

seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

"Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out."

As we continue our Lenten journey, we deepen our desire to know who we are and how we can become a more authentic disciple. I had a spiritual director who used the image of an onion as an example of our Lenten journey. Each day of this season of grace we peel away another layer as we draw closer to the heart of who we are and who we hope to become.

The more we are able to "turn to the light of Christ", the more we can sense the power and grace of the Lenten pilgrimage.

The scriptures this weekend speak to the inexhaustible power of God's gifts of grace, hope and resilience. Moses would see the power of God's ability to quench our thirst as he struck the rock in Horeb. In Paul's Letter to the Romans, he reminds us that Christ died for us even though we are sinners. In the remarkable encounter of the woman at the well, we are invited to see the power of the water of baptism, calling us to new life, to never thirst again for mercy, redemption and love.

Lent draws us in a way to a spiritual desert. Stripped of the trappings of noise, temptation and selfishness, we see surrounding us the powerful reality of God's hope. We can't help but get discouraged by the darkness that surrounds us. But just as the daylight grows each day so do signs of God's promise of hope inspire us.

This Lent, the kids in the school are supporting through their almsgiving the school of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Puerto Rico. This parish ministers to some of the poorest and has been so damaged by a series of natural disasters. I had a wonderful time this week sharing with them my experiences visiting this parish and how grateful they were for last year's support and looking forward to this coming year's support. I hope we can deepen our relationship between OLPH Glenview and OLPH Cuyagas, Puerto Rico.

I am also thrilled with the support **Tom Hart** and Sr. Paulanne's Needy Family Fund have had in helping us

sponsor a refugee family from Ukraine. We have been working with Catholic Charities. The family we are helping is a Mom, Dad and two daughters. One of the children has special needs, she is unable to walk or communicate. This little girl was unable to get a proper diagnosis in Ukraine. Tom was able to coordinate an appointment with a neurologist at Lurie's Children's Hospital and hopefully they will have a better sense of a direction to take. The family is overwhelmed with the support and concern they have received. They were desperate to get out of Ukraine because of the challenges of attending to their daughter's needs in the midst of a war. I can't help but be inspired by Paul's message from the second reading today,

"Hope does not disappoint." We have been able to secure a used car and the dad has a very good job prospect. Tom Hart and the circle of parishioners he has been working with are making such a difference.

What a blessing to have **Paul Kanzer** back at the piano in music ministry. Paul has been recovering from some serious health issues but is in great form and looks terrific. Welcome back Paul!

Roundball never disappoints. Another tournament of heart stopping action. The tournament concludes with the Championship games this Saturday. The teams have been terrific. I am especially grateful to the legion of coaches, most of them are high school alumni of our school. Thanks also to the Men's Club for all they do to make this happen. Training for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Sick

Through the Ministry of Care, we are able to keep long-time parishioners of OLPH connected and active in our faith community.

The work of the Ministry of Care is open to all members of our parish community, and a basic training course for new Ministers of Care will take place in Hickey Hall at OLPH on two successive Saturday mornings, April 15 and 22. Both sessions will focus on various aspects of the Ministry of Care; however, the unifying thread woven through all is a commitment to helping you develop the skills and confidence needed to be a source of comfort to those who are sick, elderly or homebound.

These sessions will be facilitated by **Rick Nash** and **Jim Vlazny**, Coordinators of the Ministry of Care at OLPH. Completion of this course qualifies you to receive the Archdiocesan mandate to bring Communion to the sick, homebound and hospitalized of our parish.

Creation Care Ministry

Composting is one small action which OLPH Parishioners can take to reduce waste!



The land itself must be given a rest and not abused. - Leviticus 25:1-7

We all know about the benefits of recycling, but why compost? 268 million tons of waste were generated in the US in 2017. Of typical municipal garbage, 50% is compostable and 28% of waste is compostable food waste; yet only 4% was actually composted. Source: www.epa.gov

In this Lenten season, composting is one small action that is positive and a meaningful way to care for God's Creation!

What Is Composting?

Composting is the natural process of recycling organic matter, such as leaves and food scraps, into a valuable fertilizer that can enrich soil and plants. Anything that grows decomposes eventually; composting simply speeds up the process by providing an ideal environment for bacteria, fungi, and other decomposing organisms (such as worms, sowbugs, and nematodes) to do their work. The resulting decomposed matter, which often ends up looking like fertile garden soil, is called compost. Fondly referred to by farmers as "black gold," compost is rich in nutrients and can be used for gardening, horticulture, and agriculture.

We have an advertising opportunity for signage in the OLPH Playdium gym. This is a great opportunity for a family or a business to be the Scoreboard Sponsor and have great visibility within the parish.

Background:

There are two (2) beautiful scoreboards in the Playdium gym. One is in the Southwest (SW) corner and the other is in the Northeast (NE) corner. The Southwest scoreboard is slightly larger and is most likely viewed more often than the Northeast board. This is due to its location across from the bleachers that are used most frequently. The scoreboards were built with a rectangular area across the bottom for placement of a sign.

The Playdium has been seen a tremendous increase in usage in recent years and is back in full swing post-COVID. This increase is related to our mandate to maximize the use of the Playdium for the benefit of all members of the parish community.


Proposal Details: The Scoreboards


