Thoughts on the SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

In today's Gospel Jesus suggests that his disciples must be prepared to suffer ridicule, persecution and perhaps even death if they are to follow him. Sometimes we may wonder if enduring ridicule and scorn are what we really signed up for when we received the sacraments of initiation. Would we not rather sneak through life as painlessly as possible?

Good stewards take their faith seriously and find comfort in the closing words of today's Gospel. "You will be hated by all because of my name but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Let us make it part of our daily prayer routine to ask the Holy Spirit for the courage to act in Jesus' name no matter the consequences.

Dear Parishioners,
"and they will put some of you to death."

The Gospel we meditate on this weekend is challenging. The proclamation of the Kingdom of God often puts believers at odds with the society we live in. The legacy of the martyrs are those Christians whose sacrifices served as deepening the mission of redemption that can only come from the Risen Christ.

This weekend marks the 30th anniversary of the martyrdom of 6 Jesuit priests, their cook and her daughter in San Salvador. Their martyrdom was the result of their advocacy of the poor and the marginalized during a time of enormous political upheaval in El Salvador. The Gospel compelled them to not remain silent. The Gospel called them to stand in solidarity with the oppressed.

I had a great privilege a year ago to be part of a mission trip to El Salvador with NPH, the organization that provides shelter, education and hope for children who are often abandoned or living in chronic dysfunctional situations all over Central and South America. We were in El Salvador just a few weeks after the canonization of **Archbishop Oscar Romero**. I offered mass at the very altar he was martyred. St. Oscar Romero has become an icon of hope to believers and non-believers alike. He embodies in many ways Pope Francis' challenge to the Church that we become a Field Hospital for the wounded, a poor church to serve the poor.

In these final weeks of the liturgical year, the scriptures focus on the ultimate hopes of God's Kingdom. As we approach the Feast of Christ the King in a few weeks, we need to renew our commitment to embrace our faith and to take a hard look at who we are and the community we are trying to form.

In the second reading taken from St. Paul, we are reminded that the way we behave matters. There cannot be any place for those who seed division. This means that we are not about my community but the community of the Lord Jesus.

Essential to this mission is the way we embrace the mandate of Jesus to 'love others as we love ourselves'. This can be most profoundly revealed in the ways that we walk with the poor and make sacrifices to reach out.

I see this evidenced in many ways, I saw the food truck leave for St. Sabina's filled to the rafters with canned goods and coats. By the end of the month, each of our four Sharing Parishes will have their food pantry's supplied with food that will get them through the next several weeks. Each year the Men's Club coat drive brings warm clothing to many at risk people. I was delighted to see our teens preparing brown bag lunches for food insecure people.

These efforts as simple as they may be, are signs of a community driven by justice and mercy. How proud our Blessed Mother must be in seeing her suffering children finding food, shelter and comfort.

So many of the 100 hours of Mercy pledges are focused on reaching out to others in service and prayer. They speak to being in communion with the scriptures of this weekend. I am so proud to be part of a parish striving for unity, resisting division and banding together to make a difference. The way we behave matters as St. Paul admonishes us.



Special thanks to our maintenance staff for a heroic job keeping our campus safe and accessible during this challenging week weather wise.




