seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

"Lord it is good we are here."

Our liturgy this weekend brings us the Mount of the Transfiguration. The place where Jesus reveals his transfigured self with Moses and Elijah to the apostles. Peter is overwhelmed by the experience and is overwhelmed with a sense of gratitude. He proclaims, "it is good that we are here!" It is indeed good that we are here at this time in our life.

Whenever we encounter the Lord our immediate response like Peter is one of gratitude. One of the graces of the Lenten Journey is the possibility of many encounters with the Lord. While they may not be as extraordinary as the Transfiguration, they can be filled with the power of healing, new life and insight.

Lent invites us to go beneath the surface of life to encounter the deeper realities of who we are and who we want to become. "Turn toward the light of Christ" is our Lenten theme. Where must I turn away from darkness and turn toward the light in my Lenten journey? Peter and the other apostles were profoundly affected by this encounter with the glorified Christ. The power of Jesus Christ can transform our lives. His power transcends the grip of sin in our lives or the anxieties that can be the source of so much stress.

I welcome Lisa Fortini-Campbell who is returning to OLPH for a reflection this Sunday on our parish theme "Turn toward the light of Christ". The gathering begins at 3:00pm and will conclude if you like by attending the 5:00pm Mass. She always leads us in a rich conversation.

I just finished reading John T. McGreevey's book, "Catholicism". It is a remarkable overview of the global history that has shaped the Catholic Church from the French Revolution to the election of Pope Francis. The book really helps to put into a larger context the challenges we face as a Church today.

When you move into the global challenges the Church has faced over the last 21/2 centuries, it makes me wonder how have we survived. Many of us are so shaped by a European perspective we fail to appreciate the challenges

and aspirations of Africa, Asia and Central and South America in forming the Church we experience today.

We can take for granted the many political and cultural forces that have been placed before the church to urgently reexamine its mission and its voice in the world. We can feel the challenges today are unprecedented in their threat to the future of the Church, but in some cases pale in comparison to the overt persecution of the Church, the imprisonment of priests and religious, the plundering of Church property that took place as a result of revolutions, the anticlericalism that prevailed and the attempts to destroy the Church. In each struggle, the Church has had to reassess its mission and purpose. The church from the Counter Reformation on has revealed its deeper wellspring of strength in facing these many challenges, many of which were self-inflicted as the result of corruption, greed and malfeasance.

We now live at another moment of inflection. As we face the growing secularization of our culture and the corruption and betrayal by some in the Church, we must move forward with a new commitment to purify the structures of our Church and renew ourselves in the process of evangelization. Getting back to the proclamation of the Good News in an effective and credible manner is essential.

One must start somewhere. Here in the Archdiocese we have been going through the Renew My Church Process to better assess how we can posture ourselves to be in a stronger more effective place. How can we better respond to the reality of the Church of today and tomorrow and let go of the enormous resources it has taken to maintain the Church of yesterday? An extraordinary process of transformation has been evolving with an unprecedented number of parish mergers, closures and structural collaboration.

The Pandemic has accelerated the urgency of getting more insight into the changing needs and challenges facing the Church today.

All of us are being invited to participate in a process of better understanding what is going on. Last week we began inviting as many people as possible to participate in a survey that will gather concerns people have about

their parishes and the larger church. Information as to how to access the survey is in the Bulletin. You can participate online or fill out a hard copy. Please consider participating! We need to hear from you! How do we better engage young people? How do we heal those who have been hurt or disenfranchised? How do we more effectively proclaim a Gospel of hope and mercy?

No survey will solve anything, but it can lead to a deeper insight into what is happening. Where are people feeling connected, where they are feeling alienated? The more who participate the more accurate the data will reflect the issues in our midst.

I am grateful to **Mark Cullum**, **Sarah Carsten** and the PPC for last week's Ministry Appreciation celebration. It was terrific.





We have an advertising opportunity for signage in the OLPH Playdium gym. This is a great opportunity for a family or a business to be the Scoreboard Sponsor and have great visibility within the parish.

Background:

There are two (2) beautiful scoreboards in the Playdium gym. One is in the Southwest (SW) corner and the other is in the Northeast (NE) corner. The Southwest scoreboard is slightly larger and is most likely viewed more often than the Northeast board. This is due to its location across from the bleachers that are used most frequently. The scoreboards were built with a rectangular area across the bottom for placement of a sign.

The Playdium has been seen a tremendous increase in usage in recent years and is back in full swing post-COVID. This increase is related to our mandate to maximize the use of the Playdium for the benefit of all members of the parish community.


