Dear Parishioners,

"Come you who are blessed by my Father."

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. We end the liturgical year that began last December on the first weekend of Advent, 2022.

In terms of the proclamation of Scripture this past year many of

the gospels were taken from Matthew. He wrote his gospel to a Jewish Christian audience. He presents Jesus as the new Moses, the new teacher of the law. He begins his gospel with the genealogy of Jesus, tracing his human ancestry beginning with Abraham, continuing to King David to his earthly father Joseph. The Son of God born into human history.

He organizes many of Jesus teachings with his monumental presentation of Jesus's Sermon on the Mount. Matthew portrays the moments of our Lord's life with beautiful details. Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law.

This weekend's Gospel is in some ways the Closing argument that a lawyer might prepare before the judge and jury. When I was hungry you fed me, when I was thirsty you gave me to drink. How has the law of love guided our journey this past year?

This past year we journeyed together recalling Our Lord's birth, His earthly ministry, His passion, death and resurrection and the birth of the Church. A year of dying and rising to new life!

We will begin anew next weekend with the First Sunday of Advent, 2023. In the coming new liturgical year, many of the Sunday gospels will be taken from the Gospel according to Mark.

The Gospel of Mark is the oldest and the shortest of the Gospels. People of my generation may remember the series Dragnet, which featured a detective known as Sargent Joe Friday. He was famous for the line, "just the facts" when conducting a criminal investigation. In many ways the writing style of Mark, is "just the facts". He wants to get to the heart of the teachings of Jesus and not get lost in details. The tone of the Gospel of Mark is one of urgency. The teachings of Jesus call for action, as soon as possible. Much of Mark's writings were integrated into the Gospel accounts of Matthew and Luke.

As we conclude the liturgical year, we praise God for the graces and blessings of this past year. As we look to the beginning of the new season of Advent leading to Christmas and a New Year, may our hearts be open to deepening the foundation of faith we have been blessed with.

In the light of this weekend's gospel thank you for your generous support of the food and coat drives. Hundreds and hundreds of people in need will benefit from these initiatives.

I am also grateful to several parishioners who assisted Immaculate Conception School in Puerto Rico that was devastated by hurricanes and earthquakes. We were able to replace their air conditioning system that is essential in the hot climate of Puerto Rico. Our parishioner, former Ambassador and current member of the Catholic Extension Society, **Jim Kenny** was on location to see firsthand the system we were able to provide. STATEMENT ON THE CRISIS IN ISRAEL AND PALESTINE

O pray for the peace of Jerusalem (Psalm 122:6)

We, the undernamed members of the Glenview Clergy Association, recognize that no public statement is adequate to address the tragic situation in Israel and Palestine. However, as leaders within the Abrahamic Faiths, we wish to express our empathy and solidarity with those who are heartbroken and outraged.

As religious leaders, we recognize that God is the Giver of life and that every human being is a person of sacred worth. Therefore, we categorically condemn the killing of Israeli and Palestinian civilians.

We affirm the human rights of all people be they Israeli or Palestinian. Therefore, we condemn the taking of Israeli hostages by Hamas.

We affirm Israel's right to defend itself, yet we also condemn the retaliatory violence that has severely impacted Palestinian civilians living in Gaza. Therefore, we urge the Israeli and Egyptian governments to allow desperately needed supplies into Gaza and to allow innocent civilians to safely leave Gaza to seek refuge in Egypt under United Nations supervision.

We are alarmed at the domestic and global rise of antisemitism and Islamophobia associated with this crisis. Therefore, we unreservedly condemn any form of antisemitic or Islamophobic expression, action, or violence.

The crisis in Israel and Palestine reminds us that we cannot indulge in dehumanizing others. Even in the midst of unimaginable loss, we must allow for grief and mourning. We must also struggle to defend the dignity of all people.

As religious leaders, we strive to put into practice the moral courage that grounds all of our faith traditions. We are committed to doing all we can to exchange fear for compassion, hatred for sympathy, apathy for commitment, and arrogance for humility wherever we find these moral demands.

We call upon all people of goodwill to pray for peace in the Holy Land and its peoples.

Stewardship Report

To all parishioners:

Thanks to your generosity and response to our Bridge the Gap appeal and your initial response to the Intentional Offertory Initiative, the results of our Offertory collection for the four months ended October 31, 2023 are now in line with and ahead of our budget by 1%. Thank you, thank you, thank you!!!! Compared with FY23, for the same period, we are 2% ahead of last year. Both years included an appeal to boost the shortfalls of the summer months.


As a parish community, you have contributed \$937,227 to the General Offertory collection for the first four months of the fiscal year. Included in this total is \$160,099 in funds received from the Bridge the Gap appeal. We pray that this level of giving will continue for the remainder of the year.

We have recently completed The Intentional Offertory Initiative Program which has given all of us the opportunity

to reflect on many different aspects of parish, stewardship, involvement, blessings, and discipleship as well as our response through giving of time, talent, and treasure. The return of Intention cards, thus far, indicates a positive response to this initiative. Again, we thank you for your commitment to help sustain the works of our parish. If you haven't yet returned your intention card, we encourage you to do so.

Now is the time of the year when IRA required minimum distributions get a whole lot of press. You can contribute directly to the parish through your IRA distribution and reduce your taxable income. Year-end giving might also include the gift of appreciated stock. 


Embark on a Journey


