Dear Parishioners,

"At the name of Jesus, every knee will bend"

Rome, Italy.

Greetings from your favorite international correspondent. I am writing to you during our parish pilgrimage to Italy. Hard to believe this is my 8th pilgrimage as pastor of OLPH. We are almost 50 strong with an ambitious itinerary.

Our journey begins in Rome. I have come to see Rome more as a verb than a noun. It can be for me more of a way of being than a place. Here antiquity co-exists with modernity. Amid ancient monuments an emerging generation is dreaming of the future and building upon what has been handed down.

There is a palpable buzz in the air regarding the Church. We are entering what may be the most consequential time for the Church since the Second Vatican Council.

This week the Holy Father will create 21 new Cardinals. One of them is a native Chicagoan, **Archbishop Robert Provost OSA** who is currently the head of the Dicastery of Bishops. In keeping with the Pope's vision of a global church who listens to everyone, the Cardinals come from the far reaches of the earth.

This weekend the Pope will convene the Synod of Bishops for three weeks. This is an unprecedented gathering in which several of the delegates are lay people. One of the Vice Presidents of the synod is a religious sister. The synod's agenda has surfaced from the widest consultation on the challenges of being a "listening church". Literally every parish was invited to participate. Despite the pandemic, our parish council submitted our response which was included in a summary of all consultations in the Archdiocese of Chicago, then forwarded to the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops, which then sent a national summary that joined the other countries in the world.

We need to pray for the success of this effort, it may be very influential in shaping the direction of the Church for years to come. Never has there been such a representative body of the global church gathered around the table with so many voices.

The Pope wants to recover the ancient tradition of the Synod as a governance structure grounded in the process of listening to the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit.

There are some who are very afraid of this Synod. They resist the possibility of the Holy Spirit leading us to new ways like the Council of Jerusalem in the first century or the Second Vatican Council of the 1960's. There are those who the Pope has described as living in the past, afraid of the world and the future. "Come Holy Spirit and Renew the Face of the Earth."

In addition to all this, the highly anticipated encyclical of Pope Francis on the environment will be released on the Feast of St. Francis Assisi.

Pope Francis' encyclical, Laudato Si, was a profound assessment of the challenges we face in our care for our common home, the earth. The Pope accepts the science of climate change and at that time faced much criticism. All the Pope's conclusions about the threats to our environment have proven true. He feels we are at a critical crossroads in confronting the forces that threaten the well-being of our planet. This new encyclical will be a clarion call for action. The Pope believes there is a moral imperative to being stewards of creation.

I am grateful to **Jim Reilly** and our ministry here at the parish that was born out of the vision of Laudato Si.

We had a marvelous visit this week to the Church of St Alphonsus here in Rome where the original icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is venerated. I held all of you in prayer as together we seek the intercession of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. This icon is one of the most venerated in Rome and has been in the custody of the Redemptorist Fathers.

Please remember the repose of the soul of the brother of **Fr. Patrick Kizza**. His name was **Gabriel**.

Next weekend we begin our stewardship program. Every so often we need to reflect on how I am being a faithful steward of my time, talent and treasure. We will be entering a process together. God has blessed all of us and especially our parish over the 104 years of our existence.




lesson of love, family, sadness, frustration, fear, anger, freedom and joy.



Youth Ministry





Instrumentalists and Singers of All Ages Needed

Anytime is a great time to join one of the choirs and help continue to build the Music Ministry at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church. This is a wonderful opportunity to

serve God and the Parish through sharing your gifts of music and song. And it promises to be a lot of fun as well!

The following groups are all directed by our music director, **Russell Stern**. New members are always welcome and encouraged to join throughout the year.

The Adult Festival Choir

- Sings at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses on Tuesday evenings from 7:30-9:00pm in the church. First rehearsal: Sept. 12.

The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- Sings at the 10:30am Mass Sundays throughout the year.
- Singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15pm in the music office. First rehearsal: Sept. 12.
- Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass or the Sunday 10:30am Mass (depending on the teen's availability), and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students 7th grade through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearses in the church periodically on Saturdays at 4:15pm or Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). First rehearsal:Sept. 23.

The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, usually at the 9:00 or 10:30am Mass from October through Mothers Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church Tuesdays, beginning Sept. 19, from 5:45-6:30pm.

Cantors

 Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors sings periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.

Theodore Chletsos is a sought-after artist in opera and concert in the US and abroad, garnering praise for his plangent voice and dynamic stage presence.





HELP US "BRIDGE THE GAP"

Our "BRIDGE THE GAP" campaign, with your help, will assist us to get back on track with our fiscal year budget.

It is normal for us to experience a dip in collections during the slower summer months.

However, we do not want the year to get away from us before it is fully underway. Last year tracked below budget for the entire year.

Our FY24 budget for the general offertory collection, which includes Christmas and Easter, is \$3.2 million. We need to reach this goal to make certain we can cover continued increasing costs, mainly in salaries and benefits (8%) and planned maintenance expenses (16%). These areas are vital to the life of the parish.

Direct support to the School and Religious Education programs is also provided out of the general offertory collection. Our First Fruits program benefits from 6% of the annual collection, as well.




