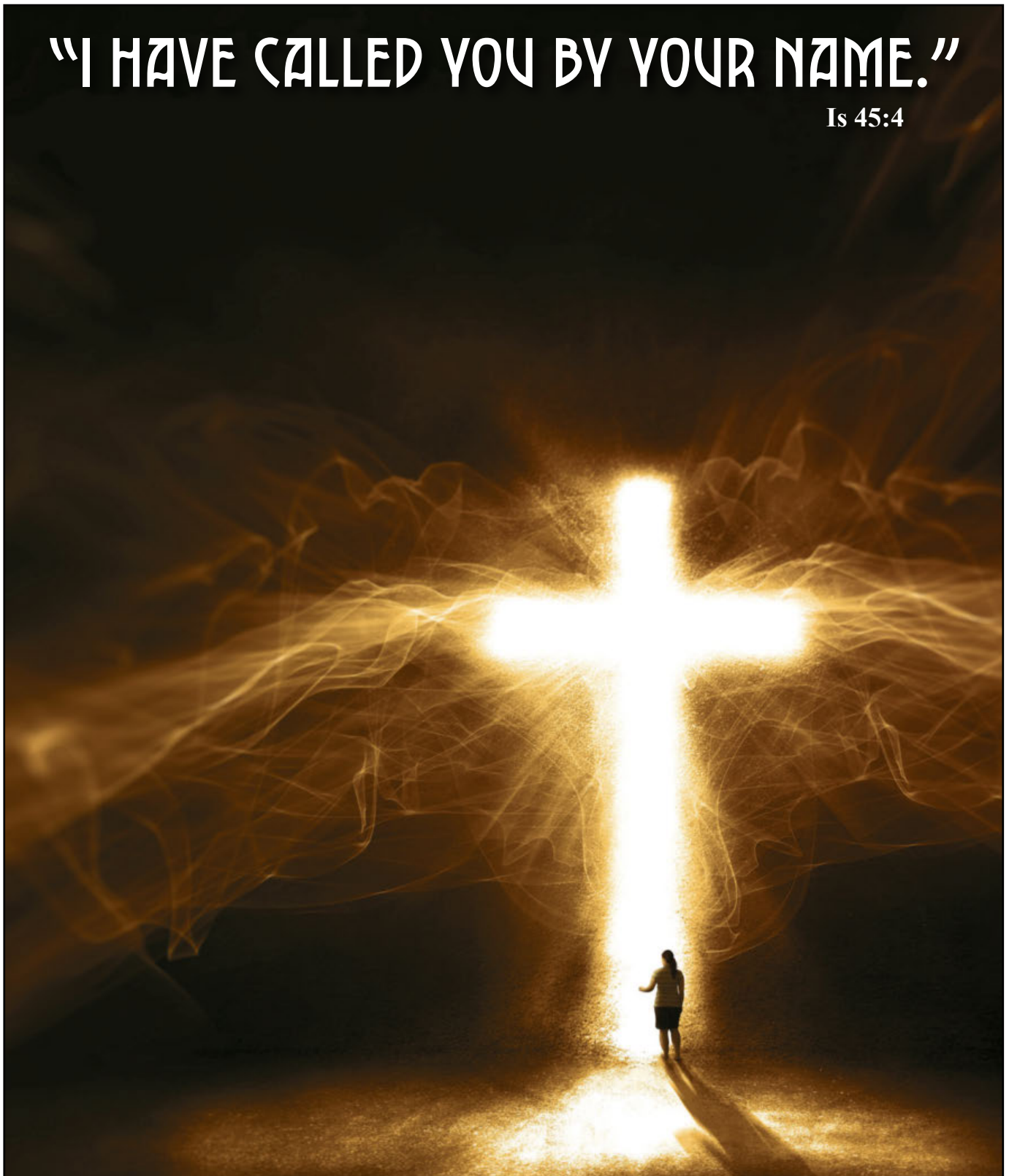

seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

"I have called you by your name."

This verse from this weekend's first reading is so reassuring. Our God knows us, he knows our name. Being called by our name reaffirms the truth that we are known and beloved by the Lord.

I mentioned in my homilies last weekend how I hope and pray our parish can broaden the base

of those who feel known, known by name. This is no easy task with a parish of our size, but we need to keep working at it.

Loneliness and isolation are pervasive in our culture. There is such a painful burden when we feel alone in our sufferings or difficulties. People can live in situations where they don't know the names of the people who are their neighbors. Some struggle with the reality, "who could I call if I was in crisis"?

All this makes the point of how essential to our wellbeing it is to feel connected, to feel I belong. I matter! When I encounter families dealing with the chronic illness of a loved one, the loss of a job, the process of grief or the anxiety of not feeling well, how important it is to have relationships I can turn to for support, encouragement and guidance.

On a fundamental level, that is what parish can be. Not the only support, but a significant one. I think of our many ministries that are a tangible way of extending bridges of concern and support. I hear over and over what a difference it makes for someone homebound or in a nursing home to be visited by a minister of care. I hear about the impact a teacher, a coach, a catechist, a scout leader can have on a young person. I was speaking with the pastor of one of our sharing parishes who told me he wouldn't know what to do if he did not have the support of OLPH financially and relationally. I encounter

folks who have been able to navigate a financial crisis because of the support of Sr. Paulanne's Needy Family Fund. I have seen repeatedly the comfort many have when they know they are being prayed for. Recently I was in the Church and a long-time parishioner entered in a wheelchair with a caregiver. He currently resides in an assisted care facility far away and he just wanted to visit the church. I could tell he felt overjoyed to be back "home".

Being known, feeling connected, feeling heard are essential to the life of a parish.

As we continue to reflect on the invitation to be a faithful steward, we need to keep in front of us the awareness we are blessed and all that we have comes from God. I can relate to the exuberance in St. Paul's letter this weekend, "I give thanks to God for all of you!"

We are in the midst of a process called the Intentional Offertory Initiative. We are called to reflect on how I can be a more faithful steward by evaluating the use of my time, talent and treasure in service of the Lord. This weekend at all the Masses we have several parishioners who will be reflecting on how they make choices on how they have put their time, talent and treasure to the service of the Lord. We will have the chance to hear how others make choices, set priorities in the quest to be an authentic Christian. So much of the context of this is related to being a parishioner. I am so grateful for their willingness to share this part of their faith life with us.

Next weekend is the main moment of this process when we are invited to make decisions on how we hope to enhance our time, talent and treasure in the future. This will center on participating in the intentional offertory pledge process. There will be more about this in the Bulletin and email blasts.

OLPH supports World Mission Sunday as part of our parish First Fruits Program, instead of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holyday offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year. This Archdiocesan second collection on World Mission Sunday during the weekend of October 21-22, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.

Let us also remember to pray for the missionary movement of the Catholic Church throughout the world.

OLPH Parish Survey Results

We continue to share with you results of the OLPH parishwide survey* we conducted last spring. In this week's update, we look at parishioner responses to questions about participation and sharing.

Participation and Sharing

"In the past year, how often have you participated in..."

"...a retreat?"

At least once monthly 1%

At least once or twice a year 22%

Never 77%

"...pastoral counseling/spiritual direction?"

At least once monthly 4%

At least once or twice a year 17%

Never 79%

In the past year, how often have you...

"...shared a personal witness story with another?"

At least once monthly 16%

At least once or twice a year 44%

Never 40%

"...shared the story of Jesus with another person?"

At least once monthly 22%

At least once or twice a year 47%

Never 31%

The responses highlight the opportunity for OLPH to build on a solid foundation of faith to become an even more participative and sharing parish community. In the coming weeks and months, we will continue to provide periodic updates about the survey results, as well as the priorities and plans we define in response to the results.

*Survey results refer to survey respondents who responded to each specific question, not to OLPH parishioners as a whole. If a "no response" was given to any question, it would not be included in the percentages listed above.

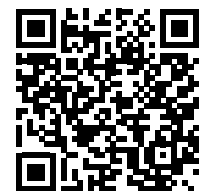

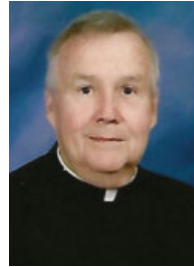

At the first meeting at 7:00pm on Wed., Nov. 1, we will cover the first three chapters.

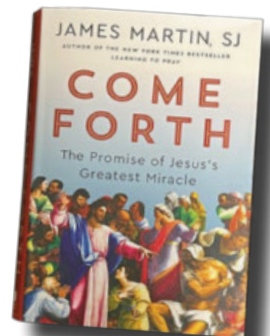

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We, the Catholic bishops of Illinois, write with a sense of urgency. Unless the General Assembly acts to renew the Invest in Kids scholarship program, more than 9,000 children currently relying on this program to attend a non-public school may have their educational path disrupted. Without an extension of the program in Illinois law now, no scholarships will be awarded for the school year that will begin in September 2024. Most of these children will have to leave the school their families determined was their best chance to receive a high-quality education in a safe and wholesome learning environment. This is an injustice that should and can be avoided, but only if the General Assembly acts when it reconvenes on October 24, 2023.

Invest in Kids has proven to be a beacon of hope for thousands of Illinois students and their families. Children receiving Invest in Kids scholarships come from lower-income families who could not otherwise afford tuition at the Catholic or another non-public school that is the best fit for their child. Childhood is a limited time in the life of a human being and primary and secondary education is not something that can be put off to some future date when it is convenient for adults. This is our one chance to offer these Illinois children a good start. Please help keep education options available and a brighter future possible by contacting your state senator and state representative and telling them to continue the Invest in Kids Program.

Since its inception six years ago, Invest in Kids has generated overwhelmingly positive results. Nearly 40,000 scholarships have been awarded to students attending non-public schools across Illinois. Demand for scholarships is very high - for every scholarship granted, three students are turned down due to lack of funds. Contrary to what you may have heard, this is not a voucher program, nor does it take state funds away from the public schools. These scholarships are funded through contributions from donors who receive a tax credit for their donation on their Illinois state income tax.

What can you do to help? Please contact your state senator and state representative to let them know of your support for extending the Invest in Kids tax credit scholarship program in Illinois. We also encourage you to urge your fellow parishioners to do the same. Our collective voice is vital to the continued help for Illinois families. Russell's Next Concert



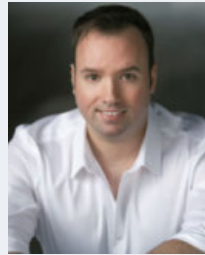
Mark your Calendars: Russell's next concert will be on Sunday, November 19, 2023 at 2:00pm.

You don't have to be famous, on TV, or have a huge online following to make a difference. It starts with the small step of believing the stories of survivors, and then committing to learn more about the problems facing those survivors and their children.

Everyday you can be an advocate just by chatting with others at school, work, church, wherever. Let others know you care about domestic violence.

Wear purple during Domestic Violence Awareness month in October.

When you're asked what it's about, explain why you are concerned about domestic violence.

If someone says, "Well, why don't they just leave," respond with, "Why are the abuser's actions allowed to go unpunished?" Misunderstandings about domestic violence are perpetuated because people simply accept them as the truth. Start a conversation that might lead to a changed mind.

You can let lawmakers know that protecting domestic violence survivors through strong and safe policy is important to you.
