Dear Parishioners,

"The dead shall rise"

Throughout the month of November, we venerate the memory of our beloved dead. In a special way we walk with those who have experienced loss this past year.

Last week's Bulletin cover listed the names of those who went home to the Lord this past year. Given the number of names,

many families in our midst are still in the throes of grief.

We all cope with loss in different ways. It can be challenging in a family where so many ways of coming to grasp with the reality of death are at play. Giving one another the space, they need is crucial. There is no one way to grieve and grief has no time limit.

As I reflected on the names on our bulletin cover, I was aware of the myriad of circumstances that marked each loss. Some deaths were the result of many years of diminishment and decline, for others death came like a thief in the night, no forewarning or time to prepare.


In the aftermath of death, we face issues of mortality and the more profound questions of the ultimate meaning of life. As Christians, we know it is central to our faith, our conviction, that we all share in the resurrection of Our Lord. This weekend's passage from the Gospel of Luke affirms the Lord's teaching, that the dead will rise and ours is a God of the living not the dead.

There are some aspects of faith we must just embrace. Certain tenets are beyond empirical proof or clearly evident. In Christ we shall all live in eternity.

I have the great privilege of accompanying many going through the process dealing with and coping with the reality of death. I see over and over the power and the reassurance that comes when a person's life has been formed in faith and they are connected to a community of faith. I cannot tell you how many times over a year I hear people say, "I don't know how I would have gotten through this loss if it wasn't for OLPH and my faith."

Parish looms large for all of us on many levels. It is the place where we worship, our faith is formed, friendships emerge, and we can find remarkable comfort and assurance when we are in the grips of sorrow that death elicits.

I spent this past Holy Week in Jerusalem and had the profound experience of marking the moments of Our Lord's passion, death, and resurrection in the actual places where those events occurred. I do not know if I have ever thought so much of Our Lord's humanity. From the Upper Room, the place of the Last Supper, to the Garden of Gethsemani, to the Via Dolorosa, to the place of His crucifixion to the place where they "laid Him in the tomb," I could not help but dwell on the suffering He endured for us. He was humiliated, beaten, and killed.

I had the extraordinary experience of being in the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher at sunrise on Easter Morning as the light of the newly risen sun poured over the place tradition has it, He was buried. The Risen One transcends time history and place. As we move from earthly existence to eternal life, we will also transcend everything we know.

On Easter Monday, I walked from Jerusalem to Emmaus recounting the Gospel account of the two disciples walking along trying to make sense of all that had happened and did not realize the Lord was walking with them. It was not until the breaking of the bread that their eyes were opened.



It has been a long process for everyone, to return to life in the new normal. Also, this past summer I had a fall which led to five broken bones in my left hand, surgery and a continuing period of recovery.

This concert is about a return for me in that way, back to the concert stage, behind the piano. I will be performing works of Bach, Chopin and Ravel. These works have been an excellent therapy for me and a blessing to me to be able and share these with you again.

This is also an album release concert for my third album, entitled, "Impromptu", my first CD in 9 years. I recorded this album over a 4 year span at a recording studio in the Bronx, on a beautiful 9 foot Steinway piano. For me, improvisation is a special form of prayer or contemplation, as the music is created in the moment, as I do my best to open my heart to God, to let the Holy Spirit flow through me.

I have been devoted to the art of improvisation for most of my life and this has been a central element in my music ministry at OLPH. I have always wanted to create an album that captures these special moments. That is what my "Impromptu" album is all about.

This concert will feature an inspiring new composition that I have written, with the lyrics of Cantor





Decade Two continued under the able leadership of Rich Tilghman, Betty Collins as Secretary, and Father John Flavin as Pastor. Sister Paulanne Held continued to attend the monthly meetings. With the passing of our previous Pastor, Father Myles McDonnell, Julie Cooper organized a baby shower in his memory to recognize his dedication to Sharing and his love of children. Items of clothing,

diapers, and formula were collected. This wonderful February tradition continues to this day.

Operation Rice Bowl, the Lenten solidarity program of Catholic Relief Services (CRS), was also introduced by

Julie to strengthen our Lenten journey as a Parish. A small paper bowl was available in church to symbolize a way to pray, fast, learn, and give. Alms were collected, and given to CRS which helps develop projects that contribute to food security in local dioceses in the US and around the world.

Based on the Bible, Mathew 25:34-40, giving to those in need is like giving to Jesus, **Chris Oaks** along with **Sharon Riley** presented a new Mission idea for the children of our Parish. They were asked to bring a non-perishable item to Mass to be brought up to the altar during the Offertory. This dear, simple, loving gesture continues to be a very special part of every Saturday/Sunday Mass at OLPH.

The Sharing Ministry has grown through the years and has become the heart of the Parish. Hundreds of Parishioners participate in ways both big and small through Religious Education, the school, both Men's and Women's Clubs, and many other organizations.

Volunteers continue to serve monthly at the Olive Branch in Chicago. Food is donated and delicious meals are prepared in the kitchen of **Sparvin Nazarou**, owner of "Everyday Gourmet" in Glenview. Volunteers also began serving at Marquardt Center, a Franciscan outreach to Chicago. Their cooking talents were not required, just their friendly faces and smiles while serving the homeless and poor.

The little red Annex quickly became a hub of activity, and an idea began to percolate for collecting shoeboxes for those in need. Items included hats, cough drops, and toiletries. This Parish-wide effort for the homeless became known as "Shoebox Operation at the Annex"!! It was soon busting at the seams with as many as 700 boxes.



Lou Marohn added these words to the Sharing logo of the basket of loaves and fishes, "The Joy in Living Is the Joy in Giving". Lou and Pat Marohn chaired the OLPH summer picnic for the Sharing Parishes and decided that the previous rainy, mud-fest at Sleepy Hallow required a new home! So it was held outside at OLPH with the addition of a

Petting Zoo from Patch 22, and the most popular new addition, "Dunk the Padre" (Father Flavin got dunked a lot!!!!). He later commented "Remember your pink envelopes. They help keep those desperately needed Chicago parishes and schools open." Vern and Mary Anne Sebby chaired the picnic the following year.

Sharon Riley spoke of a new program to create a joint effort between parishes and Catholic Charities to provide apartments for homeless people. Led by Sharon, this is now a successful, thriving program. Volunteers also carpooled to the Greater Food Depository where they helped pack 12,700 meals in one day!!

Catholics Against Racism (CAR) began at OLPH in 2000 when the Micah Team was formed by **Sandy McBreen**. She led a group from the Parish, including Father Hickey, that marched in the Glenview 4th of July parade and carried the Catholics Against Racism banner.

Here at OLPH, Sharing continues to foster faith, friendship, and relationships that will last a lifetime. Sister Paulanne is our Beacon of Light and Inspiration. Her devoted commitment to the poor inspires us to be the very best we can be as a Parish. **Pope Francis** surely had Sister Paulanne in mind when he said,

"TO CHANGE THE WORLD WE MUST BE GOOD TO THOSE WHO CAN NOT REPAY US."


