Dear Parishioners,

"The stone rejected has become the cornerstone."

Well, I'm back! I have returned from our parish pilgrimage in Italy. From the papal audience to the excavations of Pompei to the Greek temples in Sicily it was an adventure of a lifetime. I was privileged to accompany so many parishioners. Among many things, the trip was a journey of faith.

Visiting places immersed in the reality of antiquity, one does get a sense of perspective. Many of the challenges we face today can be seen from a different perspective when we approach them from a historical point of view. There were many times when the Church came very close to rejecting the stone which had become the cornerstone!

I recently had the opportunity to discuss John McGreevy's extraordinary book, "Catholicism: A Global History from the French Revolution to Pope Francis" with a group in the parish. Some of the divisions and conflicts we have today pale in comparison with the outright attempts to physically and militarily destroy the Church. Time and time again the cornerstone of the Church proved it could not be destroyed and always came out stronger.

Many of these conflicts at their source were about power, ego and control. Often when the Church was brought to her knees, the mission of Jesus emerged, the promise of the Kingdom of God proclaimed, and a period of rebirth signaled a new more engaged church. This process is not easy. Some people would rather go down in flames than to be open to the redemptive voice of the Holy Spirit.

When the Pope gave up the Papal States at the time of the Lateran Treaty, many thought this was the beginning of the end. The moral power of the papacy has never been stronger, now that the pope was freed from defending an antiquated political structure.

The Synod of Bishops gathered in Rome these days needs our prayers as voices never before heard will be at the table as the Pope convenes a Synod where the goal is to listen in prayer as we navigate the future.

As I assess our parish, we have much to be grateful for and much more to do if we are to be an effective agent of evangelization. Our recent survey has outlined many concerns that a vital and life-giving parish must address. How do we reach out to those who have drifted away from regular participation in our liturgical life? What about young people trying to figure out how faith is relevant in a secular culture? How does the proclamation of the Good News transform our families, our parish, the larger world.

God has blessed us! I was walking around campus the other night and I loved seeing all the lights on. Religious Education was gathering our young people, every meeting room in the parish center was ablaze with many groups meeting, the choir was rehearsing in the Church and the Playdium was filled to the rafters. Stuff is happening here!

Recently, you may have received letters beginning our annual stewardship program. It is crucial that from time to time to honestly reflect on how I am a faithful steward. People jump to the assumption that this is all about money but when we look at the pillars of being a good steward of time, talent, and treasure, the most precious is time.

As we look forward with hope to the future of our parish, we praise God for the faithful stewards of the past. Now it is our turn to ensure OLPH can build on that foundation so the generations of the future will also know a vital, vigorous and thriving community of faith.

Please be open to this process of discernment. I am not asking for money; I am asking for a generosity of spirit that will encourage a renewal of hearts and faithful commitment to lead us as a stronger parish. You have responded with such commitment in the past and I know with all my heart you will be open to making sure that the cornerstone of our faith will not be rejected.

For the next few weeks, we will together enter this process. I hope we don't get derailed on the money part. It is certainly a significant aspect of the stewardship conversation. But, if out of this process several folks who have been drifting away get reengaged, if several folks step forward to get more actively involved in parish life, I, (we) will be thrilled. If we can touch the hearts of our teenagers and young adults, it will be worth every moment.

I am so grateful for your continued generous response to the "Bridge the Gap" Appeal. We have made up so much of our deficit. Thank you! I just want to assure you that I take very seriously the trust you place in me and my staff in terms of the tremendous sacrifices you make to ensure we have the resources to meet our mission. The summer was full of capital projects, but we would never embark on a project if we did not have the money

OLPH Parish Survey Results

We continue to share with you results of the OLPH parishwide survey* we conducted last spring. The survey results identified both strengths, challenges, and opportunities. This week we will begin to look at opportunities for growth.

In the <u>September 17 Bulletin</u>, we presented responses to questions regarding "Belief in Core Catholic Teaching" that reflected strong agreement in beliefs about the Resurrection, the Eucharist, and Scripture. Today, we present areas in this category where responses did not reflect the same level of agreement with core teachings.

Belief in Core Catholic Teaching

"I personally believe in the teaching authority of the Church."

Agree 31%

Strongly Agree 39%

70% core belief

I personally believe the Church is critical to my relationship with God.

Strongly Agree 44%

Agree 30%

74% core belief

I personally believe in Jesus' moral teachings for my life as taught by the Church.

Strongly Agree 48%

Agree 35%

83% core belief

We can see from these survey results that we as individual Catholics and as a parish have an opportunity to explore how to strengthen our beliefs in these particular teachings.




