Dear Parishioners,

"Where two or three are gathered, I am in their midst."

The readings for this weekend could not be better as we celebrate our annual Block Party this Saturday. We are called to live in a community that is founded on the commandment, "love one another".

I always feel that the Block Party is the official beginning of the new parish year. School and Religious Education are open, parish programs are launching and there is a universal feeling that we are all back and ready to begin anew.

Beginnings are important! The prospect of beginning anew invites us to consider participating in parish life in new ways. We are challenged to leave our comfort zone and try new things, make new friends, deepen our spiritual life.

As we begin anew, at the center of all we do is the Eucharist. Participating in the Mass can be the source of our sense of belonging, being connected to one another and ultimately to the Lord himself. As we continue to move further away from the worst of the pandemic, now could be the occasion to reconsider how I am feeling connected to the Eucharist, the Mass. If you haven't been coming, let's start anew! The Mass can be a great way for a family to deepen its bonds. If you live alone, the Mass can get you connected with others. If you feel you are just going through the motions, you might challenge yourself to be a more engaged participant.

I have been in recent months visiting some of the neighborhoods in the parish and wherever I go I am deeply moved by the power of belonging and being a part of OLPH. We are so blessed because it is not a given that a parish engenders that kind of energy.

I know it has become somewhat a cliché, but we are "better together". It is a feeling I get at the Block Party, Roundball, Trunk or Treat, or the Men's Spirituality Group just to mention a few! It all makes it so much more meaningful when the source of this belonging is the Eucharist.

As a presider, I have the unique and privileged vantage point of looking out at you, your families, our friends and neighbors. As I enter my 10th year as your pastor, I see the faces of folks I have celebrated great moments, walked painful and devastating moments, we have

grown together as disciples searching for meaning in our lives and availing ourselves of God's grace.

I am always humbled by what folks bring into the church on a given weekend, the joys, the struggles, the anxieties and the hopes. As we hear so poignantly in the passage from Matthew this morning, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them". There is so much energy in the air as we approach the proclamation of God's Word and come to the Altar of the Eucharist.

Please always feel welcomed and called to the Eucharistic celebration. We all have been the recipient of the Lord in our midst. As we continue this journey of faith, let us all be even more open to inviting the Lord into our midst. If there is something keeping you away, let's talk. If I or anyone in the past has hurt you or offended you, let's reconcile. If you have challenges getting back into the groove of more regular participation you are not alone. I can't imagine the challenges many of you face with unrelenting schedules and so many claims on your time. Sitting down, establishing priorities and coming to a sense of new directions can lead to a healthier, more connected life with the Lord. There is nothing better than an hour a week in the Lord's House hearing his encouraging Word and being fed with his Body and Blood. There is a powerful awareness that I am not alone as I look at the faces of those around me at worship.

Hope to see you at the Mass on the Rectory lawn Saturday evening. Special Thanks to the Men's Club for an incredible effort to make this gathering one of the best of the year.

OLPH "*Bring Back the Bells*" and Clock Tower Project

6:30pm Monday, Sept. 18

Please join us on Monday evening, Sept. 18, at 6:30pm, in McDonnell Hall, for a presentation by The Verdin Company. This presentation will provide information on the systems proposed for use in our upcoming capital project relating to the OLPH Bring Back the Bells project.

The new Schulmerich g5 Celebration Electronic Carillon (our previous bell system from 1982 was also a Schulmerich product) will allow us to, once again, have bells sounding from our church tower, with many different options, sounds and sound combinations available.

We will also have the ability to connect to the organ. We will have options in the setting of multiple schedules, as well as remote access for schedule changes as needed.

The Carillon will be integrated with a proposed new and upgraded digital clock system, manufactured by the Verdin



Company, who provided our current clock system back in 1977. The integration of the clock system with the Carillon will ensure the bells will sound in sync with the time shown in the clock tower.

As part of this upgrade, clock dials, faces and hands will be replaced, and backlighting will be replaced with up-to-date LED lighting. Most maintenance relating to timekeeping, power outages and other technological issues can be accomplished via a master clock controller, which will eliminate trips up to the tower.

In total, we anticipate this project to be priced within a \$95,000 - \$105,000 range.

We are excited to have you attend this presentation, which will also include the ability to listen to some of the many sound options available to us for use in the Carillon set up.

Semarian Education Fund

OLPH supports the educational formation of our archdiocesan seminarians by contributing to the Archdiocesan Seminarian Education collection for their education and formation needs. We do this as part of our parish First Fruits Program, instead of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holyday offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year. This Archdiocesan second collection for our seminarians, taken up in the Archdiocese during the weekend of September 16-17, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.

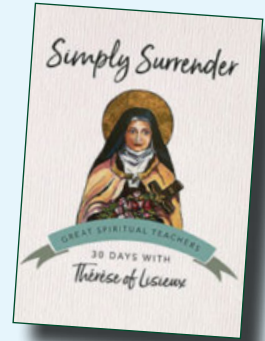

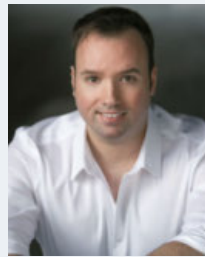
Mark your Calendars: Russell's next concert will be on Sunday, November 19, 2023 at 2:00pm.




