Dear Parishioners,

"The Thrill of Hope"

Just like that, it is Advent! One of the most beautiful seasons of the year that passes so quickly. This season is so rich with its readings, music, and anticipation.

"The days are coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise, I made to the house of Israel". Advent is the season

of celebrating the promise made that the Messiah will be born into history, the Son of God.

We acknowledge not only that moment in history when Christ was born but the realization that Christ is constantly being born in our midst as we witness his love and presence. Spiritually we need to make space in our busy lives to so that we can recognize the reality that Christ is in our midst.

In our recent parish summit, we centered a lot of our reflections on the reality of hope. The pandemic has taken its toll on us. It is very easy to give into the frustration, the uncertainty, the adjustments we had to make for the safety of others. In essence, to be fully Christian is to be a person of hope. The readings each day keep calling us to lean into the power of hope.

This weekend I have the privilege of dedicating a new mosaic in honor of the Blessed Mother. The Marian mosaics that lead our journey into the church recognize the many titles of the Blessed Mother. The new mosaic

honors Our Lady of Kebeho. She appeared to several teenagers in the 1980's in Kibeho which is in southwestern Rwanda. Her messages were pleas for peace and an end to hatred. The Rwandan genocide was one of the horrific chapters of the 20th century. The mosaic is a gift of the **Strenk family**, in honor of their **Aunt Geralyn Sullivan** who has a special devotion to Our Lady of Kibeho.

Next Sunday we will have the ceremonial reopening of the Sharing room at 10:00 a.m.




Advent Reflection Books have arrived!

What is

Intercessory Prayer?

Intercessory prayer is the act of praying on behalf of others. The role of mediator in prayer was prevalent in the Old Testament, in the cases of Abraham, Moses, David, Samuel, Hezekiah, Elijah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel.

In the New Testament, Christ is pictured as the ultimate intercessor, and because of this, all Christian prayer becomes intercession since it is offered to God through and by Christ.



When we pray a novena to Our Lady, we are also praying directly to Christ since no human being is closer to Jesus' Sacred Heart than the Blessed Mother. She takes our meager prayers and presents them to Jesus like precious fruit on a golden platter. And her confidence and trust in Jesus ensure He hears her pleas and grants all her requests according to God's will.

It is God's desire that every believer be active in intercessory prayer. What a wonderful and exalted privilege we have in being able to come boldly before God through Christ and the Blessed Mother with our prayers and requests!

Did you know about: THE CARROLL FAMILY

As Thanksgiving calls us to remember the founders of the United States and the religious faith that inspired them, it is important to recall the first American Catholic family that held significant roles in the creation of the country. This is the Carroll family.

The State of Maryland was founded as a refuge for Catholics fleeing persecution in Protestant Great Britain. The Carroll family emigrated to Maryland from County Offaly in Ireland. In 1737, the third Charles Carroll was born in Annapolis. Charles would spend 17 years in Jesuit educational institutions both in the colonies and in Europe. He inherited extensive land

holdings and farms from his father. In 1776, Carroll was both the most well-educated of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, and the wealthiest. Charles could speak five languages fluently and he had an estate estimated to be worth nearly half-a-billion dollars, including his home Carrollton.

Because he was a Catholic, Charles Carroll was prevented by statute from holding political office, practicing law, and voting. For these and other reasons, Charles was an early advocate for independence from Great Britain. He was elected to the Continental Congress on July 4, 1776. He signed the Declaration of Independence as "Charles Carroll of Carrollton." After Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Jefferson died, Charles was the last surviving signatory of the Declaration.

Charles Carroll would serve as the first United States Senator from Maryland. He vocally opposed slavery calling it "a great evil." He lived to the age of 95, and his funeral was held in

Baltimore Cathedral, now the Shrine of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, where the United States bishops meet once a year.

Charles Carroll's cousin was Daniel Carroll. Daniel was also the product of a Jesuit education in Europe. He owned 27,000 acres of highly productive farmland in Maryland. Like his cousin, Daniel was barred from holding public office, until Maryland rejected the Crown and nullified such bigoted laws.

In 1787 Daniel Carroll was elected as a delegate Maryland to Constitutional Convention

in Philadelphia. He was one of only two Catholic delegates, the other being Thomas Fitzsimmons of Pennsylvania. During the convention to compose the Constitution, Daniel advocated vigorously that the President of the United State not be elected by the congress, but by the people.

Daniel was one of the first Congressmen from Maryland. In Congress, Daniel was an ardent supporter of moving the national capital to a region on the border between northern and southern states. Hence, Washington, D.C., is located mostly on land taken from Maryland. The United States Capitol building is located on a hill previously owned by Daniel's nephew.

Daniel Carroll's younger brother, John, felt the call to priesthood. He joined the Society of Jesus at the age of 18, after several years of Jesuit education in America and Europe. Following his ordination to the priesthood, John Carroll taught school in Europe for a number of years, before he

returned to the United States. Because of laws discriminating against Catholics in the colonies, John worked as a missionary in Maryland and Virginia.

John Carroll founded the parish of St. John the Evangelist in Maryland, and ten years later, worked with a number of priests to organize the Catholic Church in America. When the need arose for an American bishop, Ambassador Benjamin Franklin, then serving in Paris, strongly recommended his friend John Carroll for the position. However, it would be several years before the American public were comfortable with a "Pope-ish" presence.

In 1789, the year John's brother Daniel signed the Constitution, the 25 priests of Maryland selected Baltimore as the site of the first Catholic cathedral in the United States, and they recommended to Pope Pius VI that John Carroll be consecrated the first American Catholic bishop.

Bishop John Carroll ordained the first American priest; he built the first American cathedral; and, since he was a Jesuit and concerned with education, he founded Georgetown College – now Georgetown University. Ironically, the first priest Bishop Carroll ordained, Stephen Badin, founded a mission for American Indians on land that would become the University of Notre Dame, where Fr. Badin is buried. John Carroll was raised to the rank of Archbishop of Baltimore in 1805.




