Dear Parishioners,

"I am the one who is and who was and who is to come".

This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. As the liturgical year draws to a close, we acknowledge the centrality of Jesus Christ in our journey of faith.

We all have journeyed together as we have celebrated our faith. This past year babies were born, couples were married,

illnesses endured, and some grieved the loss of loved ones. The pandemic has put the gift of life in perspective as we have all faced the challenges it has presented.

Last weekend marked the 25th anniversary of the death of Cardinal Bernardin. I worked very closely with him during my years as executive secretary of the Priest Placement Board. The Cardinal in his remarkable book, "The Gift of Peace", reflects on the ministry of Jesus, "He came among us filled with enduring love. So, the people he encountered on his journeys were never interruptions, distractions, or obstacles. For him, they were opportunities to carry out his mission. Serving others was at the very core of the meaning of his life."

This weekend invites us to reflect on the very nature of our own relationship with Jesus. How available are you to others? How generous are you with your gifts and talents? How do I follow in the footsteps of the one who founded his life on the mandate, "as one who serves"?

One of the key concepts of the Renew My Church process has been to see ourselves as missionary disciples. We must see ourselves as more deliberately witnessing to the power of Christ in our relationships, our choices, and our values. As we live in a time of increasing secularization and skepticism, we are called to more passionately connect Christ to the very matter of our lives.

We have completed the first phase of the Renew My Church process. This process has been modeled after the encounter of St. Francis of Assisi had in front of the

Cross at San Damiano. Initially Francis thought the Lord was asking him to repair his parish church, He would come to realize that The Lord was calling him to repair "the Church". I had the privilege a few weeks ago to sit and pray in front of that very cross.

Christ is calling all of us to renew his Church. We all can be part of the process of transformation. We need everyone to get involved. Everyone brings something to the table.

We have been finalizing our Christmas schedule and I can't help but think that we are at a much better place this year than we were last year. Remember the occupancy limits? Last year we celebrated 18 masses on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day to try and accommodate as many people as possible. While we have gradually been reopening, we still have a way to go to approach pre pandemic levels of participation.

There are many who have yet to make the plunge at returning to weekend worship. Maybe the upcoming celebration of Advent and Christmas could be the occasion to come back. We would love to see you! The pandemic has put many relationships on hold or in tension. The prophet Isaiah invites us to come to the "mountain of the Lord". The reception of the Eucharist in community strengthens us so we can worship the "one who is and who was and who is to come".

You will soon be receiving are Annual Report. Special thanks to Terry Luc for preparing it. I couldn't help but feel a tremendous sense of gratitude for the resources you provide that allow us to accomplish our mission. The Annual report tells a great story. Not even a pandemic can stop OLPH in being a community of hope and promise.

As we celebrate the Feast of Thanksgiving, we praise God for his abundant blessings! For many families, this may be the first gathering of extended family in a long time. If you are traveling, be safe! I am forever grateful to be blessed as your pastor.

It has been a difficult time for everyone. The pandemic has been a great challenge. Thank you for your wonderful support of the Needy Famly Fund during this incredible time. Your support is amazing. Know that my prayers are with you!

The working class has been challenged in moving forward. They began their job with full-time work and many have been cut to part-time with no benefits. They do not make enough money to cover their bills. People live in fear and have a feeling of hopelessness.



We, the Church, must respond. We must continue to help families move forward and give them Hope. Mothers continue to come from our community, in need of food and hygiene products, warm clothing for their children, laundry detergent, and more. Some families tell me they do not always have enough food for their evening meal and go to bed hungry. Thank you for your support in helping families.

God needs to be the center of our lives every day. We need to give strength and hope to those who have none. As difficult as it has become, Mass and Eucharist must be the center of our lives. Without it, we have a hug void. Our children need to learn how important their faith is. They learn it from knowledge and good example. I tell students their faith is like being an athlete. You get better at it when you keep practicing it.

Family is key in giving children the security and confidence they need. Children do much better when they are motivated and challenged. They do not function when they lack the necessities of food, clothing, and shelter; when they live in a car on the street. We wonder why there is so much violence in communities; why children pick up guns and kill; why they belong to gangs and are on drugs?

We have turned our backs on homelessness. Each one of us has the responsibility to change our society, one person at a time. We must bring Courage, Hope, and God's Love to all! Your great support certainly does that! Thank you very much for all the good you are doing!

Intercessory Prayer?

Intercessory prayer is the act of praying on behalf of others. The role of mediator in prayer was prevalent in the Old Testament, in the cases of Abraham, Moses, David, Samuel, Hezekiah, Elijah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel.

In the New Testament, Christ is pictured as the ultimate intercessor, and because of this, all Christian prayer becomes intercession since it is offered to God through and by Christ.



When we pray a novena to Our Lady, we are also praying directly to Christ since no human being is closer to Jesus' Sacred Heart than the Blessed Mother. She takes our meager prayers and presents them to Jesus like precious fruit on a golden platter. And her confidence and trust in Jesus ensure He hears her pleas and grants all her requests according to God's will.

It is God's desire that every believer be active in intercessory prayer. What a wonderful and exalted privilege we have in being able to come boldly before God through Christ and the Blessed Mother with our prayers and requests!
