Dear Parishioners,

"How often must I forgive?"

The theme of this week's readings is a meditation on forgiveness. We are challenged to be forgiving in our relationships with one another. Some of the hardest words to say can be, "will you forgive me? Or "I have forgiven you".

There can be few more liberating feelings than to be forgiven. Many people go to their graves with unresolved or unforgiven memories or experiences. These memories can weigh so heavily. The Lord responded to Peter's question with an answer that was sure to overwhelm him. Jesus refers to the number seven which is the biblical number of perfection. We are to forgive not 7 times but 77 times! In the parable that Jesus tells in the gospel he described the master as moved with compassion as he encounters the one who owed him a debt.

Our culture is far from forgiving and compassionate. Each day on the news we hear one story after another of humiliation and shame targeting those who have broken a law or violated some norm. The consequences are often life changing and for many redemption seems not possible. Many who have paid their debt to society never feel forgiven, never feeling they have a second chance.

This is not the way of the Kingdom of God, where the Lord who is merciful, reaches out to us repeatedly with his loving embrace. In our Reconciliation Room in the OLPH church, we have a copy of that famous painting by Rembrandt of the Prodigal Son who is experiencing the lavish forgiveness of his father.

The willingness to be a forgiving and merciful person is a lifelong task. We are constantly encountering situations where we need to be more deliberate in choosing the path of forgiveness. How do parents model forgiveness at home, how does a teacher model forgiveness in a classroom, a priest in a confessional? We need to look beyond the reality of judgement and choose the path of mercy.

Forgiveness does not deny the pain caused by another's choice but chooses not to dwell in the place of resentment, revenge or retaliation. Being forgiven releases the grip of judgement and surrounds one with the sense of a new beginning.

We need to counter the judgementalism that can thrive in the world of religion. How can we expect to be forgiven

if we never practice mercy and compassion in our dealings with another? I hope we all can seek to grow in our desire to be forgiving. There are times I encounter a person in confession who is bereft with the sense of their sinfulness and just can't receive the Lord's mercy and redemption. I see it when someone feels that me, or the Church or the Pope is not more condemning of the world we live in. The notion of the field hospital that **Pope Francis** speaks about is far from their heart.

In this year of the Eucharistic Revival, we will reflect often on the merciful love of Christ witnessed in the celebration of the Eucharist.

OLPH "Bring Back the Bells" and Clock Tower Project

6:30pm Monday, Sept. 18

Please join us on Monday evening, Sept. 18, at 6:30pm, in McDonnell Hall, for a presentation by The Verdin Company. This presentation will provide information on the systems proposed for use in our upcoming capital project relating to the OLPH Bring Back the Bells project.

The new Schulmerich g5 Celebration Electronic Carillon (our previous bell system from 1982 was also a Schulmerich product) will allow us to, once again, have bells sounding from our church tower, with many different options, sounds and sound combinations available.

We will also have the ability to connect to the organ. We will have options in the setting of multiple schedules, as well as remote access for schedule changes as needed.

The Carillon will be integrated with a proposed new and upgraded digital clock system, manufactured by the Verdin



Company, who provided our current clock system back in 1977. The integration of the clock system with the Carillon will ensure the bells will sound in sync with the time shown in the clock tower.

As part of this upgrade, clock dials, faces and hands will be replaced, and backlighting will be replaced with up-to-date LED lighting. Most maintenance relating to timekeeping, power outages and other technological issues can be accomplished via a master clock controller, which will eliminate trips up to the tower.

In total, we anticipate this project to be priced within a \$95,000 - \$105,000 range.

We are excited to have you attend this presentation, which will also include the ability to listen to some of the many sound options available to us for use in the Carillon set up.

Baptismal Preparation Ministry

Baptismal Preparation is required for all couples in our Parish who are having their first baby baptized. Baptism is an entry into the Catholic Community and is as solemn and important as birth itself.

Baptismal classes are usually held the third Thursday of every month at 7:00pm. They are held in the Flavin Room, which is in the lower level of the OLPH Rectory, and usually run about one hour.

Two couples, **Maggie and Mike Wycklendt** and **Sheree and Steve Kodros**, are the Baptismal Preparation Coordinators. The class consists of two themes: "information" (about the Sacrament) and "formation" (raising the child with Catholic values).

"Information" is an overview of the background and history of the sacrament of baptism and explains the value of the sacrament of baptism and the meaning of the sacramental signs: the Pascal candle, the child's candle, water, the white garment, and the anointing of the child with the oils of catechumen and the sacred chrism.

"Formation" suggests ways to raise their children with the Catholic faith. The class encourages them, as parents, to make their Catholic faith a source of strength to their children, and to teach them the value of God's love in their life stressing *"Children Learn What They Live"*.

HELP US "BRIDGE THE GAP"

Our "BRIDGE THE GAP" campaign, with your help, will assist us to get back on track with our fiscal year budget.

It is normal for us to experience a dip in collections during the

slower summer months. However, we do not want the year to get away from us before it is fully underway. Last year tracked below budget for the entire year.

Our FY24 budget for the general offertory collection, which includes Christmas and Easter, is \$3.2 million. We need to reach this goal to make certain we can cover continued increasing costs, mainly in salaries and benefits (8%) and planned maintenance expenses (16%). These areas are vital to the life of the parish. Direct support to the School and Religious Education programs is also provided out of the general offertory collection. Our First Fruits program benefits from 6% of the annual collection, as well.

Seminarian Education Fund

OLPH supports the educational formation of our archdiocesan seminarians by contributing to the Archdiocesan Seminarian Education collection for their education and formation needs. We do this as part of our parish First Fruits Program, instead of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holyday offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year. This Archdiocesan second collection for our seminarians, taken up in the Archdiocese during the weekend of September 16-17, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.

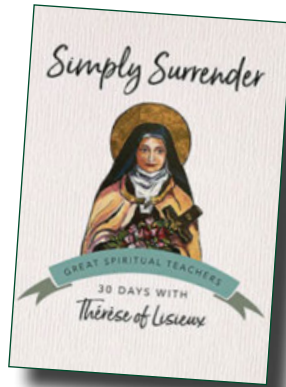

The following groups are all directed by our music director, **Russell Stern**. New members are always welcome and encouraged to join throughout the year.

The Adult Festival Choir

- Sings at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses on Tuesday evenings from 7:30-9:00pm in the church. First rehearsal: Sept. 12.

The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- Sings at the 10:30am Mass Sundays throughout the year.
- Singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15pm in the music office. First rehearsal: Sept. 12.
- Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.



The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass or the Sunday 10:30am Mass (depending on the teen's availability), and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students 7th grade through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearses in the church periodically on Saturdays at 4:15pm or Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). First rehearsal: Sept. 23.

The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, usually at the 9:00 or 10:30am Mass from October through Mothers Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church Tuesdays, beginning Sept. 19, from 5:45-6:30pm.

Cantors

- Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors sings periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.


