Dear Parishioners,

"For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

The scriptures this weekend remind us that we live in community with Christ at the center. There is a power to this insight as we find ourselves coping with a pandemic that has caused isolation and loneliness

We gather in many ways, physically and spiritually. The readings remind us that sin and evil do not exist in isolation. Sin impacts us all. Sin wounds our sense of being part of the Body of Christ.

Redemption is possible! The restoration of broken relationships is possible! Reconciliation is possible!

The passage from the Gospel this weekend from Matthew forms the biblical foundation for the sacrament of confession. The Lord has empowered the Church through the ministry of priests to confer the grace of the sacrament. By being absolved, we have restored our relationship with the

Lord and with the larger community. Taking responsibility for the pain or suffering we have caused others leads us to the Lord's redemptive love. Like the Prodigal Son, we are welcomed into the loving embrace of our Father.

Each month we conduct an audit of how we are implementing the reopening protocols for the parish. I am pleased to report that we continue to meet our benchmarks and have achieved the necessary certifications to proceed carefully and safely.

We can now move to the next level of expansion. We can safely increase the occupancy of the Church to 112. We are exploring ways of adding masses. **Margaret Waldron** will be convening a Reopening Task Force for Religious Education. The school has had a very successful first week of reopening.

Key to the success of the reopening of the Church has been the ministry of greeters and ushers. They greet you when you arrive, assist you with hand sanitizer, check off your names and direct you to your seat. Because many of the participants have not been in the church since mid-March, they help orientate everyone to the procedures we must follow during the liturgy. **Laura Kearney** heads this ministry. If you would like to help, please contact her. Given the increasing number of services, we need more folks. Thank you for considering this ministry.

We have had a wonderful relationship with Glenbrook Hospital. The pastoral needs of those who are sick, and their families is of critical concern for the faith community. For many years, **Belinda Chandier** has been the Director of Spiritual Services. She was so committed to bringing comfort to the sick and would always alert us if a Catholic patient needed ministry. She so appreciated the legion of Ministers of Care that brought the Eucharist to Catholic patients. Belinda recently retired and I want to wish her the very best and to express our gratitude for all she did.

The new Director is **Rev. Andrea Johnson**. I welcome her and commit ourselves to the pastoral service of those in need. I will soon be meeting with her. She is very sensitive to the spiritual needs of Catholics. Because of COVID 19, the North Shore Health Care System is not allowing Ministers of Care to visit patients. As priests, we can bring communion to non COVID patients. There are special procedures for appointed and trained priests to anoint COVID patients.

Volunteers Needed!

We have formed a Greeter/ Usher Committee to help with Reopening Our Church.

The Greeter/Usher welcomes the parishioners and guests into the Church, makes sure that they are wearing a face mask, squirts sanitizer into their hands, and leads them to a spot in the church marked with a sign, "Please Sit Here." These signs are socially distanced six feet apart.

Rev. Johnson made a special request I want to pass on. Since patients can't receive communion, she has realized how comforting Catholics find praying the rosary is during their hospitalization. The hospital recently ran out of rosaries that they have been giving Catholic patients. Could we help supply them with about 200 rosaries?

Sure, we can! If you would like to donate a rosary that could be given to a Glenbrook patient, please drop it off in a special container on the porch of the Parish Center. I will bring the collected rosaries to the Hospital in a few weeks. Thank you! These rosaries will be such a comfort to those who are sick and looking for reassurance.

I recently was speaking with **Esther Behnke** and **Regina Kilroy** about the extraordinary effort our Knit for Life Ministry has undertaken to observe our Centennial. They have knitted hundreds of hats, scarves, blankets and other items for people in need at our Sharing Parishes. Thank you so much!!

As the Centennial Committee conducted research for the Commemorative Booklet 1919-2019: 100 years of Grace, we were fortunate to obtain many historical photographs and documents. These items came from various sources including the Glenview Historical Society, the Archdiocese of Chicago, and OLPH parishioners and former parishioners alike. Among the items was an early photograph of our first pastor, Fr. Martin C. Schmidt.




Our first Pastor, Martin C. Schmidt

With the receipt of that image, we were finally able to include Fr. Schmidt's portrait in the west vestibule of the church among the portraits of all our former pastors, a recognition long overdue. The dedication ceremony took place on December 8, 2019 and was recorded by **Rob**

Orr, one of 17 parish videos Orr created in relation to our Centennial. All the videos can be accessed from the home page of our website.

Another new image that now adorns the walls of our church is the framed Apostolic Blessing from the Holy Father **Pope Francis**, on the occasion of our Centennial. This framed commemorative document can be found in the South Vestibule.



In coordination with the Archdiocese, we are continuing to seek out ways that will allow our parishioners to celebrate their faith here on the campus of OLPH. Here are the most recent developments:

We are increasing attendance at Mass!

We have great news! We are now at the point where we can expand the number of seats available in our church. With additional chairs and by utilizing the balcony and the chapel, we can increase the attendance in the church by 30 people.

So now we can accommodate 112 people in our church for all services.

The Sunday morning Mass schedule is as follows:

- 9:30 am in the Church; max attendance: 112
- 9:30 am in the Playdium; max attendance: 140
- 11:30 am in the Church; max attendance: 112

Chairs in the Playdium will be set up six feet apart for proper social distancing. However, families will be allowed to sit together.



Saturday 5:00 pm Drive-in Mass will continue

Our Drive-In Masses have been extremely popular and so they will continue into the autumn.

You must remain in your car and you will be able to hear the mass on your car radio. The Mass will be celebrated on the porch of the Ministry Center, rain or shine. You will be able to receive communion.

A group of parishioners have begun meeting casually in Mary's Garden after 8:30 Mass to pray the Rosary.

Please join us at 9:05 am for 25 minutes of peace, fresh air and the benefits of communal prayer--socially distanced of course with safety in mind. You may want to bring a hat, folding chair, umbrella, etc.

We have also restarted our First Friday Devotion to the Sacred Heart and the St. Joseph Novena (19th of the month) in the garden.

2020-2021 Rates for Religious Education Program

We are delighted to offer a complete digital RE Program for our children and families during the pandemic for grades preschool through 8th grade. We cannot do RE the same way we offered in the pre-pandemic environment or we will fail. The same rate applies to all models of RE remote learning. One child: \$325; 2 children \$425; 3 or more children \$525; Family Catechesis is a per child rate as described above. Sacramental Fee for the 2nd year of sacramental preparation in 2nd and 8th grade is \$75. No fee is charged for 1st year of sacramental preparation in 1st and 7th grades. Non-parishioner registration fee: \$100.

Because it connects you and your family more deeply to our parish community on many levels now and in years to come. We want you to enjoy our parish life even during the pandemic. When I first arrived here, one of the parishioners explained to me, "You will love it here; OLPH is a magnet for a reason." Join the magnet!

All RE Learning is remote learning with 3 models

Those of you who have registered so far will hear from me soon about class day and time assignments. Below are the learning models we are offering.

Catechist Led-Student Classroom Model - Classes are led by the Catechist for the students connected via a Zoom virtual meeting place. Classes will be held on the days of the week as follows: Mondays at 4:30pm; Tuesdays at 4:30pm and 6:30pm; Wednesdays at 4:30pm; and Saturdays at 9:00am.

Parent/Children at Home Model - Classes are led by parents to teach their own children at home according to the same weekly lessons as the Catechist Led-Student Classroom Model above. Each student will be completing the same lesson each week whether student is learning via Zoom with Catechist or remote learning at home with parents. Parents will be guided and provided with catechist online training and materials.

Family Catechesis Model - Classes are led by Catechists for families connected via a Zoom virtual meeting place this Fall and plan for in-person sessions as soon as practical. Families meet for once a month on a Friday at 6:30pm, or Sunday at 10:45am to follow 9:30am Family Mass.

We Belong to Each Other

In a meeting with workers early on in his Pontificate, Pope Francis prayed:

Lord God look down upon us! Look at this city . . . Look upon our families. Lord, you were not without a job, you were a carpenter, you were happy.

Lord, we have no work.

The idols want to rob us of our dignity. The unjust systems want to rob us of hope.

Lord, do not leave us on our own. Help us to help each other; so that we forget our selfishness a little and feel in our heart the "we", the we of a people who want to keep on going.

Lord Jesus, you were never out of work, give us work and teach us to fight for work and bless us all.

This prayer was recited well-before the Pandemic, but it is sadly all too fitting for our current economic crisis: almost sixty million men and women have filed for unemployment, gains made over the decade since the Great Recession has been almost completely wiped out, and about half of the layoffs have been in lower-wage, personal-service jobs. The repercussions are far-reaching, including economic inequality that is now even worse than during the Great Depression. Black and Latino workers also face much more economic and health insecurity from COVID-19 than others. They face the most lethal pre-existing conditions for coronavirus: racism and economic inequality.

This pandemic has pulled the mask off of the false narrative that leads us to believe that we are separate from one another. Mother Theresa said, "If we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten that we belong to each other." Indeed, our faith teaches that we belong to each other. At a time of crisis such as this, we must turn to our faith, which for me and many of us is the foundation of who we are and how we see the world. From Genesis to the Gospels, Scripture time and time again makes it clear that the treatment of workers is of utmost importance, no matter who they are or where they come from. We are called to love one another.

This is why I am a proud Board Member and supporter of the mission of Arise Chicago. Many of the workers who engage with Arise Chicago are considered "essential" and it is clear that our economy could not run without them, and yet they are some of the worst paid and worst treated in the economy. Their jobs do not provide them proper safety equipment or social distancing. This has led some contracting Covid-19 and tragically dying from the virus. We need groups like Arise Chicago to educate workers on their rights, and support them when they take actions to save not only their lives, but the lives of their families and communities. The task of Arise Chicago to connect faith communities with workers is inextricably linked to the call that because we all belong to each other; we must love each other.

I have met countless workers over the years, men and women, who have inspired me with their courage and heroism to make a difference not only at their job, but in society. Against all odds, they continue to push forward to create a more just world. They do this not to become famous or popular, but because they are compelled to act by their faith. We should change the name of Monday's holiday from Labor Day to A Labor of Love Day, and in so doing, honor all those who historically have and those who will take these same risks.

Let us never again forget that we belong to each other. Rev. Dominic Grassi




