

seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

"Observe what is right, do what is just."

Each week as we ponder the Word of God, we can receive invitations and challenges that can lead us to a better way of living out our discipleship.

One of the most challenging areas of theology is the area of moral ethics. There was a time when moral questions seemed easier to navigate. The line between good

and evil, right and wrong was clearer. Perhaps the issues had a black and white clarity. One might say today we encounter a lot more grey in the moral choice dilemma.

I suppose if the truth were told, moral decision making would always have a complexity to it that is not a new phenomenon. We live in a time of rapid change, new psychological insights into human behavior and new technologies that have had a tremendous impact on how we evaluate the world we live in. I often worry about young people who can't help but be influenced by social media. The lifestyles, values and moral challenges are beyond my imagination when I think about my own adolescence.

There is still quite an afterglow in the Universal Church as the impact of World Youth Day in Lisbon is processed. I was so grateful that **Deacon Christopher Weiland** was able to lead a group of young people to this global experience. I hope and pray that in three years we could send a delegation of our teens to Seoul Korea for the next World Youth Day.

I have been watching some of the videos of the presentations and conversations that young people had with **Pope Francis** and many of the bishops that led sessions on a variety of topics, many of them were moral in nature.

Rather than just have a bishop give a lecture on a given topic, The sessions began with powerful reflections and questions from young people that set the stage for the presenter to enter a process of dialogue. The bishops and the Pope heard moving reflections from young people coping with human trafficking, war, gang violence, sexual identity issues and poverty.

The sessions where wonderful to watch because the conversation led to a place of recognizing God's mercy and God's hope reveled in the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. I was so impressed with the power of listening to one another's experiences before charging in with a check list of moral platitudes. These young people are too smart and savvy for that. They want to do what is right,

they just yearn for guidance on how to sort through the complex world that they encounter.

The words from Isaiah this weekend are so insightful, "observe what is right, do what is just". If we all embraced this moral vision, how would it change our attitudes about migrants and refugees, poverty and violence in our cities, the environment and issues of inclusion. Before jumping to moral conclusions, have we listened, have we tried to put ourselves in this other person's' shoes. Have we undertaken a process of educating ourselves and resist that latest sound bite we heard on the internet of tv?

When I say there seems to be much more grey when it comes to moral reasoning, I am not implying that there is confusion on Church teaching or relativism in which there are no overreaching moral imperatives. What I am considering is the challenge of connecting our moral values with a complex world. It takes time to "observe what is right and to act justly".

As we embark on a new program year, connecting dots, listening more effectively to one another, avoiding blanket judgements without engaging the person involved would be so helpful. So many people carry the heavy wound of feeling marginalized or judged by others who never took the time to engage in their circumstances.

The dreaded phrase, "back to school" is upon us. Our teachers had a week of meetings, our facilities have gone through a major upgrade and stuff is beginning to happen after the summer break. As we gradually return to the usual patterns of parish life may the coming months be filled with graces and blessings.

We are still in need of catechists for Religious Education. If you're interested, please call our new **DRE Erin Bretts** for information. This can be such a rewarding ministry.

Thank you for your patience regarding the carpet installation. For the most part the floor under the carpet was in better shape than the installers anticipated.

As I was walking around the campus this week reviewing all the summer projects, I was so impressed with the work of our facilities director, **Mike Hrvojevic**, and his outstanding maintenance staff. All year they keep our campus in great condition and over the summer clean the place from top to bottom and complete a check list a mile long of repairs and upgrades. Thanks guys! 
Knights of Columbus





Summer Renovation Update

Church Carpeting Removal and New Installation

We are progressing with the new capret installation in the church. Here are the key dates with comments:

- Aug. 19 Aug. 20 Weekend Masses. Current plan is for these Masses to be held in the Church according to our normal schedule. We should be able to livestream the Sunday 9:00am Mass. However, if there are any delays or problems with the installation, we will need to adjust. Watch for the Daily eblasts for any updates.
- Aug. 21 Aug. 25 Week 2 carpet installation. The second week's work will include Lady Chapel, stairs to the choir loft, and south vestibule. The Church should be available for weekday Masses. However, we will make a decision regarding where these Masses will be held, depending on the level of dust, noise, etc., experienced in the first week. If needed, we will move these weekday Masses to McDonnell Hall up through Thursday, Aug. 24. Again there will be no livestreaming of the weekday Masses.

Music Ministry

Instrumentalists and Singers of All Ages Needed

Anytime is a great time to join one of the choirs and help continue to build the Music Ministry at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church. This is a wonderful opportunity to serve God and the Parish through sharing your gifts of music and song. And it promises to be a lot of fun as well!



The following groups are all directed by our music director, **Russell Stern**. New members are always welcome and encouraged to join throughout the year.

The Adult Festival Choir

- We sing at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesday evenings from 7:30-9:00pm in the church. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 12.

The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- Sings at the 10:30 AM Mass throughout the year.
- All singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15pm in the music office. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 12.
- · Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month either at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass or the Sunday 10:30am Mass on Sunday (depending on the teen's availability), and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students 7th grade through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearses in the church periodically on Saturdays at 4:15pm or Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). Our first rehearsal will be on Sept. 23 in the church.

The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, usually at the 9:00 or 10:30am Mass from October through Mothers Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesdays, starting, Sept. 19, from 5:45-6:30pm.

Cantors

• Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors sings periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.




