"For when I am weak, I am strong"

This reflection of St. Paul in his Letter to the Corinthians this week speaks a profound truth about the Christian journey. It is often in our weakness that we encounter the strength in our faith to endure, to persevere, to eventually thrive.

When many people look back on

some of the most difficult times in their lives, they come to see that it was then that they learned the most, grew the most. I suppose it is only in retrospection that we see what we could not see or appreciate in the moment of grief, anxiety or regret. Through our weakness, we became stronger in the faith,

I am struck by this when I visit people who are quite ill. Living with pain and uncertainty we are faced with the power of being truly dependent on God's grace. As we face struggles born of conflict with others, disillusionment or discouragement we can be drawn to consider the love of Christ which can lift us out of the grip of weakness.

I am aware of the impact our Ministers of Care have when they visit the hospitalized and home bound. While the person they are visiting may be physically or emotionally weak, the strength of their faith is an inspiration. The Eucharist gives life and hope unlike anything else.

Often as people encounter the reality of addiction, they see the only way to health and recovery is a much deeper dependence on the love of Christ.

During my recent pilgrimage to Norway and Sweden I was struck about the glorious landscape of this part of the world. In a place of such natural beauty and place where the quality of life is strong, there is a struggle to find a place for worship and faith. Christians have been in Scandinavia since the 8th century.

Queen Christina fled Sweden in the 17th century, converted to Catholicism and lived in the Vatican for protection. She is one of only 6 women buried in the basilica. A monument to her is right across from where the Pieta is venerated.

The Swedish Reformation of the 16th century severed the Scandinavian Christians from Rome and a bitter persecution of Catholics resulted to rid the influence of the Roman Catholics. A faithful remnant persevered. "For when we are weak, we are strong." In recent years there has been a tremendous healing on some levels.

Catholics are not persecuted and a mutual respect for our common lineage of faith has emerged. Lutheran/Catholic dialogue is evident and positive.

The biggest treat to Christianity in Scandinavia these days

is not the lingering suffering of the Reformation, but the threat secularization poses. The culture is non-religious in its sensibilities. Very few people belong formally to a Christian faith community. Very few are baptized and celebrations of Christmas or Easter are more social than expressions of events sacred to Christian heritage. While Catholics are a very small minority, they have a much higher percentage of being active members of a faith community.

There is much hope that a recovery of Christian faith will emerge in this place of such beauty and prosperity.

I hear the Fourth of July Parade in town was terrific with our own **Lou Marohn** serving as Grand Marshall.

Special thanks to the Women's Club for their donation of over \$260,000 this past year! This gift is a result of so much hard work and commitment to the mission of our parish. I thank the former president, **Debbie Mulroy** and all our guilds that strove to support the parish so generously.

Please keep in your prayers the success of the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, we have several parishioners attending. We pray that the graces of the Eucharistic Revival in this country will bear much fruit.

Meg and her family grew up in Wilmette during the '60s.


Behind closed doors, a harsh reality was unfolding - a

"Mary adored the Eucharist with a most submissive faith. Mary's adoration was profound, interior, and intimate. It was the gift of herself. She offered her whole self to the







Reflection

After the Ascension of Jesus, Mary had to adjust to Jesus' new way of being present to her. He was now hidden from view under the veil of the Eucharist. This way of being with Jesus requires great faith, trust, love and an intense interior life.





As Mother of the Church and spiritual mother to all the disciples of Jesus, Mary desires to teach all her spiritual children that they too can trust that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist and put full confidence in knowing that he is with them in this hidden manner.

Our Lady teaches the importance of living this sort of interior life. Without an interior life, we cannot lead Eucharistic lives. Without an interior life, we run the risk of becoming busybodies, too preoccupied with action; too involved in the things of the world to prepare for Holy Mass, and too consumed with tasks to spend time in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament.

Our Lady helped transform the world through her prayers, penances, and love for Jesus in the Eucharist. If we follow her selfless example, we too can set the world aflame with love for Jesus!
