Dear Parishioners,

"Be patient brothers and sisters"

I suspect all of us need to hear these words from this weekend's second reading taken from the Letter of St. James.

The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of Joy because we have passed the mid-point of Advent. On one level we celebrate the

closeness of Christmas, on another level, for many, the stress surrounding holiday preparations and expectations can be challenging. For priests, these Advent days invite us to celebrate the sacrament of Confession often. I would have to say the most popular sin confessed this time of year are struggles with patience.

For people who deal with the public; cashiers, salespeople, wait staff, the impatience of customers must be overwhelming. I am sure we have all had the exasperation of being "on hold" forever. Trying to get a "live" person to resolve a problem can be impossible. Automated answering processes with their myriad of menu choices can be so tough to navigate. Traffic, railroad crossings and temper tantrums can get the best of us. How can we cope in a healthier way?

There are no simple solutions. We must be more mindful of not playing into the triggers that bring us to a place of frustration and anger. Over the years I have come up with a shortlist of strategies to better cope and be more patient.

Recently I heard a young girl who looked to be about eight say to her friend, "I just can't do negative today". There is a lot to be said about that. We need to practice mindfulness in how we chose to react to frustrating circumstances. Choosing to be positive, being better able to accept circumstances I have no control over can really help. Putting myself in the shoes of the person I am being impatient with can humanize the situation. When I feel rushed, I try to mentally slow down. Asking for forgiveness of a person I have been unreasonable with can make a difference.

Spiritually, daily meditation, prayer and quiet time can sure help. I find the Ignatian practice of the daily examine as helpful. Identifying moments in the day when I was patient and positive as well as those moments when I was negative and unreasonable. As a pastor I have many occasions in the day to bring to my daily examine! I am struck at how angry someone can get over something that on the surface does not seem to warrant such emotion. Other times I need to be more sensitive to how important a particular issue or concern is to a person with whom I am interacting.

In general patience is the ability to wait for something I really want or need. Advent is the season of "waiting" as we recall the generations of those that awaited the coming of the Messiah. As we "wait together" for the coming of Christmas, may we find a deeper current of patience and peace.

Last week's parish Christmas party and the Saint Sabina Party for the kids were terrific. Special thanks to the Men's Club and the Women's Club for all their efforts.

This coming Tuesday is our communal Advent Reconciliation service. We will be joined by St. Catherine Labouré and St. Norbert. The service begins at 7:00 pm in the Church. There will be the opportunity for individual confessions.

This Wednesday, OLPH will be hosting the Glenview Ecumenical and Interfaith Group. We are blessed with a wonderful group of pastors, rabbis, imams and chaplains that serve the rich diversity of spiritual traditions here in Glenview.

I call your attention to two offerings by **Jerrol Leitner** that are being sponsored by our Evolve ministry under the leadership of **Pat Connery**. The presentations will both be virtual. There is information in the Bulletin on how to access them.

You will soon be receiving a copy of our Annual Parish Report which tells the remarkable story of our parish this past fiscal year. Despite some strong headwinds as a result of the pandemic, our parish continues to be a place of great spiritual power. Our many ministries have weathered a challenging time. Special thanks to **Terry Luc** and **Mary Lynne Januszewski** for their hard work.


The World in Solemn Stillness Waits An Advent Retreat at OLPH

3. Although our focus is God, we celebrate the season among people, some of whom can be critical. So if we hear criticism of our Advent preparations, let's do our best to disregard it. If we've with Lisa Fortini-Campbell. Mass done our best, God is pleased and was then celebrated by Fr. Patrick. that's enough.



Lisa's talk inspired us to see that the stress and anxiety that often accompany our Advent preparations are temptations to take our focus off God and put it on the approval or disapproval of other people instead. So using the metaphor of a ballet dancer, she encouraged us to develop the focus, inner stillness and balance of a dancer so that whatever we do this season, we do it with all our hearts, as if for the Lord,

She gave us seven "exercises" to help build up our strength and balance this season.

- 1. Choose the kind of activities we can do with our whole hearts. If we love to cook or decorate, we should, and gladly! But if there are activities we don't enjoy or do only out of obligation, we might consider not doing them or trying an alternative. One of our group said she had switched out the stress of making a full on Christmas dinner with a day of grazing on appetizers and desserts. Very creative!
- 2. If we do take on something we don't personally enjoy because we want to please other people, then let's give it our all just the same. Attending an event reluctantly or doing a task unenthusiastically isn't the "whole heart" God wants from us.

- 4.Let's try not to be perfectionists and make ourselves anxious! So, even if we're tempted, let's try to refrain from pointing out how much better we could have done something especially when people are in the middle of enjoying all we've done for them.
- 5. Inasmuch as we want to disregard criticism, let's not hanker after praise either. So if someone doesn't praise us or reciprocate our efforts or even thank us, let's try not to feel hurt or resentful. Knowing we've done our best for God is all the reward we need.
- 6. If we can't help feeling anxious or worried, let's ask God for help. "Shepherd me, O Lord, beyond my wants, beyond my fears, from death into life."
- 7. Last, let's take the words of St. Paul to heart. "Dismiss all anxiety from your minds...Present your needs to God in every from of prayer and petition, full off gratitude. Then God's own peace, which is beyond all understanding will stand guard over your hearts and minds." (Phil 4:6-7)

A Christmas Carol is an extravagantly symbolic thing as rich in symbols as Christmas pudding is rich in raisins. It is not a study of one person's emotional and intellectual development, it's a knockabout battle between absolute qualities dressed up in bizarre forms for maximum thrills.

This tale celebrates Christmas as though it were an immutable cornerstone of civilized society, as though the customs of the Cratchit household were eternal and universal, but this was far from the case. "Christ's Mass," a medieval church service associated with feasting, was long lost, suppressed by religious hardliners throughout the 16th and 17th centuries.


Feast of the Holy Innocents


