Dear Parishioners, "Do not be afraid!"

This weekend's scriptures challenge us not to be afraid. One of Jesus' most common invitations to us was not to be afraid.

Fear can be one of the more toxic forces we must contend with. There are many degrees of what the source of our fears might be

from the mundane to the profound. We can be afraid of being stopped by a train on Glenview Road to the fear of waiting for the results of a biopsy. We can be debilitated by the fear of the unknown, fears related to our concerns for a struggling family member. We can be overwhelmed by financial fears and fears about our future, the fear of success, the fear of flying, the fear of falling, or the fear of dying.

Jesus does not dismiss the reality of fear, but he seeks to assure us with power of his love and his peace. He wants to give us confidence to move forward in life. We know the power that can come from overcoming fear or learning to live with things we cannot control. We can find ourselves needing the strength to endure, persevere or to be resilient. Reflecting on God's Word and receiving the Eucharist regularly can be the source of prevailing against the impact of fearful or negative thinking. We recently were reminded of the power of the Holy Spirit that liberated the frightened disciples in the Upper Room. We probably could name those forces of fear that lock us in our own "upper rooms".

I have a niece who is a physical therapist, and she often talks about the privilege of accompanying a patient who overcomes the fear of walking, climbing stairs or getting out of bed in their process of recovering from an accident or a fall. It is the courage it takes to change directions in life as a result of a loss of a job or a failed relationship. Leaving the upper room and reentering life is an act of courage, the willingness to leave fear behind and move forward.

The Church is an institution that often struggles with the fear of change. Despite how obvious the need for change is, listening and moving forward is never easy. In a recent address given by **Pope Francis** he challenged the Church not to be afraid of the world. We must be an engaged community, one not afraid of encountering the issues and people of the here and now. One of the fears that Pope has addressed is Islamophobia. Many of the Pope's trips have been to countries where Christians are in the minority and Islam is the majority. He seeks these occasions to build bridges of understanding and appreciation.

The Church here in Chicago has been engaged in a process called Renew My Church. This process has been challenging us to face the realities of the Church of today and tomorrow and not be beholden to the Church of yesterday. We have been living off the vision of Cardinal Mundelein and the Church of the 1930's and 1940's. Chicago was inundated with European immigrants, it was a time of the prolific growth of Catholic parishes, schools, hospitals, seminaries and other institutions. It became clear that the Church of 2023 cannot sustain all these institutions as a result of demographic, ethnic and cultural changes. It has been tough and painful, but I am confident that we are positioning ourselves for the rebirth of a vital and energetic Catholic community. Over the past few years, 130 parishes have been merged, closed or reorganized.

We now enter the next phase of this process called "Building the New Reality". This will be even more challenging. How does the Church of 2023 confront the forces of declining Church attendance and secularization. How do we evangelize in a world so skeptical of religious influence?

To begin with we need to have a better grasp of listening to the needs and passions of our people. The Pope has challenged us to not be afraid. What does an engaged church look like?


Last winter we were all invited to participate in a survey to get a clearer sense of what is going on. Through a grant the Archdiocese was able to employ the Catholic Leadership Institute to design and implement a comprehensive survey of Catholics in the Archdiocese. Surveys don't answer every question or reveal every best response, but they can give a glimpse, a snapshot into what is stirring in the hearts of our parishioners.

This week the data gathered from the survey has been released. You will be hearing about it many times in the coming weeks and months. It will present us with a picture

of our parish and the larger diocese in terms of our blessings and challenges we will need to better understand. I and a team of parishioners will begin to study the data and learn how best to communicate the results to you.

For starters I am grateful for the tremendous participation rate in the survey. We were in the top five parishes of congregations with over 1500 families with a response rate of 43%. This is extraordinary and will give us great confidence in the results and directions the survey suggests. Stay tuned for many more reports on the findings.

The summer projects are moving forward, The Playdium is now a full week into construction that will replace the roof, the mechanicals and a host of other improvements.
