly meals. Paul D'Amore, with the support of the Sharing Ministry, began delivering these meals prepared by the women in the parish. As the need grew, Paul enlisted the support of the Women's Club in providing the meals. For close to 40 years, Paul organized and delivered for this program, and deliveries grew to include clothing, toys, and baked goods. Today, Paul watches from his final resting place as his family continues the deliveries. Thank you, Paul, for your tireless and selfless love that continues to inspire and protect us. St. Paul Pray for us!

#### Reflection from Father Mike & The Faith Community of Saint Sabina

Congratulations and gratitude to the Sharing Ministry on their 40th Anniversary. You have been a consistent support to us throughout these years. Whether it was bringing food, clothes, gift cards, sleeping bags, toys at Christmas, supporting our school fundraiser, or your monthly donations, you have helped feed and clothe those in need. Your support is a lifeline to those struggling to survive. Your prayers and continued belief in us give us strength. Often, we feel overwhelmed with the need, like an island trying to survive. Your support reminds us we are not alone, that there is a faith community that believes in us. Sister Paulanne is a great supporter and a dear friend whom I have admired and who taught me about dedication to and sacrifice for the poor. She is the Mother Theresa of the Archdiocese.

OLPH will always hold a special place in my heart for the

amazing experience of being your Deacon and for your continued friendship, love and support. The Sharing Committee puts flesh on what we pray in the Lord's Prayer, "Thy Kingdom come, they will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven." May God continue to bless you as you have been a blessing to us!

#### **Reflection from Sandy McBreen**

Mother Teresa said: "Do not think that love in order to be genuine has to be extraordinary. What we need is to love without getting tired. Be faithful in small things because it is in them that your strength lies." And so for 40 years this could be the mantra for our Sharing Ministry at OLPH. The outreach is endless and boundless. The Sharing efforts demand a steadfast spirit and so it has. It is my heart.

#### **Reflection from Patty Tilghman**

At a Sharing Meeting in September 1984, I raised my hand to suggest that we have a Befriend-a-Family program as part of Sharing. The generosity in the last 38 years has been astounding! Our eyes were opened to the hardships and tragedies that occur in our sharing parishes that we don't witness in the suburbs. We learned of families burnt out of their apartments or who had lost children in drive-by shootings. Many grandmothers were trying to raise their grandchildren on their own Two of our parishioners fully equipped the apartment of a family whose home was burned, calling it "Decorating by God."

We had caravans transporting the items down to our Sharing parishes. For 20 years Sandy McBreen stored the donations in their garage. Jennifer Karnig then took over, turning their downstairs upside-down to make room for all the boxes. In more recent years, Stacy Dolan had coordinated the program. Presently, Megan Anderson has taken charge with over 170 families being helped. Over the years, I have been blown away by the generosity of our parishioners, often referred to as "angels" for their generosity. I am proud to be a part of this generous parish.

#### **Reflection from Barb Berens**

It may be a small thing we're doing, but it brings some satisfaction when you imagine a bit of pleasure given to a needy recipient.

#### Reflection from Bob Hicks and Family




