"Your light must shine before others."

The readings this week speak of the transformative power of light. The prophet Isaiah speaks of acts of kindness; like feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, giving shelter to the homeless as contributing to the powerful confrontation of evil and darkness.

In St. Paul's letter he reflects on the power of the light of his conversion that gave him the power to testify to the Spirit.

We are commanded by the Lord himself in the Gospel to allow our light to "shine before others".

In this cycle of readings this year, the theme of light and darkness has been central to the scriptures proclaimed. This image of the battle between light and darkness is evocative of conflicts playing out all around us. Whether it is the war in Ukraine, the plight of refugees, the scourge of violence plaguing our country, we need to keep leaning into the light.

The struggle between the forces of light and darkness can be at work within our families, our community, the places where we work. We see the power of light revealed with those who comfort the sick, the grieving or the discouraged.

I see this light revealed when a catechist in Religious Ed helps a child discover the power of Christ's love. I see it when I hear the comfort a Minister of Care brings to a homebound person that gets no other visitors. I see it revealed when an older student in our school looks out for the well being of a younger student.

As the Lord teaches us today, "you are the light of the world." We can easily underestimate the power we have to be bearers of the light. At the end of the day we might ask ourselves, where did I see the light of my faith revealed? How was I an instrument of the light that comes from acts of kindness, mercy, patience and generosity?

Guild 37's Mother & Son Sneaker Ball was sensational It was a terrific evening. The kids had a wonderful time. I think a new tradition has been established.

Catholic Schools week could not have gone better. From

last week's liturgies enhanced by our school band and school choir to a week of fantastic activities, we really celebrated the mission of OLPH school.

This week I will be participating in a pastor's mission trip sponsored by Catholic Extension. We will be visiting relief efforts funded by Catholic Extension to Puerto Rico in the aftermath of Hurricane Maria. Over 3000 people died as a result of the hurricane. The hurricane devastated the infrastructure of Puerto Rico. The effort of Catholic Extension is a powerful example of light shining in darkness.

We are going to be undertaking some major capital projects in the coming months. I wanted to give you heads up because there will be some disruptions of parish life to complete them. Supply chain issues and other factors may result in a longer period for these projects to be completed:

The Playdium - the replacement of the roof of the Playdium has been in the works for some time. Our Buildings and Grounds committee has established a priority of replacing the roofs on campus in a cost effective manner. The master plan will tackle the most urgent needs first. We have already replaced some of the roofs in recent years but the Playdium is a major undertaking. The roof will be replaced, new mechanicals for the HVAC system will be installed, the gym floor is already 15 years old and needs to be refinished and we will be installing an elevator. The Playdium will be closed the day after school finishes in June and will reopen the day before school opens in August.

One of our major projects of our capital campaign, "To Teach Who Christ Is" was the renovation of McDonnell Hall. This is one of our most used spaces from liturgy to the Pinewood Derby. We will be using funds from the Campaign and we also have a generous gift from the Thoelecke family in memory of Donna. We had a master plan study completed shortly before the pandemic. The plan calls for an upgrade of the HVAC system, the lighting system, bathrooms, kitchen and the sound system. The space will be enhanced for the celebration of Mass and the other multitude of activities. The architect is drawing up final plans so the project can begin the bidding process. This project will not begin for

a number of months but I wanted to get it on your radar. Thank you for your generous support of the Capital Campaign which has resulted in the transformation of our campus. We have a number of people who are still completing their pledges. This additional income will insure the completion of this project and will help us address a few other projects. All money at this point collected will remain at OLPH. We completed our diocesan obligation a long time ago.

Finally, the Church carpet. Our carpet in the church has long extended its shelf "life." It has been a beautiful carpet and has worthily withstood the foot traffic of thousands of people each week. We have been patching the patches and it is becoming an increasing safety issue. For the last few years, we have been exceeding our parish goal for the Annual Catholic Appeal. Thanks to your generosity, we will be able to replace the carpeting from the money we have earned without going into our savings. Thank you!!
