Dear Parishioners,

"Prepare the way of the Lord"

The words of Isaiah this weekend capture the mood and the spirit of the Advent Season. As we prepare on many levels for the celebrations that surround the Christmas Holidays, we often overlook the most important level of preparation: our spiritual preparation.

This time of the year gets filled up with many activities, many of which are wonderful. Some are a source of stress and frustration. We have to contend with the force of expectations, many of which can be unrealistic.

How can I be more receptive to the deeper meaning of Advent season? This season invites us to revisit the dreams of the Old Testament prophets that foretold the coming of the long-awaited Messiah. We hear in the soaring poetry of Isaiah what the future holds in store. A future ultimately formed by the coming of the Lord. A future that is shaped by peace, harmony, justice, and hope.

This year I have been struck by the meaning of the four Advent candles that adorn the wreath. Last week we lit the candle of hope. This week we light the candle of peace. We pray that the candle of peace reminds us that Christ came into the world to restore the peace that God our Creator had intended. It starts with striving for inner peace and through simple acts of love and forgiveness; this gift begins to transform the larger word.

Isaiah speaks of the time when the Spirit of the Lord will bring wisdom and understanding, knowledge and delight. This spirit will rid the world of violence and oppression, "the wolf shall be the guest of the lamb." There shall be, "no harm or ruin on all my holy mountian."

We have to face evil and division. We see the suffering imposed by war. We see the deadful impact of poverty and loneliness. The vision of a new way of being is part of the Advent dream.

I invite you to not let the season of Advent slip away without making time for the Lord. Take advantage of some of our offerings to enrich your Advent Journey. This Sunday, Dec. 4, Lisa Fortinini-Campbell will offer a presentation on our Advent theme, "The World in Stillness Waits", at 3:30pm in McDonnell Hall.

We still have plenty of Advent meditation books available in the church vestibules.

We will be hosting an Advent Reconciliation service on Tuesday, Dec. 13 at 7:00pm. There will be confessors available to celebrate the sacrament.

This coming Thursday, Dec. 8, is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. The list of Mass times are on page 7 of this Bulletin.

I am really looking forward to our Parish Christmas Celebration this Friday, Dec. 2 at the North Shore Country Club. The Women's Club works so hard on this event.

#### **Charles Dickens and the Making of A Christmas Carol**

A Christmas Carol is an extravagantly symbolic thing as rich in symbols as Christmas pudding is rich in raisins. It is not a study of one person's emotional and intellectual development, it's a knockabout battle between absolute qualities dressed up in bizarre forms for maximum thrills.

This tale celebrates Christmas as though it were an immutable cornerstone of civilized society, as though the customs of the Cratchit household were eternal and universal, but this was far from the case. "Christ's Mass," a medieval church service associated with feasting, was long lost, suppressed by religious hardliners throughout the 16th and 17th centuries.
