Dear Parishioners,

"Seek the Lord while he may be found."

Our spiritual life might be described as a mission to seek the Lord. We all have moments when we experience glimpses of his mercy, his peace, his glory.

At different stages of our life, we are drawn to different aspects of the mystery of Our Lord's

presence. In early adulthood we ponder what direction the Lord hopes our life will follow. We seek the Lord's guidance as we reflect on how I might be a better spouse, a better parent, a more authentic Christian. In seeking the Lord, I hope to build a life that matters, that has a purpose.

The desire to seek the Lord is evidence of a vital spiritual life. The manner of how we seek the Lord is rooted in prayer. Making time for daily reflection, reviewing our day before we go to bed, meditating on sacred scripture, receiving the Eucharist can ensure that we are firmly on the path to seeking the Lord.

The challenge from the scriptures to seek the Lord is not just a personal journey. We also seek the Lord as a community. The opportunity to seek the Lord together is at the basis of the 70+ ministries we have here. From serving in the Sharing Room, to being a Minister of Care, to joining the choir are just a few of the ways we can journey together.

As we continue to study the recent parish survey, we have discovered many challenges that lay ahead in our desire as a parish to "Seek the Lord". We are not immune to the secularization of our culture which diminishes the religious voice. The opportunity the survey so strongly suggests is to expand our commitment to evangelization. On one level we need to re-evangelize the evangelized. To reinvite those who drifted away for whatever reason. I often hear the lament of parents, "none of my adult children practice their faith". "I feel so bad, none of my grandchildren are baptized". How do we avoid judging and explore new and effective ways of inviting? Come join us! We need you! You will love being a part of us!

This desire to "seek the Lord" is also a challenge for the larger universal Church. How faithful and effective are we in proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ? To seek the Lord requires us to listen and deliberate on how the Holy Spirit is guiding us. We must read the "signs of the times" as St. John XXIII said when he convened the

Second Vatican Council. **Pope Francis** has challenged us not to be afraid of the world. We need, as he says, "to look forward and not dwell on what was".

The upcoming Synod of Bishops will be an unprecedented gathering of bishops and lay people to listen to how the Holy Spirit is speaking to the global church. A church that seeks, is a church that listens. We can't be afraid to face the challenges of this age in the life of the Church. We need to honestly address those forces that are keeping the Church from being a more authentic witness of the Lord's mercy and generosity.

I am grateful for the reflections of our seminarians last weekend, **Luke Lato**, **Charlie Leidel** and **Andrew Whipple**. We keep them in our prayers as they continue to seek the Lord as a priest.

Thank you so much for considering the "Bridge the Gap" appeal. We are making great progress in bridging that gap in terms of our offertory collection. Your generosity and stewardship never cease to amaze me. In a few weeks we will begin our reflection on being faithful stewards. Every few years, it is important to reflect on how I am sharing my gifts of time, talent and treasure. The operation and maintenance of our parish mission is essential in our desire to "Seek the Lord".

This past week was a case statement of the many ways we are seeking the Lord, seeing buses drop off our students for school. Religious Ed families coming to class, Scripture Study launching a new semester, a guild looking for ways to feed migrants living in ill prepared shelters, youth ministry meeting and quilts being made for the homeless.

I enjoyed our meeting last week on the new bell system. We have come a long way from someone pulling a rope in a belltower to a digital system with hundreds of features. The marking of the hours with the bells ringing, to the call to worship, to marking the Angelus and seasonal hymns to be rung on feast days will be a daily reminder for the call to prayer in order to better, "Seek the Lord".

When Father Patrick returns, we will be reinstating the 5:00pm Sunday Mass, hopefully by late October, early November.

### **HELD US** "BRIDGE THE GAD"

"BRIDGE THE GAP" campaign, with your help, will assist us to get back on track with our fiscal year budget.

It is normal for us to experience a dip in collections during the

slower summer months. However, we do not want the year to get away from us before it is fully underway. Last year tracked below budget for the entire year.

Our FY24 budget for the general offertory collection, which includes Christmas and Easter, is \$3.2 million. We need to reach this goal to make certain we can cover continued increasing costs, mainly in salaries and benefits (8%) and planned maintenance expenses (16%). These areas are vital to the life of the parish. Direct support to the School and Religious Education programs is also provided out of the general offertory collection. Our First Fruits program benefits from 6% of the annual collection, as well.

### Seminarian Education Fund

OLPH supports the educational formation of our archdiocesan seminarians by contributing to the Archdiocesan Seminarian Education collection for their education and formation needs. We do this as part of our parish First Fruits Program, instead of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holyday offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year. This Archdiocesan second collection for our seminarians, taken up in the Archdiocese during the weekend of September 16-17, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.

## Instrumentalists and Singers of All Ages Needed

Anytime is a great time to join one of the choirs and help continue to build the Music Ministry at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church. This is a wonderful opportunity to

serve God and the Parish through sharing your gifts of music and song. And it promises to be a lot of fun as well!

The following groups are all directed by our music director, **Russell Stern**. New members are always welcome and encouraged to join throughout the year.

#### The Adult Festival Choir

- Sings at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses on Tuesday evenings from 7:30-9:00pm in the church. First rehearsal: Sept. 12.

#### The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- Sings at the 10:30am Mass Sundays throughout the year.
- Singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15pm in the music office. First rehearsal: Sept. 12.
- Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

#### The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass or the Sunday 10:30am Mass (depending on the teen's availability), and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students 7th grade through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearses in the church periodically on Saturdays at 4:15pm or Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). First rehearsal:Sept. 23.

#### The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, usually at the 9:00 or 10:30am Mass from October through Mothers Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church Tuesdays, beginning Sept. 19, from 5:45-6:30pm.

#### **Cantors**

 Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors sings periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.


