Dear Parishioners,

"The world in solemn stillness waits"

The blessed season of Advent begins this weekend. This is a season of remembrance, anticipation and hope.

"Let us put on the armor of light", St. Paul writes in this weekend's second reading. We are approaching the darkest days of the year in terms of sunlight. We live in a world where the forces of

darkness; the war in Ukraine, political divisiveness, family struggles and any number of other issues can overwhelm

Advent is all about the light of hope represented in the birth of Jesus Christ. The world "in solemn stillness" waits to once again be enlightened by Christ. Amid all that must be done to get ready for Christmas, the Advent season challenges us to find time to slow down, to listen, prayerfully meditate on the glorious scriptures of this season that call us to reinvigorate our faith and relationship to the Lord.

The parish has several opportunities to assist your Advent journey. We have Advent meditation books available. They can be found at the entrances of the Church and provide daily meditations. The Magnificat or the "Little Blue Books"

can be very helpful. Next Sunday we are delighted to have **Lisa Fortini-Campbell** lead us in a reflection on our Advent theme. She is a terrific presenter, and it promises to be a wonderful way to get into the spirit of Advent. Our Advent reconciliation service will be on Tuesday, Dec.13 at 7:00pm.

Advent is a beautiful season, but it passes very quickly. You really have to get right into it to get the most out of it! Many people attend daily mass as a way of marking the season. Our Church is open every day from 6:00am until 5:00pm if you would like to make a visit.

This weekend we celebrate the 40th anniversary of the Sharing Program. I am thrilled to welcome the pastors and parishioners of our four sharing parishes. We have been blessed over the relationships and projects we have experienced together. I look forward to many more

years of growing together in faith. OLPH is a better parish because of the Sharing Program, and I feel a special debt of gratitude to **Fr. Myles McDonnell**, **Sr. Paulanne** and **Rich Tilghman** who were so crucial in launching the Sharing Program here at OLPH 40 years ago. A legion of our parishioners has made the Sharing Program such a significant part of our parish's mission.

This semester's scripture study program, "A Biblical Walk Through the Mass" has been sensational. I have heard many participants acknowledge the impact this course of study has had on better appreciating the Mass. Thank you to **John Simons** and the facilitators for an excellent

experience. It was a very timely theme given the United States Bishops Conference calling for a national revival of Eucharistic theology in the Church.

Thank you to **Russell Stern** for last week's exceptional concert, "Impromptu". We are so blessed by Russell's gift for music and his generous willingness to share this gift with us!


Congratulations to **Dr. Amy Mills** and our faculty on the results of the Fall "I Ready" testing scores. Many schools have experienced a significant drop in these test scores that evaluate reading and mathematic skills at each grade level as a result of the disruption the pandemic had on children's

education. OLPH school exceeded the 85th percentile on every grade level again. This is an extraordinary achievement and is a wonderful recognition of our outstanding faculty and administration.

I am very grateful to **Jeff and Patti Lawler** and to **Tom and Colleen Huffman** who hosted neighborhood meet and greets recently. It is wonderful to see parishioners in their neighborhoods and to catch up on what is going on.

As I mentioned last week, the Cardinal has lifted the dispensation from the weekly obligation to attend Mass. Advent. The quiet, eager anticipation of the birth of Our Lord. Simple activities that prepare our hearts and minds for the miracle of Christmas Day.


How I wish! Advent in my corner of the world is anything but simple, quiet or peaceful.

Sharing Ministry Reflections: Dr. Amy Mills and Chris Oaks

Reflections from Dr. Amy Mills

"Because you did it to the least of my brothers." you did it to me."

If anyone would have told me my best friend would be a nun who is 25 years older than me, I would have laughed and said that will never happen. Yet, that's exactly what did happen. I met Sr. Paulanne when I arrived here at OLPH as the new 5th grade teacher. I watched her from afar and was impressed by her tenacity, her inner strength, and continual hopeful message. A few years later, we became 7th grade teaching partners along with Sr. Marie. It was a dream team for me! I had the opportunity to hear first-hand about the Sharing Program, the needs of others, and the parish response. She inspired me to do more, give more, be more aware and more responsive to those in need.

When I was named principal, every morning Sr. Paulanne greeted me with, "Good morning, Dr. Mills, and what can I do for you today." She immediately became my right hand, go-to person who was always ready and willing to serve. We bonded through the ups and downs each school year brought. With her sense of humor, strong work ethic, and willing spirit, she gave me the confidence and support I needed in my beginning years of leadership.

Over the years, Sr. Paulanne shared stories about how she became a nun, what her childhood on the farm was like, and what initiatives the Sharing Program was planning. The call to service is one of the essential components of the OLPH experience. The Sharing Program inspired us to make service a "habit of the heart" by creating opportunities that place children in relationships with the poor, the vulnerable, and the disadvantaged.

The parish school fully embraces and participates in the Sharing Program efforts hosting Thanksgiving Food Drives, gathering winter goods, collecting toys at Stocking Santa's Sleigh for Sharing Parish Children and supporting the peanut butter and jelly drive. Children get a tour of the Sharing Room to experience first-hand the challenges and rewards of caring for those in need.

From the old red building to the construction of Lafayette Sharing Room, the Sharing Program has served and responded to the needs of thousands and put Jesus's words into action. It has instilled in all of us a sincere commitment to serving the less fortunate locally and globally. What an amazing legacy of the Sharing Program!

Sharing Reflection from Chris Oaks and her family: Abby, Maddie, and Will

When I reflect on my experience with the Sharing Committee at OLPH, I am reminded of the fundamental values that resonated with me and my late husband and bonded us permanently to the community in Glenview.

It is often the case that the simplest ideas become the most powerful and enduring. This was certainly true of the "Matthew 25" effort to stock the shelves of OLPH's food pantry and those of our four sharing parishes.

It had been the practice at our former parish in Minneapolis to have children bring a non-perishable food item to Mass and donate it at the Offertory. It occurred to me that the considerable size of OLPH, filled with so many young families, could turn this simple gesture into a substantial, on-going food donation program with very little effort.

I recall approaching several of the priests, convinced they would see the beauty of this simple plan and embrace it. "Not so fast..." was the initial, skeptical reaction. There were concerns about potential disruptions to the Mass: to the noise caused by rolling cans, dropped boxes and crackling packaging; not to mention the "chaos" of unleashing dozens of children depositing food into baskets in the middle of Mass! We needed to demonstrate that it could be done, quietly, efficiently, and MOST of all, that it would become such a hit with the CHILDREN.

So, along with several family friends and a small army of little people from Fir Street, we started out by "seeding the crowd." This basically meant a couple of us went out and purchased sample food donations and conscripted our own kids to walk the donated food up to the baskets at the Offertory. For several weeks, we stood at the church doors before Mass and offered food to kids on their way in with their families to add to our army of "mighty mites."

As we had hoped, the parish kids became our BEST marketing tools for the new "Matthew 25" program. It was the kids who reminded their moms to "buy extra" so they had something to bring up at Sunday Mass. They were the ones who got their parents in the habit of keeping a bag of non-perishables in the car and who insisted on attending the Masses where food collections took place. Thanks in large part to this army of little people, food donations grew dramatically.

It has been many years since Matthew 25 came to OLPH. The food gathered and distributed over the years has supplemented food options for those with budgets stretched to breaking due to poverty, job loss, medical bills, pandemic strains, etc., etc.

I'm so grateful for the chance to share these memories and to have been a small part of this ongoing effort to share our bounty. We continue to be blessed by the people at OLPH for their generosity, friendship, and support. It will always have a special place in our history and our hearts.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In so many ways—large and small—the pandemic has upended our lives together. Families and, in a special way, young people, have faced distressing struggles. The pandemic made our connections with one another challenging and difficult. Exactly in that moment when we truly needed supportive relationships with one another, we found ourselves separated. Sadly, this included the relationships and connections that we have in and through the Church.

We did our best to move forward and I am proud of our collective response to the challenges of the pandemic. When I announced a general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, many parishes offered on-line Sunday Masses, and went even further and established prayer lines and reached out to those in need. The TV Mass that I celebrated helped to keep us connected as a community of faith in Chicagoland. So many of you have told me how healing and comforting those Masses have been.

In the meanwhile, we are in a new moment. With vaccinations and boosters, restrictions on public gatherings have eased up. Many people feel more comfortable returning to Church. Yet, we know there are some elderly and immuno-comprised persons who are still not ready to return. And they should not return. These vulnerable brothers and sisters have an excusing cause for being absent and for this reason I will continue the TV Mass on ABC for the present time. But for the rest of us, I have decided, in consultation with my advisors, to lift the general dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass as we begin a new Church year on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26-27.

My hope is that the First Sunday of Advent will provide us with a fresh start to take up again our life together as a community of faith that gathers to worship God. I have asked our pastors to begin the Masses on November 26-27 with the traditional lighting of the Advent wreath. After the homily your pastor will lead the community in a renewal of baptismal promises, acknowledging that we owe our obligation to participate in Sunday Mass to God but also to each other. Our common profession of faith and of our desire to turn away from sin, will be concluded by a sprinkling rite with the waters of baptism.

Let this occasion of our renewal of faith and life, which we all so much want, provide us with a fresh start as we recommit ourselves to worship God and to be supportive of each other week after week as we gather around the Table of the Lord to be nourished and renewed.


