"Turn toward the Light of Christ"

Every year, Lent comes upon us in the dead of winter and will lead us to the birth of new life, not only in the world of nature but spiritually. Our Lenten Mission will be on Saturday, March 25, from 9:00am until noon, continuing our reflection on how light can turn us to the Lord. This reflection will be from the perspective of artists. How does light impact their spiritual journey as it is expressed in their artwork? We are so blessed here at OLPH. We don't have to go far to hear this perspective from the artists in our midst. **Terry Luc** our Communications Director is also an accomplished artist. **Rob Orr** does more than video tape events, he is a highly regarded documentarian. **Russell Stern** is a highly regarded pianist and composer. **Margie Andre** is a writer. There will be an opportunity to get a sense of their vision and then to engage their perspectives and to see how we all in our own way seek to "turn toward the light".

Creation Care Ministry

OLPH and the Creation Care Ministry Host "The Letter—A Message for Our Earth"



On February 1, 2023, at the request of the Archdiocese Care for Creation Ministry, OLPH and our Creation Care Ministry hosted the movie "The Letter—A Message for Our Earth." In 2015, Pope Francis wrote Laudato Si' (The Letter); an encyclical letter about the environmental crisis to every single person in the world.

This documentary tells us about four voices that have gone unheard in global conversations about climate change and its environmental and human impact and their unprecedented dialogue with the Pope.

Hailing from Senegal, the Amazon, India, and Hawai'i, people from those areas bring perspective on their situations as representatives of the poor, the indigenous, the youth, and wildlife into a conversation with Pope Francis himself.

This documentary first provides a perspective on the circumstances they find themselves facing every day at home and then follows their journeys to Rome and the extraordinary experiences that took place there, and is packed with powerfully moving personal stories alongside the latest information about the planetary crisis and the toll it's taking on nature and people.

"The Letter" was viewed in McDonnell Hall and 18 of our parishioners and others attended. **Fr. Jim Barrett** started the evening with a prayer. 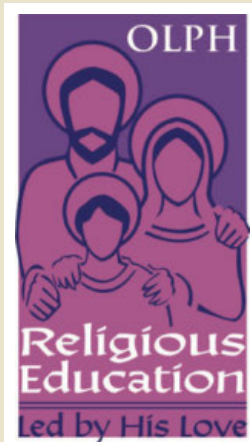

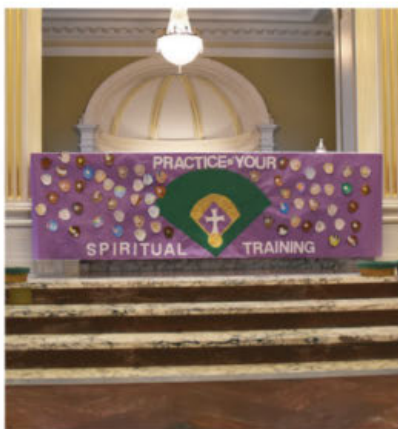

Confession, also known as Reconciliation or Penance, puts us face to face with the mercy and forgiveness of Christ. Each Saturday afternoon, a priest is available in church to hear confessions.

Fasting

The Church requires all those between 18 and 59 years of age to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. All Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent.

Almsgiving
