Dear Parishioners,

"Speak Lord, your servant is listening."

This weekend's readings focus very much on the "call" of the Lord, who seeks to direct our lives, our choices, our values. The great challenge is being able to discern the voice of the Lord that can easily be drowned out by other voices seeking our attention.

This discernment is powerfully revealed in the story of Samuel. He figures prominently in the Hebrew scriptures who transitions Israel from the leadership of biblical judges to the era of the Kingdom of Israel. It took three invitations from the Lord before Samuel realized it was the Lord, not the High Priest, Eli who was calling him.

The response of Samuel, "Speak Lord, your servant is listening", would be a wonderful daily prayer that we might all seek to adapt. The path of discipleship is grounded in our openness to respond to the call of the Lord in our lives.

This sense that God is calling us is not just limited to those who feel called to religious life. It is a universal call to all of us from the moment of baptism. Towards the end of the sacrament of baptism, the priest or deacon blesses the child with the words, "The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father."

A New Year promises new opportunities to receive the Call of the Lord and new invitations to shape and form our lives considering what the Lord is asking of us.

Discerning what the Lord is inviting us to be is not easy. All we have to do is reflect on the confusion about what is really the "news". We know how vulnerable we are to misinformation or political bias in presenting the basic facts of a story.

As Jesus said in the Gospel this weekend, "Andrew and Peter, come, and you will see." May this coming year open our eyes, ears and hearts to the redemptive message of Christ's love for us.

We are in the midst of very turbulent times. If the pandemic was not enough, we have been challenged by significant civil unrest. We are entering a period in which the call of the Lord to be messengers of peace. Mercy and justice are crucial.

Amid all this turmoil, I feel drawn to the intercession of our parish patron, Our Lady of Perpetual Help. In the concluding prayer of the Novena of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, we pray: "Virgin of Perpetual Help, Holy Mother of the Redeemer, help your people who yearn to rise again."

So many of the devotions to the Blessed Mother reflect a yearning to be healed and to renew our desire to build up the Kingdom of God that her son Jesus proclaimed.

Some months ago, I was invited to reflect with Guild 26 on the rich tradition of Marion devotions in the Church. I have been blessed over the years to make pilgrimages to some of the great Marian Shrines of the world (Lourdes, Fatima, Guadalupe, Czestochowa). During these months of confinement, I realized I do not have to go to faraway places to experience a Marian pilgrimage. I can do it right here on our campus.

I created a pilgrimage that can easily be followed to the various image of the Blessed Mother, here on campus. More details can be found in this Bulletin. Thank you to Guild 26 for this opportunity. This week I have been praying especially for the intercession of Our Lady of Peace.


This week we remember the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King. His challenges to our nation are as relevant today as they were at the time of his assassination.

Year of St. Joseph

Pope Francis announced in December that the Church would celebrate a Year of St. Joseph in celebration of the 150th Anniversary of the proclamation of this great saint as Patron of the Universal Church. We at OLPH are thrilled to join this celebration since we began as a humble mission church of St. Joseph in Wilmette.

He was our first patron before Our Lady of Perpetual Help took us under her mantle. From the commanding St. Joseph statue on the right side of the altar, to our many successful men's ministries, to the monthly St. Joseph's Novena begun during the Centennial, St. Joseph has surely been guiding our parish throughout the years. Let us grow stronger in our families, our work, and as a church with St. Joseph at our side this year!

What are the dates of the Year of St. Joseph?

From December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

It's most fitting that this special year ends and begins on a holy day of obligation for the Blessed Mother and Joseph's virginal spouse.

What is Pope Francis asking us to do?

The Holy Father wants us to increase our love for St. Joseph, to encourage us to implore this great saint's intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal

Pope Francis delivered an inspiring Apostolic Letter titled *Patris Corde* on the day he announced the jubilee. The title means "with a father's heart," which is how Pope Francis says Joseph loved Jesus. The letter speaks about Joseph's characteristics as a father: beloved, tender and loving, obedient, creatively courageous, and often hidden in the shadows.

At only nine pages, it is an enjoyable and illuminating read that will draw you into Scripture to understand Joseph more fully and the role God has given him as our protector and spiritual father.

St. Joseph Protector of the Holy Church

In our modern age of crisis, St. Joseph is the ideal heavenly patron to invoke for assistance.

"St. Joseph was head of the divine household on earth, with, as it were, fatherly authority; he has the Church

dedicated to his loyalty and protection. Such a person possesses so surpassing a dignity that no honor exists which should not be paid him."

- Pope Leo XIII

Joseph had the entire "Church" under his protection and care as the father of the Holy Family. Our Lady is the Mother and Image of the Church, the Holy



Spirit is the soul of the Church, and Christ is the Church's head. To Joseph this treasure was entrusted; and by his wit, his obedience, and his sacrifice he valiantly defended them. The Church has always needed his protection and he will never abandon us.

The proclamation of the solemnity of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church was made by Pope Pius IX, who also declared the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. But it took many requests and prayers from all the prelates and faithful all over the world and a petition of the Vatican Ecumenical Synod before the Holy Father agreed.

On December 8, 1870, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of his spouse, Pope Pius IX declared St. Joseph "Patron of the Universal Church." In the decree *Quemadmodum Deus*, the Holy Father declared: "As almighty God appointed Joseph, son of the patriarch of Jacob, over all the land of Egypt to save grain for the people, so when the fullness of time had come and he was about to send to earth his only-begotten Son, the Savior of the world, he chose another Joseph, of whom the first had been the type, and He made him the lord and chief of his household and possessions, the guardian of his choicest treasures." God trusted Joseph with his Son. We should trust Joseph too with our precious possessions-our Church, our families, and our lives on earth.

OLPH Religious Education 8th Grade Students Serve Creatively during Pandemic

Our 8th grade students are instructed to discern and complete corporal and spiritual works of mercy for their service project this year. We are focusing on quality of service, not quantity of service. Students are instructed to choose corporal and spiritual works of mercy and write reflection papers about their experience from start to finish and specifically how their service has impacted their understanding about our faith, God, and humanity. Students are encouraged to pray about which corporal and spiritual works of mercy they have chosen to complete and why.

As a reminder, corporal and spiritual works of mercy are described below. If you have any creative ideas as to how our 8th grade students may serve in this way, please contact Margaret Waldron, mwaldron@olphglenview.org

Corporal Works of Mercy: Give food to the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; shelter the homeless; clothe the naked; visit the sick; visit the imprisoned; and bury the dead.

Spiritual Works of Mercy: Counsel the doubtful; instruct the ignorant; admonish the sinner; comfort the sorrowful; forgive offenses willingly; bear wrongs patiently; and pray for the living and the dead.

Our catechists have been encouraging the students along the way and helping them to discern ways to serve God and neighbor. Below is an example of what took place last weekend.

8th Grade RE Service Project - Helped Recycle Christmas Trees

Due to the current uncertain times brought upon us by the COVID-19 pandemic, it has been increasingly difficult for the 8th graders to carry out their service work for their upcoming Confirmation, safely. However, in an effort to complete a socially distant and COVID-19 safe service project, the eighth graders of Mr. Casey and Mrs. Steiger's religious education class collected over 70 Christmas trees around Glenview.

The students and parents then delivered the trees to local Glenview parks where the Village of Glenview and the Glenview Park District will then recycle the biodegradable Christmas trees. The recycled trees will be either turned into mulch for the village and park district or put into Lake Glenview to benefit the local ecosystem as a natural habitat and breeding ground for small fish.

This ecofriendly and covid friendly service project is in accordance with Pope Francis' second encyclical, "Laudato Si," in which he addresses to "every person on the planet," for we all share a common home - the earth.

Thanks to the 8th grade students and parents, over 70 live trees will now be reused and repurposed instead of ending up in a landfill where they take up space!


