


seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

"The Spirit of God dwells in you!"

In this weekend's passage from St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians, he reminds us of the enormous blessing and challenge we possess in being the temple of God's Spirit. Through baptism we have been claimed by Christ and his Spirit dwells in our very being.

Anyone who visits Jerusalem

makes a visit to the Wailing Wall, the remnant of the Western Wall of the temple. This section of the wall is all that is left from the Second Temple built by Herod the Great. Observant Jews believe that God dwells in this place that once held the Holy of Holies. Jews reverence this wall and acknowledge that God dwells in this place as they yearn for the day the temple will be restored.

This weekend's reflection by St. Paul challenges us to maintain a reverence for our bodies because God dwells in us! We are all vessels of God's loving and healing Spirit. We are challenged to be faithful stewards of the Spirit as we deepen our faith in Christ.

This weekend's readings are a great primer as we embark on our Lenten journey with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. We will have many opportunities to assist you in your Lenten journey. Please review the many invitations to make the most of Lent, this marvelous season of growing in God's grace and becoming a more authentic Christian. The Bulletin each week will list our Lenten events. We will have several liturgies on Wednesday. Please avail yourself of the Sacrament of Reconciliation celebrated every Saturday from 4:00-5:00pm We have remodeled our Reconciliation Room and it is a prayerful and uplifting space in what was the baptistry.

The words of Paul could serve as a great foundation for beginning the Lenten journey. How do I embrace and reverence the Spirit of God that dwells in me? How does this indwelling of God's Spirit impact the choices I make, the kind of person I am trying to become?

I have shared with you the challenges the Church has been facing in the aftermath of the worst of the pandemic. For many the pandemic has had a lasting effect on their spiritual life and their sense of the mission of the church. This Lent, the Archdiocese is launching two major initiatives to better understand the needs of the people we serve and the priests who minister to them.

During the weeks of Lent, all the priests of the Archdiocese will be participating in a study called the Priest Leadership Inventory. This is an extensive survey of each priest's journey since his ordination. There will be an invitation to evaluate the skills we bring to ministry and the skills that must be developed to be an effective evangelizing priest. As the surveys are reviewed, the Diocese will look at what kind of programs and resources can be developed to continue the on going formation of our priests who continue to face extraordinary demands and challenges facing us at this critical time.

The second initiative involves YOU! Clearly there are many challenges facing our parishioners. Church attendance continues to decline. Many people no longer identify themselves as belonging to a church. The impact of secularization, the scandals, and a general malaise in our culture has had its impact.

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, every Catholic in the Archdiocese will be invited to participate in a survey. The survey will ask for your feedback on beliefs/attitudes, personal practices, and experience of parish life. The aim is to asses parishioners' spiritual formation on their path to discipleship and to provide parish leaders with a better understanding of where to focus efforts and energies to achieve our mission. There will be a link for you to access the survey in the Bulletin and on our website. There will also be paper copies available in the Church. The survey will take about 10-15 minutes to complete and will provide extremely valuable data to the leadership of our Archdiocese and to us here at OLPH. Please participate! We need to get as many parishioners as possible to participate. It makes no difference how active you are in the parish. We really need to hear from those who are no longer participating or have had experiences or issues with the Church, either here at OLPH or the larger church. We need to know what is happening in the hearts of all our members to proceed as an effective evangelizer of the "Good News". Thank you for considering participating. You can begin downloading the survey this coming Wednesday and it will be available throughout the Lenten season.

The Catholic Church: A Truly UNIVERSAL Church

Join us for a special Universal Mass Celebration 9:00am Sunday, Feb. 19.

When was the last time you heard Pater Noster (Our Father) in Gregorian Chant? Similarly, have you ever heard the Lord's Prayer sung in Jesus's language of Aramaic? When was the last time you witnessed a joyful dance to tribal music during the Gospel Acclamation?

Have you ever attended a Catholic Mass celebrated totally in Hebrew or Arabic, in which you hear the words "Elohim" or "Allah" for God? Chances are, many of us would answer "no" or "never" to these questions. Unless we've travelled around the world and have sought to experience Catholic liturgy in a different vernacular or rite, the **global diversity** of the Catholic Church could be lost on us.

Let's not forget that the word

catholic comes from the Greek word 'katholikos' which means **universal**. Our Church is not strictly local, regional, or national... it is UNIVERSAL. The universal Church is rooted in a variety of cultures and takes on different external expressions. This is how the Catholicity of our Church is shown forth. Our American taste of Western Catholicism is but a small drop in a massive ocean filled

with amazingly unique customs & traditions that go far beyond what we typically think of as Catholic. (Take for example, the Lunar New Year Mass -- a mainly Chinese liturgical celebration -- which might raise some eyebrows due to the inclusion of the traditional lion dance and fireworks.)

St. Cyril of Jerusalem may not have been thinking about Chinese or Vietnamese culture in particular, but he defined the essence of catholicity (in 350 CE) when he said, "The Church is called "catholic" because it extends over the whole world, from end to end of the earth..."Its catholicity implies a welcome to "every race of men," "governors and governed, learned and unlearned."

So, let us pray with music! It

is a sung conversation with God that draws us closer to Him, thereby connecting us to the divine and to each other. "Each other" means not just our friends and family sitting

in the pews with us but also our brothers and sisters in Christ from all corners of the globe, who profess our same creed but live it out in their own unique and beautiful ways. We hope you find beauty in the harmony, the tune, and the words of every song/hymn you'll hear.

Catholic Charities' New Hope Apartments Program

Fighting Homelessness, One Family at a Time

Many of us feel grateful to have a home, safe, warm and dry to return to each day. We may also feel compassion for the homeless people we see or hear about.

Catholic Charities' New Hope Apartments program ("New Hope") offers a way to channel

your concern to provide permanent housing and selfsufficiency for struggling families.

New Hope helps move homeless families out of distress and into self-sufficiency. Catholic Charities locates apartments, assists in securing a lease and then pays the rent for the family until that family can take over more of the cost.

The lease is between the landlord and the New Hope client to facilitate a seamless transition once they exit the program. This helps the client develop good credit history. Caseworks assist the family in finding employment, education opportunities and childcare, in saving money and budgeting wisely, and working toward the day the family can manage all its expenses on its own.

This comprehensive rehabilitative program generally provides support for one year, but in certain circumstances, support may extend for up to two years as the family makes this transition.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish ("OLPH") became involved with New Hope in 2004 in partnership with The Society of St. Vincent DePaul of St. Catherine Labouré Parish in Glenview ("St. Catherine") and St. Philip the Apostle Parish in Northfield. OLPH, St. Catherine and Catholic Charities have continued their partnership sponsoring four families at a time.

Members of our faith communities have helped to support and extend the reach of this wonderful program with generous funding for the Program and giving holiday gift cards to the four families. All families remain anonymous to the sponsoring parishes.

Donors are able to develop caring connections with our four families as the families' caseworker provides quarterly updates which are shared with supporters via email.



These updates provide information on holiday gift card initiatives for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. A gift card donation in any amount helps.

In the 18 years of this program, OLPH and St. Catherine have managed to help homeless

families move from desperate situations, living in cars or living in homeless shelters to living in homes, thriving and self-sufficient with stability and security.

New Hope is not a band-aid program. It not only helps the parent(s) in the family, but also profoundly impacts their children by giving them a stable home in a safe community. Right now, we have 3 families in the program that will be exiting the New Hope Program and moving on to self-sufficiency.

Code names are used to protect our families' privacy.

"Ninera" is a single mother with a 2-year-old daughter

"Caregiver" is a single mother with 5 children, 3 of whom live with her. She is employed as a resident aid.

"Promise" is a single mother with four children who was formerly homeless.

Our fourth family, "Fatherhood" is led by a single father with 9 children, 4 of whom live with him. One of these children requires significant care for medical issues. The father is working on securing a job and establishing savings. With assistance for several coming months, this family should be able to maintain a stable housing situation and manage on their own.

With your support, we can help more families transition out of homelessness and into independence, changing family members' paths in life forever.






