"With that their eyes were open, and they recognized him."

Dear Parishioners,

My mother had an expression, "if your head wasn't attached, you'd lose it!" Sometimes the most obvious things go unnoticed, unrecognized, unappreciated. We have all had the experience of completely missing the point, the other person's feelings, the logical conclusion.

How could I have missed that? What was I thinking? I do not

know why I said that? Stuff gets by us, we jumped to a conclusion. We just did not realize what was going on.

The Easter story is filled with much of this. How could the two disciples be walking along the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus and not realize that Jesus was walking with them. How could they have been prevented from recognizing him?

We can easily be blinded to that which is most obvious. Our spiritual journey is a lifelong journey. We get to a place of relative comfort and in an instant things can change, our health diminishes, a family crisis happens, we lose our job.

Easter faith is grounded in hope. Easter faith invites us to resilience. Easter faith assures us. We wonder where the Lord at certain moments was and when we look back at it, we realize that the Lord was at our side. His love was revealed to us by the kindness of others. The power of getting through things can often be traced to the power of Christ at work in our lives.

April has been designated as Child Abuse Prevention Month. Each year this observance invites us to double down on efforts to maintain safe environments for our children.

The human condition, being what it is, demands constant vigilance regarding the safety of children.

Recently the Attorney General of Maryland presented a report on the record of the Archdiocese of Baltimore regarding the sexual abuse by clergy and religious. It is another chapter in this tragic and devastating reality of children being abused by a person they trusted and often the disregard of Church authorities to deal with it. The Archdiocese of Baltimore was recognized for the efforts it has undertaken to address its commitment to the safety of children but there is no escaping the suffering and pain that has occurred. This whole issue

has opened our eyes as a society to the reality of the abuse of children. Many suffer much of their adult life with the implications of being sexually, physically, or emotionally abused. Many families have struggled with the reality of abuse within their own family.

At some point in the coming weeks the Attorney General of the State of Illinois will be releasing a report reviewing the record of the six dioceses here in the State of Illinois. It will also be a moment of encountering again the tragedy of the abuse of children and the reckless manner these incidents were managed.

The Archdiocese of Chicago has taken many steps to provide safe environments in our parishes. I cannot do much about what others do but I am committed to doing everything possible to enforce the procedures to keep young people safe here in the parish. With the size of this parish and the number of adults that significantly interact with children this is no easy task. We must be in conformity, and this requires a commitment from all of us to participate. I am grateful to the legion of parents, coaches, scout leaders, teachers, clergy, and others who participate in this process of special training on this issue and to participate in the required background checks. I am especially grateful to **Karen Daniels, Angela Romero, Erin Bretts** and **Lori Parsek** who coordinate our efforts here at OL.

This issue is an opportunity to proclaim that out of sin and evil the light of the Risen Christ will always prevail. I pray every day for the healing of those who were abused in any way as a child, I pray in gratitude for the ever-growing community of those committed to the safety of our children.

I was delighted to attend the annual Spaghetti Dinner hosted by Fr. John Dussman Council of the Knights of Columbus. The Grand Knight, **John O'Malley** presented us with a check of \$1000 to support our Religious Education and Youth Ministry programs. I am most grateful for this gift and the many efforts of our Fr. Dussman Council.

Thanks again for your generous support of our Easter Appeal. Your many sacrifices make such a difference.

This Sunday we rejoice in the bestowal of the Sacrament of Confirmation by **Bishop Perry** on our eighth grade Religious Education Candidates. What an impressive group of young people. They are a great credit to their parents.

Rabbi Evan Moffic

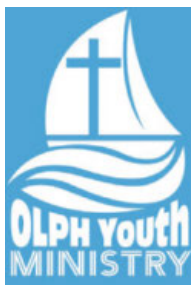
