Dear Parishioners,

"Jesus took the loaves and gave thanks."

The Church in the United States is still in the afterglow of last weekend's National Eucharistic Congress that took place in Indianapolis. There were 50,000 people that participated in a series of liturgies, processions and witness talks that focused on the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of the Church.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops convened the Eucharistic Congress to address the declining number of Catholics attending Mass and the declining number of Catholics who understand the basic tenets of the "Real Presence" of Our Lord in our midst.

Initially some were seeking to spend a lot of energy on deciding who can go to communion and who cannot. Thank goodness Pope Francis intervened in the early planning and guided the Eucharistic revival in the direction of Christ's love for all of us. The power of the Eucharist is to reach out to all of God's children, to include not exclude. From North to South, from East to West, Catholics all over have been meditating on the power of the Lord's words, "do this in remembrance of me." We all come to the Lord's table as sinners in need of his redeeming love.

The grace of this national journey of rediscovering the power of the Eucharist will guide and influence the Church for years to come. Personally, we are invited to continue our spiritual journey of being transformed by the love Christ revealed in the Eucharist. As a parish, we must continue our journey together as a Eucharistic community.

As we look to the future, we must ensure our liturgies are life giving and encouraging. We all have to make an effort to avail ourselves to the power of the Mass, making it a priority in our weekly schedule. It is more, though, than just attending. It is how present am I during the Mass? We need to resist the temptation to daydream or to be overly focused on "how long" it takes. Let the Word of God wash over you, be aware of the community you are worshipping with, approach the table of the Lord prayerfully and being grateful. Embrace the challenge of the Eucharist to go out into the world proclaiming the Good News!

In the coming weeks, parishioners who attended the Eucharistic Congress will be sharing their experience. The next National Eucharistic Congress in the United States will be in the year 2033, the 2000th anniversary of Our Lord's passion, death, and resurrection.

The energy of the Eucharistic Revival takes on special power this year because we are now entering a 5-week series of Gospels that are called the "Bread of Life Discourses". These are Our Lord's most comprehensive teachings on the Eucharist taken from the Gospel of John.

This series begins with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. Aware of the hunger of his disciples, "Jesus took the loaves and gave thanks." Jesus fed the multitudes so many centuries ago on the shores of the Sea of Galilee. He continues to feed us as we gather to celebrate the Eucharist. We bring many hungers to the table of the Lord, both physical and spiritual.

Every Sunday, our bells ring about 10 minutes before the beginning of Mass to call of us to worship. Speaking of bells, they have become the sensation of the summer of 2024! Since their installation over a month ago, many have shared with me how much they appreciate them. Thanks to the benefactors and many parishioners who made them possible! The bells will be officially blessed and inaugurated on Sunday, August 11. Our Vicar, **Bishop Jeffrey Grob** will preside at the 10:30 Mass, followed by a blessing of the bells and the clock tower on the front steps of the Church. A reception and performance of the bells will follow in the Hellerman Garden. Make plans to come!

Last week Mary Lynne Januszewski, our Director of Finance and Operations prepared a Stewardship Report in the Bulletin as the fiscal year concluded. I am so grateful for your faithful stewardship of OLPH. There are few parishes that support the vast array of ministries and facilities as we do. It simply could not happen without you! This time last year we were facing some strong head winds regarding our financial well-being. You have responded with such generosity. We are a blessed parish with the resources to support so many efforts.

I want to give a special shout out to Mary Lynne who does such an outstanding job of organizing the financial and operations side of parish life. With over 115 employees, 10 buildings and 3,500 families this is a challenging parish We are so blessed by her!!

Through the leadership of **Father Patrick Kizza**, I am delighted to welcome the Karolines Choir to perform at our liturgies this weekend. They are a group of Ugandan young adults from Boston. It will be a blessing to celebrate with them at our Masses. A second collection at the Masses will be taken up to support their ministry of praising God in song.

Last week the National Eucharistic Congress was held in Indianapolis. Some of our parishioners were fortunate to have attended this wonderful event. This week Jen Farber shares her experience. In the coming weeks we will also share the reflections of Dave Ludden and Alyson Ludden.

We came with no expectations. We had no idea what to expect. We should have known better! The Holy Spirit was the guide and being with Jesus was the goal. A huge sign said "In Indy as in Heaven." For every participant there, it did feel like Heaven on earth!

I convinced my 24-year-old son **Simon** to go with me so I wouldn't have to travel alone. He needed a break from the doldrums of daily accounting work post-Covid style: alone in his apartment for 8 to 12 hours each day. He loves a sports city and checking out stadiums in Indy fit the bill. I promised him music concerts every night at Lucas Oil Stadium at the Revival Sessions. (I had no idea what was really on the schedule but as it turns out I wasn't far off!) Simon signed on and I was thrilled.

Indianapolis could not have been a more perfect location. It was as if it was designed for this particular pilgrimage of faith. The convention center sits in the heart of downtown with a beautiful Catholic church, St. John's, directly across the street. That church became a 24 hour perpetual adoration chapel with silent adoration, various devotions, and the Liturgy of the Hours scheduled day and night. It was always full!

The church's parking lot, the Rectory Garden, and the promenade next to it became a village for gathering for coffee, sweets, and fellowship. People with Revival badges were everywhere! Visitors who were not there for the revival stared in amazement...what are all these people of ALL ages doing here? Luckily we're Catholics so we're used to greeting people, and we couldn't help but tell them about the amazing week we were having!

Each day had its own theme and purpose, and we were amazed at how the Revival leaders and presenters carried these specific themes throughout every session for the day.



He Is Here!

Day One Wednesday's theme was From the Four Corners. Beginning at Pentecost in May, four pilgrimage routes from East, West, North and South carried Jesus to Indianapolis and met within Lucas Oil Stadium. So many pilgrims converged on the convention center to receive their credentials that Registration became overwhelmed and they told us to go straight to the stadium for the first Revival Session at 7:00pm. That first day, walking with literally hundreds of fellow believers toward a whole new experience felt absolutely electric and full of hope. It was truly a religious pilgrimage just like going to Lourdes or Fatima. Once inside the stadium, we were amazed at the sheer number of attendees filling the seats and then the screen flashed: *He Is Here*.

The stadium went dark and the music ceased. A bright light appeared in a corner of the stadium floor where players usually enter from. But it wasn't a football hero, it was Jesus himself in the Blessed Sacrament, exposed in an enormous gold monstrance and carried by **Bishop Andrew Cozzens**, the spiritual leader of the Revival. An angelic choir accompanied Jesus' entrance and we sang along as the words flashed around the stadium-thousands of voices welcoming Jesus into our presence. It was a sacred moment, and as Bishop Cozzens spoke opening prayers from his heart asking Jesus to forgive our transgressions--for the abuse scandal, for division, for not loving as he asks us to love--we knew this Revival would be focused on only one person, the one who really matters in our lives--the King of Kings, our Jesus.

Day Two was dedicated to The Greatest Love Story. It began, as every day did, with Rosary and Holy Mass at Lucas Oil Stadium, followed by an Impact Session until lunchtime. These Impact Sessions were broken into seven different categories to serve the varied population of attendees. I attended the Encounter Session the first day, which was designed for people

to encounter Jesus more deeply and be renewed in their calling to follow him. It did not disappoint...actually it left us begging for more!

Sr. Mary Grace and **Sr. Veritas** of the Sisters of Life demonstrated the peace and confidence of religious life and **Monsignor James Shea** inspired us with a powerful retelling of Jesus' extravagant sacrifice. The music of **Sarah Kroger** held it all together with heartfelt praise...we were singing at the top of our lungs! Day 3 was Into Gethsemane and was focused on healing. Dave Ludden and I both noticed by the end of the day that the coordinators managed to carry this theme throughout every part of the day whether it was Rosary, Mass, Impact or a breakout session. I attended Renewal for ministry leaders that day. This was a more intimate meeting---hundreds instead of thousands of pilgrims. The session leaders fed us with soothing praise music, laughed with us over the challenges of church work, shared advice for setting aside private time with Jesus so we can continue our mission in the church with joy and peace, and then prayed over us to heal us from any wounds caused by the church family (that's all of us!). It was a powerful morning. I hope to share more of this with fellow ministry leaders in the months to come.

Day 4's theme was This is My Body. I decided to check out Empower designed for people who want to be Eucharistic Missionaries, evangelizing their community and taking on deeper roles in spreading the Gospel to those around them. This gathering had a more charismatic feel with witnesses to the faith and even a report of a miracle of sight from the day before. The highlight for me at this session was speaker Lisa Brenninkmeyer. You may know her from the ministry "Walking with Purpose" and she's also on the Hallow app. What confidence she has in the Lord! She pointed out that while Covid got a lot of us to slow down our overly busy work lives, it has led many of us to approach our faith life as self-care, selecting specific Christian practices that we like and certain people we prefer as a part of a new "wellness plan." That's not the Christian life, she said. We are to say Yes to live a crucified life together. It's not just about friends and feeling good. It's about "staying in community, keeping close, listening, and forgiving." I loved it!

Day 5 was the final Sunday morning, To the Ends of the Earth. We had a faith witness from astronaut Colonel Mike Hopkins and two great pep talks from Chris Safranik and Mother Adela Galindo before the final Mass with Luis Cardinal Tagle of the Philippines. The procession alone required more than 30 minutes with hundreds of bishops, priests, seminarians and altar servers participating. Cardinal Tagle's homily was joyful but also thought-provoking. We were engaged in searching our souls up until the last minute of this Congress.

Before closing the Congress, Bishop Cozzens shared that the Eucharistic Pilgrimages were so well received that they have already decided to host a Eucharistic pilgrimage walk from Indianapolis to Los Angeles next year. Archbishop Gomez of Los Angeles invited all pilgrims to arrive with Jesus in LA on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, Sunday, June 19, 2025. What a joy! Bishop Cozzens also informed us that there is already an 11th Eucharistic Revival in the works for 2033 or sooner.

But first we will complete the 3rd year of this Eucharistic Revival with the <u>Walk with One</u> program. This program begins with prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, identifying who God is calling us personally to bring to Jesus and then befriending that person and demonstrating how God is working in our own life through our kindness, generosity, and faithful obedience. Dave Ludden and I hope to explore this program more over the next few months to see what opportunities we can bring to our parish.

I wish more OLPH people could have attended or watched on EWTN because it was a truly life-changing experience. I am grateful that Simon came because I know it will have a direct impact on the rest of his life. He will be a better son, brother, husband, father, friend and worker as a result of this experience. He sat before the Blessed Sacrament for 4 nights in a row! I can't wait to see what God's plan is for him. It's going to be amazing!

All I can say is, what a blessing. With all the things happening in our country these past few weeks, there's no doubt that a higher power is at work here. The Holy Spirit truly took over this Congress and for that I will be forever grateful.

Thank you for allowing me to share this journey with you. I will share more Revival Session video links soon.



Ministry of Care **Important Notice To All OLPH Parishioners**

The purpose of the Ministry of Care is to provide pastoral care to our parishioners and their families who are sick, elderly, homebound or experiencing a time of need. Following the example of Jesus' own actions, the OLPH Ministry of Care strives to break down the barriers of isolation felt by those who are sick or homebound, to include them as full members of the community, and to provide hope of an ultimate healing of both illness and sin.

Ministers of Care visit the sick and homebound with the Holy Eucharist, share the word of God in scripture, pray with them for the Church and the world, and offer companionship. Ministers of Care are a sign of the support and concern that our Church has for the sick, the elderly, the homebound, and those experiencing a time of need.

Recently, you may have read that Northshore University Hospitals (Glenbrook, Evanston, Skokie) have been renamed "Endeavor Health" due to merger with other hospitals.

Unfortunately, the legal department of Endeavor Health has now decided to change the long-standing policy of the hospitals regarding visits by Catholic Ministers of Care, priests, clergy, and representatives of other area Churches.

Endeavor Health will longer routinely provide the names of Catholic patients in their hospitals to Catholic Ministers of Care, even if the patient has identified himself or herself as Catholic.

To quote the notice from Endeavor Health that was received: "...only the names of individuals who have requested communion or a visit from a priest/clergy should be provided



to Ministers of Care and community clergy."

Please be aware that if you or a family member are admitted to an Endeavor Health Hospital, you or your family member will only be visited by a Catholic Minister of Care or priest with Holy Communion if you or your family member specifically request a visit by a Minister of Care or priest.

Each patient must tell their nurse, doctor, hospital chaplain, or other hospital employee that they request a visit by a Catholic Minister of Care or priest. Of course, any parishioner in the hospital, nursing/senior facility, or homebound may always contact the OLPH Parish Office to request a visit by a Minister of Care or priest.

which he distributes to these mostly homeless people who come to his door. Please drop donations off at the OLPH Parish Center, marking your gift cards for Fr. Pfleger.


