Thoughts on the SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

Good stewards recognize this movement of the Spirit as a gift, and make efforts to cultivate this gift and grow in their faith. Take time this week to stop and look around you, be aware of God's awe-inspiring creation, and give thanks for God's loving care and concern for each of us.

Dear Parishioners,

"But you spare all things because they are yours"

Each year we focus a couple weekends on the challenge of stewardship. The responsibility we all have to offer our time, talent and treasure to God. The readings this weekend are tailor-made for a reflection on stewardship; how we might better appreciate how much God loves us and that ultimately all that we have belongs to God.

The passage from the Book of Wisdom reminds us that God can do all things, and we have been invited to participate in the ongoing creation of the world. God looks beyond our imperfections he loves us so much.

St. Paul encourages us to "bring to fulfillment every good purpose." There is so much we can do, there is so much potential, there is so much that we have been blessed with.

Like Zacchaeus in the Gospel, sometimes we need to climb a tree to get a sense of the big picture, to get a bigger perspective. Being stewards of God's gifts, we come to see we are part of something much bigger than any one of us.

This sense of being blessed is amplified for me as we mark the Centennial of the founding of our parish. I think of the incredible sacrifices those very first parishioners made to form a parish. I think of the vision of **Fr. Dussman** to transform a small country parish into a vibrant suburban community. I think of the challenges that **Fr. McDonnell** and **Fr. Flavin** placed before us to see our responsibilities to support the larger Church, the larger world. I think of the vision of **Fr. Hickey** to the ongoing formation of the adult community.

By now I hope you have received a copy of our Annual Report. It is very important to me that you are kept informed as to how the parish made use of the sacrifices you made in the past year to help sustain our mission. Like Zacchaeus, I need to climb the tree to get a sense of the bigger picture. Look at all that happened last year because of your faithful stewardship! I know there are many claims on your financial resources. In the past year, thousands of people were touched in some way by the ministry and outreach of OLPH.

This coming week you will receive information on our Planned Offertory Program. This process invites you to reflect on the financial support you can make to the parish in the coming year. It also allows the parish to have a sense of how much income we can project for the coming year. Thank you so much for taking the time to consider your stewardship of the parish in light of your time, talent and treasure.

Next weekend there will be reflections at all the masses by parishioners on how they have come to the decision of how much they can support the parish. I also want to remind you that 6% of our weekly collections goes into our First Fruits Program that supports the many mandated second collections and our 4 Sharing parishes (Our Lady of Tepeyac, St James, St Philip Neri and St. Sabina).

Next weekend, our parishioner, **Vern Sebby** will give a brief presentation on how, Give Central, our new giving program can assist you in making your financial contributions.

Thanks again for your extraordinary support of our "Catch Up" Sunday appeal. We made up a lot of the gap from the summer.

Congratulations to OLPH Grad, **Leo Brett** who was named a National Merit semifinalist. He is a senior at Loyola Academy.

Good Luck to our OLPH Warriors football team who play this weekend in the championship game versus Faith Hope and Charity.

Last weekend we celebrated the baptism of **James Barrett** the son of **John and Jennifer Barrett**, he was baptized by our own, **Fr. James Barrett**. Not too many priests get to baptize a baby with their same name!

Our Confirmation candidates for Religious Education and the parish school must complete several hours of service as they prepare to receive the sacrament. 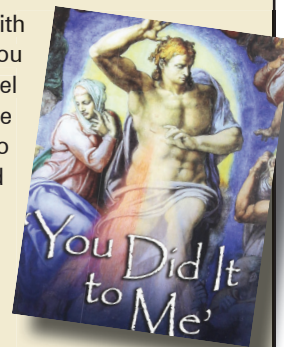

Giving Voice To the Spirit Through Poetry

Sat., Nov. 16, 9:30-11:15 a.m. in McDonnell Hall

As Catholic Christians, we view the world as sacramental. All creation has the potential to reveal the Divine. For those poets who were raised in a different tradition, Protestant or non-Christian they might not use the word sacramental and yet they respond to this transcendent, mystical quality. Their sensitivity to these qualities helps us to awaken to the interdependent and interconnected reality of the world.

They help give voice to the Spirit in order to raise our consciousness above mundane concerns and acknowledge who we are and to what purpose we should direct the energies of our lives. Poets may not see themselves in this way but they can be instruments of the Spirit tapping into the creative energy that flows from the original source of all Creativity and all Creation.

Poetry uses the language of symbol and metaphor and thus begins where ordinary words fail. For example, when Jesus says, "I am the light of the world" he obviously doesn't mean he is a large candle. Instead, he is speaking poetically, deeply and spiritually-and the image of light intrigues and instructs.

This presentation explores two poets separated by eight centuries. **Jalal al-din Rumi** was a 13th century Sufi poet. The American **Mary Oliver** died in January of 2019. They have long been the two most popular poets in America, and through their lives and their writings they offer deeply spiritual lessons into the human condition and the divine that undergirds it.

Jerrol Leitner holds an M.A. in Theology and an M.A. in English. He is retired from 40 years of high school teaching, many of those years at St. Viator's in Arlington Heights. He has been on the faculty of Common Ground and is a frequent speaker on spirituality, world religions and literary topics at churches, senior centers and libraries.

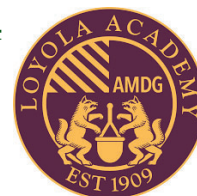
