

Dear Parishioners,

"By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Despite all the challenges that face us, over and over again, we get glimpses into the power of human intellect and ingenuity.

In July 2020, NASA launched one of its most complex missions to date with the launch of the rover Perseverance to begin a robotic exploration of the planet Mars. It took seven months for

Perseverance to get to Mars after liftoff. Perseverance has the most sophisticated cameras, equipment, a helicopter and a laboratory to conduct a wide range of experiments over the next decade. The Rover landed in a crater that scientists believe once occupied the largest body of water on Mars. Perseverance has already exceeded all expectations for the pictures and data it has collected.

The word perseverance means a continued effort to do or achieve despite difficulties, failure or opposition. A fitting name for this kind of mission. The word perseverance captures the scientific challenges of this mission, but also in a larger context, the world has been facing with the realities of the pandemic. We have all been required to embrace perseverance.

Perseverance challenges us not to give up! Life is difficult even in the best of circumstances. It doesn't take much for our lives to be inundated with challenges related to our physical or mental wellbeing. People who thrive in life persevere. Persevering means not to just to get through challenges but to prevail and move forward.

The scriptures this weekend speak to the virtue of perseverance. We are in the final weeks of the liturgical

year as we approach the Feast of Christ the King. The scriptures suggest a time of tremendous upheaval, confusion and conflict. Seems to describe the world we are living in today. Just as believers have persevered in the past, so today we must persevere in our faith. The pandemic, the war in Ukraine, the divisions in society, the disruptions to our lives make a case for how important it is to persevere.

I am so blessed because I am surrounded by people like you who inspire me to persevere. The challenge of faith is to not just get through things but to thrive. By our perseverance we will secure our lives! The Jews in the desert, the persecuted early Christians and all of us today have the responsibility of forming the world we live in the teachings of Jesus. The Kingdom of God will prevail!

Lot's happening in the parish to remind me of the power of perseverance. I was so honored to celebrate the Sacrament of First Reconciliation with our second graders in the school. They were so well prepared and are a great credit to their parents and teachers. Holly Fair took on a new look this year and was terrific!

The Gregorian University in Rome is an outstanding institution. 

Stewardship Report

To all parishioners:

We are just about a month into our Catch Up Sunday appeal and we cannot thank you enough for your generous response! Through October 31, Catch Up Sunday donations total \$133,000. This has gone a long way to help close the gap that we ended with last year and that we are currently seeing in our month-to-month collections. For those who are still contemplating a gift, it is not too late to make one. Thank you, thank you, thank you!!!

The first four months of our fiscal year are complete! The results of Collections for the four months are listed below. As a Parish Community, we have contributed \$916,273 towards Sunday and Holyday collections from July 1 to October 31, 2022. You can see from the charts below that we are ahead in actual collections as compared to the four months ended October 31, 2021 – entirely due to Catch Up Sunday funds added during October. We are, however, 6.5% below budget for this current year's period in the amount of \$63,675, and still have a way to go to "catch up".

If you missed past notifications, it is still not too late to submit your Planned Offertory Commitment for this fiscal year. We would be most grateful if you considered an increase of 5% in your current giving level to the General Offertory. You can do this by clicking on the link on the homepage of our olphglenview.org website or on the QR code following this article to access the form. Thank you to all those who have responded to the POP for this fiscal year.

As a reminder, the General Offertory provides us with the revenue that allows us to pay our staff, keep the lights and heat on, and maintain and grow both our outreach and liturgical programs. It is also the source of funds which covers expenses related to the administration and maintenance of our facilities, including coordination of calendars, set up and take down, for all parish and school activities held on our property. Please be generous as you consider your level of giving to the General Offertory. We are ever grateful for all your gifts.


Calendar year end is historically a time to consider year end gifts, whether to take advantage of tax incentives or to analyze one's financial position and level of giving, in general, or, simply, to share one's blessings. We remind you of the ability to give directly to OLPH General Offertory via a QCD, which can provide income reduction and tax breaks, under certain conditions. Direct donations of appreciated stock are another option. Please discuss with your financial and/or tax advisor to see if such a gift might work for you.

Some of you might be interested in other types of giving. The Archdiocese has a Charitable Gift Annuity Program, which could benefit our parish and provide a benefit for you, as well. Also, in today's bulletin, please reference information on the Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program, which will open again on December 1 for the coming year.

The year 2000 brought a new Millennium to the Sharing Ministry and new opportunities to expand our mission of helping others. Our Ministry has always grown organically.

When an organization is brought to our attention, we consider how or if we can help them always keeping in mind that **Sr. Paulanne** and her clients are first. Sometimes

one of our members has an idea and we try it. In 2007, we celebrated our 25th anniversary. **Pat Marohn**, **Julie Cooper**, **Katie Nicolau**, and **Eileen Hoekstra** envisioned a massive food collection with a goal of 25,000 which they exceeded at 35,812 items!

The following year Guild 30 took over the endeavor and it has been a huge success ever since. We recently connected with Connections for the Homeless in Evanston and we've been sending them Men's clothing.

Our Ministry has always been in a state of flux. Some

programs or events drop off while other events pop up. In the past, we had a Sharing Picnic that our Sharing parishioners came to. Over the years, that became rather unworkable. We used to have a scheduled Sharing Day of Service at the parishes but we found that after a few years, our date was not fitting the needs of the Parish. We changed to a flexible schedule of doing projects when the Sharing Parish had specific needs.

staffed the GCFD Farmer's Market at St. James. **Sarah Hill** designed the new spaces at Our Lady of Tepeyac, and **Amy White** is engaged in the high school mentoring program. **Bob Hicks** is an advisor to St. Sabina's Academy. We've added **Regina Banks** to those whom we support, a southside minister who works with the desperately poor in **Er Pflogor's** of

Throughout our forty years of work, we have always received tremendous support from the Women's Club, the Men's Club, the school, Religious Ed, and the generous

and caring members of our parish. We couldn't have thrived without the leadership of **Rich Tilghman**, **Bill Lynch** and **Betty Collins**.

Today we have individuals like Lee Vandervest who manages the cadre of drivers to our Sharing Parishes, Mary Lou Jarvis and Marge Naegele who lead the teams of sorters

who keep the Sharing Resource Center organized, **Julie Cooper** who is our liaison for the Convent of the Holy Spirit, many more who deliver to organizations we support (The Women's Center, Northwest Settlement, Catholic Charities, Maryville), and **Ben Tchaou**, our dedicated photographer who documents all of our work. The Sharing Ministry is a wonderful team of generous, hardworking, caring people who are truly doing God's work.

In 1962, **Michael Harrington** published a significant book entitled The Other America that revealed the enormous pockets of poverty in our country. Forty years ago OLPH began its Sharing Program. Using the structure of parishes in our American Catholic Church, OLPH began to make connections, build relationships, and respond to the needs of that "other America" by building and sharing relationships with a range of parishes.

Some of the responses were to basic needs like hunger or to assist families with diapers, gift cards, and more. Not only did OLPH respond, but we learned about our neighbors in the metropolitan area. Our eyes were opened to people much like us, but who had to struggle mightily every day with poverty, violence, unemployment, and more. Through these relationships, we also helped bring Catholic education and a future to many young people. **Fr. McDonnell, Sister Paulanne**, and those early pioneers put faith into action and responded to the least of our brothers and sisters while continually opening our eyes.

The schools of Our Lady of Tepeyac, located in the Little Village neighborhood, are deeply grateful for our partnership with OLPH's Sharing Committee and their efforts over the years to meet the needs of our families, teachers, and students.
