

Dear Parishioners,

lerry Christmas!

We now enter one of the great seasons of the year, Christmas. We rejoice that the Lord was born into our midst in Bethlehem. We rejoice not just in that historical moment but in the reality that he is born again and again into the world every day.

I pray this Christmas is a season of joy, hope and new beginnings. Christmas invites us to recognize the beauty of life and the power of the Good News.

This Sunday after Christmas is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The readings are full of wisdom on how we might live as a family in the spirit of our Christian heritage.

I find the versus of the second reading, Colossians 3:12-17 worthy of being posted on the refrigerator at home and worthy of daily reflection:

St. Paul presents us with a spiritual road map to navigate our family life, bearing with one another, forgiving one another, being patient and kind in our dealings. This attitude adjustment can be so redemptive.

I love this time of year because it is like an extended family reunion. Our college students are home, relatives and former parishioners are in town, those who have been away have come back.

No one knows what 2022 has in store. Hopefully we will heal from COVID, hopefully there will be the gradual return of life before COVID, hopefully the New Year will be filled with the graces and blessings of beginning anew.

I extend a special welcome back to those who have been away as result of the pandemic. We praise God for your presence! May this year mark the return of many to the community of faith. May this be a year of special graces for all our families.

Our celebrations of Advent and Christmas have been so beautiful. Thank you to our liturgy committee, our arts and environment committee, our music ministry, our greeters and ushers, our maintenance staff, our priests and deacons.

The Christmas Season reminds us of God's Infinite Love and Mercy in our lives. May our hearts be open to His gifts during these troubled times.

Each one of us must hear the call Jesus gave us to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and shelter the homeless. Each one of us has the responsibility to respond. The more we can work together to bring respect to all people, empower people to move forward, the better our communities will become.

We are the greatest nation with the most resources and yet do not provide the basic necessities of food, clothing, and shelter to help people survive. Mothers come from our community in need of food, clothing, hygiene products, and more, because they have so little. Senior citizens, who have worked hard all their lives, live on a very limited budget and frequently go without important things such as medication. People who have suffered from COVID and who have been unable to work for several months are threatened with eviction. Lights and gas are turned off. People live in fear and feel helpless becase there is nowhere to turn.

God needs to be the center of our lives every day. We need to give strength and hope to those who have none. We need to go to Mass as family. Eucharist must be key in our faith. We cannot empower people if God is not first in our lives.

We must do all we can to change our society, our government, our communities. We need to use our inner strength, talent, and vision to build a better world. Our communities are better when we have strong family values and respect for one another, when we educate and motivate our children in a strong educational environment, when we create sufficient job opportunites and provide basic necessities for one another. We know this is the answer to building great communities which, in turn, build a great nation.







Holy Family of Nazareth, grant that our families too may be places of communion and prayer, authentic schools of the Gospel and small domestic Churches.


Holy Family of Nazareth, may families never again experience violence, rejection and division: may all who have been hurt or scandalized find ready comfort and healing.





Tax Credit Scholarship

The Invest in Kids Tax Credit Scholarship (TCS) program allows you to make a gift toward scholarships for in-need Catholic school students - and receive 75 percent of that gift returned to you as an Illinois state income tax credit. As we approach the end of the calendar year, this is a powerful way to support low-income students while earning a significant income tax benefit.

For a limited time, your TCS donation to any school run by the Archdiocese of Chicago will receive a 2-for-1 matching gift (limitations apply). For every dollar designated to a qualifying school through Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2021 and Feb. 28, 2022, the school will receive two dollars in matching funds. The donations are capped at \$50,000 per school, which could provide up to \$150,000 in scholarship opportunities for a school with the match!

When you make a gift to the TCS program, you can:

- · Help a student in need achieve a life-changing Catholic education;
- Receive an Illinois state tax credit for 75 percent of your donation;
- Triple the impact of your gift through the matching gift program!

Donors who would like to receive the tax credit for their 2021 taxes should begin the process prior to December 20th to ensure that they have enough time to make their gift by December 31, 2021 or they can donate in 2022 to receive a credit against their 2022 state taxes.

Here is an example of how powerful this program is:

A donor with \$75,000 in income could donate \$5,000 which would 1) eliminate Illinois state income tax liability of \$3,750 and 2) provide \$15,000 in scholarship support (after the \$10,000 match). For a total of \$1,250 (the donation of \$5,000 minus the \$3,750 state tax credit), this donor has now provided three students with \$5,000 in scholarships to use to attend a Catholic school of their choice.

At OLPH, four students received TCS scholarships this school year. Our Lady of Tepeyac, St. Sabina and St. Philip Neri had almost 300 eligible students apply for the scholarship this year but there was only enough donations to award 100 scholarships. By donating to the TCS program you can redirect some, or all, of your state tax liability to fund scholarship for families in need within our parish community, at schools in our sharing parishes and across the Archdiocese.

Help us provide a Catholic education for any eligible student. We can help many families, schools and our Catholic community through the gift of a tax credit scholarship.


