

Dear Parishioners,

"Be glad and exult with all your heart!"

This Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of great joy. The word, "Rejoice" and the invitation to rejoice washes over the readings.

We are aware of the growing anticipation for Christmas. We are now past the midpoint of

the Advent Season, and we are challenged to proclaim this joy with excitement.

The reality of the pandemic continues to hover over the surface. Despite a universal desire to move on, people are still getting sick, and the reality of the virus and its variants require vigilance. The message of the scriptures are welcome words in this context. I was at a meeting recently where we were trying to capture the mood of people. The conversation suggested that people in general are not depressed but dealing more with a degree of "languishing". To languish means to feel somewhat restless, feeling unsettled, a lack of interest in the things that typically bring joy. The news of a new variant can result in a feeling of frustration, "will this ever just go away"?

While we can't single handedly wish the virus away, we can allow the energy and spirit of Advent to move us from languishing to hope. Our theme for the Advent Season is the "Thrill of Hope". We can make a special effort to be grateful for God's blessings. We can acknowledge the goodness in others. We can be more open to the wonderful traditions and memories this time of year evokes. In our commitment to focus more on "we" rather than "me", the joy of Christian life can move us!

I find we really must decide to be joyful because the voices and forces of discouragement and negativity can easily overcome us. I see this in how easily impatience or irritability can drain us of the joyfulness that we so need.

It was hard not to sense the joy last Sunday as the Sharing Resource Center reopened. I saw the joy firsthand as the children of our school who brought hundreds of gifts for families in need. I felt the joy of making a difference as our "Knit for Life" ministry presented so many handmade blankets, scarves and

hats for people who live on the margins. I couldn't help but feel the joy at last week's parish Christmas Party as many parishioners connected for the first time in months. It was great to also see many new faces of new parishioners celebrating their first parish Christmas party.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation can bring a special joy to our preparations for Christmas. The priests are in the process of hearing confessions for all the children in Religious Education and our school. On Tuesday, Dec. 21, there will be a communal reconciliation service and confession for our parish, St. Catherine's, and St. Norbert's. It begins at 7:00 p.m. at St. Catherine's.

I want to express my gratitude to Margaret Waldron for her wonderful service as our Director of Religious Education. She has accepted a new position that was a professional opportunity she is excited about. I wish her the very best. She has made a lasting contribution to the future of our Religious Education program. Angela Romano will be serving as our Interim Director. Best wishes Margaret!

Youth Ministry has been very busy! Many of our kids marched in the Holiday Parade here in Glenview. They gathered for a special night of reflection on the beginning of the new liturgical year. It was great to see our seminarian **Andre Klaes** lead the kids in a reflection. Our other seminarian, Jesse Hiett is in the Holy Land with his classmates for a 3-week immersion experience.

I appreciated participating in a gathering supporting the Gregorian University in Rome at Loyola Academy. I am grateful for the experiences I have had over the years sponsored by this outstanding institution.

We had a wonderful gathering this past week of the Glenview Clergy Association at the rectory. We have a Christmas gathering of the Parish Pastoral Council this coming week and a gathering of our extended staff.

As the celebrations of Christmas draw closer, please review the schedule of liturgies. If you haven't been back because of COVID, maybe Christmas could mark the beginning of "coming home" to OLPH. We would love to see you!!


Hope and Healing Mass



Gaudete Sunday - Rejoice!

Third Sunday of Advent – December 12


Today's Second Reading: "Brothers and Sisters, Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice"! Your kindness shall be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition with thanksgiving make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil 4:4-7)

This weekend we celebrate the third Sunday of Advent, also known as Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is a Latin word meaning "rejoice." It comes from the opening word of the introit

(entrance song) of the third Sunday of Advent liturgy, which is derived from Philippians 4:4-5. This third Sunday of Advent is a reminder to seek and spread joy in the coming of Christ.

So, here is your challenge during the third week of Advent: spread joy, not distress! Be a source of joyful appreciation for all that God has given to you and share that joy with others. The shift from purple/violet to pink/rose is like the Laetare Sunday during Lent, which similarly marks the half-way point of the penitential season leading up to Easter. Laetare is another word in Latin meaning "rejoice."
