

seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...



Dear Parishioners,

"May you discern what is the will of God!"

This week's letter from St Paul invites us into a process of discernment. In many ways, discernment is at the heart of our spiritual journey. Discernment requires a process of listening that leads to awareness, understanding and action.

Fr. Jerry Boland, Pastor Recently, I shared some reflections

from Pope Francis' talks and reflections on the upcoming Synod of Bishops. He has called us over and over to recall the foundation of the synodal process, discerning the Holy Spirit through a thoughtful process of listening.

Listening is more complicated than we think. How much conflict occurs because we jump to conclusions without listening? One of the goals of marriage counseling can be taking the time to listen before assuming what the other is saying or deciding. This is hard work because we live in a culture where our feelings or experiences are summarily judged before having even finished making our point.

In that column, I wrote about the Pope's challenge to us to be a more listening church, I was accosted by someone who thought I was pro-abortion. How on earth could someone have drawn that conclusion? I made no reference to abortion, but the person assumed that by encouraging people to listen to another person's experience that there was no moral accountability. Somehow listening to another's experience negates moral norms. That was not the point. It was an experience for me about the challenges that lie ahead.

Pope Francis recently shared some of his concerns about the Church in America that belies the experience I shared. He finds some in the church in this country possessing a "very strong reactionary attitude" that makes dialog so difficult. An attitude that keeps looking backward instead of forward. The Holy Father used the example of slavery. There was a time when many American bishops supported the practice of slavery in the 17th and 18th century. Well, over time and the collective reality of experience and discernment, the Church came to believe in the moral abhorrence of slavery. Through listening and the discernment of the Holy Spirit, hearts were changed and moral leadership became transformative in this country.

I enjoyed preparing this week for the "Coffee and Conversation on the Rectory Porch" topic, the Synod and synodality. The readings this week provide so much food for thought, especially St. Paul's letter. The Church must do a lot more listening. This requires us to assess who are the voices that are not at the table. Whose voices or experiences are not being heard? I am aware that just around a table of OLPH parishioners, there would be a wide perspective on what are the most pressing concerns facing the Church. Try such a gathering of Catholics around the Archdiocese, the USA, the continent of North America, the Universal Church! Yet, the Holy Spirit prevails over geography, culture, and language. My dire prayer these days, "Come Holy Spirit and renew the face of the earth". Help us to listen! Help us be more aware, more understanding and willing to take the action that results from conversion.

We have some extraordinary opportunities this Fall to enhance your process of spiritual discernment. We will soon begin an 8-week scripture study program entitled "Mary, a biblical walk with the Virgin Mary". I have reviewed the materials and they are excellent. Please consider joining many of your fellow parishioners on this journey to better appreciate the biblical foundation of the Blessed Mother's place in our faith.

Another fantastic offering this Fall is the next series in our Hearts Afire program. Beginning in October a 30-day program will begin. It is called "The Way" and is based on "The Story of a Soul" written by St. Therese of Lisieux.

Both programs will enhance this year's Eucharistic Revival efforts.

Plans are in full motion for next week's annual block party. It really is the symbolic beginning of the new year of parish life. Help me continue my series of rain free evenings! We will be honoring in a special way the founder of the Block Party and former Men's Club president, **Bill Riordan**.

Because of the Block Party Outdoor Mass, there will be no 9:30am Mass on Sunday that weekend.

Last weekend's Youth Ministry event was awesome. Thank you to **Zoe Sundstrom** and her volunteers, The Mass, the food, the games and the conversation were terrific. I am so excited about the direction Youth Ministry is going. I really appreciated the number of parents that were there, as well.

I am pleased to announce that we are once again serving as a parish in the Tolton Teaching Parish Program of Mundelein Seminary. We will have 2 seminarians from the Diocese of Grand Rapids. You will remember **Charlie Leidel** and he will be joined by **Andrew Whipple**. I am delighted that they will be with us. **Tom and Jacquie O'Brien** chair our Teaching Parish Committee. Please keep in your prayers our parish seminarian, **Luke Lato**, who is entering Mundelein Seminary.

May God bless us as we discern His will!



Stewardship Report


To all parishioners:

The first two months of our fiscal year are complete! The results of Collections for the two months are listed below. As a Parish Community, you have contributed \$349,564 towards Sunday and Holyday collections from July 1 to August 31, 2023.

You can see from the charts below that we are trailing in actual collections as compared to the two months ended

August 31, 2022 and we are also trailing budget for the current year. Collections in the summer months are traditionally lower than other months, but you can help OLPH by "bridging the gap" if you can. Your generosity is always greatly appreciated!

Please watch for a mailing from OLPH entitled "BRIDGE THE GAP", a campaign, which, with your help, will enable us to do just that. As indicated




above, summer months are generally low in collections; however, we do not want the year to get away from us before it is fully underway. Last year tracked below budget for the entire year.

Our FY24 budget for the general offertory collection, which includes Christmas and Easter, is \$3.2 million. We need to reach this goal to make certain we can cover continued

increasing costs, mainly in salaries and benefits (8%) and planned maintenance expenses (16%). These areas are vital to the life of the parish. Direct support to the School and Religious Education programs is also provided out of the general offertory collection. Our First Fruits program benefits from 6% of the annual collection, as well.

Instrumentalists and Singers of All Ages Needed

The following groups are all directed by our music director, **Russell Stern**. New members are always welcome and encouraged to join throughout the year.

The Adult Festival Choir

- Sings at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses on Tuesday evenings from 7:30-9:00pm in the church. First rehearsal: Sept. 12.

The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- · Sings at the 10:30am Mass Sundays throughout the year.
- Singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15pm in the music office. First rehearsal: Sept. 12.
- · Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.



The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

• Sings approximately once a month either at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass or the Sunday 10:30am Mass (depending on the teen's availability), and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.

- Students 7th grade through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearses in the church periodically on Saturdays at 4:15pm or Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). First rehearsal:Sept. 23.

The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, usually at the 9:00 or 10:30am Mass from October through Mothers Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church Tuesdays, beginning Sept. 19, from 5:45-6:30pm.

Cantors

 Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors sings periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.


