Dear Parishioners,

"Whoever comes to me will never hunger."

Every four years, I get reacquainted with the human drive for accomplishment and achievement by watching the Olympics. This year's Games in Paris have not disappointed me. I admit, I do not follow most of the sports featured in the Olympics but as the games proceed, I am so taken

by the stories of the various athletes, many of them facing incredible challenges to participate in a gathering which celebrates the remarkable human drive to "give it your all".

In a world divided by geography, politics, culture and economics, the Olympics provides a forum for all of us to rejoice in one another and see that despite difference there are universal human desires that are part of what it means to be human that transcend all the energy that goes into the culture of division.

The mother of a track and field athlete from the South Sudan has many of the same aspirations for her child as does a mother from North Dakota. While some get unduly focused on medal counts as an indication of who is the best, the fact is the Olympics brings us all together from the most prosperous nations to the most economically challenged. Those athletes get to know each other, friendships form, and world views are expanded.

There is a power when we come together and share in mutual yearnings, desires, and dreams.

I was struck by this as I have been reflecting on the impact of the National Eucharistic Congress. We have been blessed by reading reflections of some of our parishioners who attended the Congress.

**Madeline Daley** is a college student who attended the Congress, and she shared five takeaways from her experience of the Congress and her Catholic faith:

 Catholicism in the US is not archaic. Many claim the Church "must get with the times." The reality is our Church is alive and vital.

- The US Church spans across many languages and cultures. Our Church in this country is blessed by its diversity.
- 3) 6,500 miles of US roads became the road to Emmaus. Prior to the Congress, there were four pilgrimage routes that invited over 100,000 people to participate in Eucharistic processions that affirmed that, all over this country, people yearn for the Eucharist.
- 4) Blessed Carlo Acutis said, "Pray to want to be a saint, and if you don't want to do that, pray to want to want to be a saint." Carlo will soon be canonized, the first of the millennial generation. Do things you would want to do if you were a saint. What if 70 million US Catholics decided to live out their faith radically. Wow!
- 5) We are all hungry. When you are faced with the beauty of sanctity you just want it! We hunger for God! The Eucharist feeds us spiritually. We need food for the journey!

Thanks, Madeline, for these beautiful reflections.

We are currently in the midst of the "Bread of Life," discourses featured in the Gospels. They present Jesus' most in depth teachings on the Eucharist. Today the Lord distinguishes between physical hunger and spiritual hunger. The food the Lord gives will satisfy us. "Whoever comes to me will never hunger." We crave to be fed spiritually. Come to the table of the Lord!

One of my least favorite words is August. It becomes the word that marks the gradual transition from summer to autumn. There are still plenty of summer days ahead! Make sure you take advantage of these wonderful days.

## seek, share, rejoice - eucharistic pilgimage reflections...

Recently, the National Eucharistic Congress was held in Indianapolis. Some of our parishioners were fortunate to have attended this wonderful event. This week Dave Ludden shares his experience.



Let's get it started!

After a 6,500-mile pilgrimage from the four corners of the United States to Indianapolis, the Church appeared to show up exhausted, tired, and beaten mentally, physically, and spiritually.

Given that the last National Eucharistic Congress called by the U.S. Bishops happened 83 years ago (just before WW II), I along with the overwhelming majority of pilgrims arrived not knowing what to expect...but we knew what to bring...our Faith, our Hope, and our Love of Jesus.

What our Church experienced over the next five days of the National Eucharistic Congress was nothing short of a miracle. I don't want to sound dramatic but the moment was indescribable.

The Bishops, the Church, and most importantly, the Holy Spirit blew the roof off the packed Lucas Oil Stadium. 60,000+ Catholics came together each day to pray, repent, share tears, learn, be challenged, celebrate, sing, worship, process, and adore TOGETHER!

Over five days and nights, a tired Church was fed and nourished by the Love of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist and together with the Holy Spirit our Church left energized, Hopeful, JOYFUL, ready for mission, and UNITED in our love for Him.

I know it is difficult to not become discouraged by the hate, noise, and toxicity of the secular world and even within our Church these days. At times it may seem like we are "dying" as a Church and hope is fading. But, as an eyewitness to what

happened at this Congress, I would like to tell you: OUR CHURCH IS ALIVE! AND OUR CHURCH IS MOVING FORWARD GUIDED BY HIS SPIRIT!

One of the most powerful moments for me (besides sharing this moving experience with my daughter **Alyson**) and many others at the Congress came from not a Bishop or a religious. It came from **Gloria Purvis**, a laywoman who spoke just before **Bishop Barron** on Saturday night. Gloria asked her fellow Catholics both in attendance and those at home this challenging question, "What if the biggest obstacle to unity in the Church is my pride and hardness of heart?"...

I would like to bring that question back to our beautiful community at OLPH. Reflect and pray deeply on this question like all those attendees at the Congress. For it is only through this conversion, this change of heart and mind, that we will be able to produce the miracles for which our Lord has made each of us and His Church!

United (let me say that again), UNITED around the love of Christ there is nothing this church can't do. "The energy would change the country," Bishop Barron said in his closing address on Saturday night. The 200+ Bishops and Cardinals in attendance believe that, along with the 1000+ priests, the 600+ Deacons, the 600+ Seminarians, the 1000+ Religious Brothers and Sisters, and the 60,000 laity who attended this Congress also believes this!!! It's time to come together as a Church! It's time to move forward! It's time to be a light to this nation!

I hope I can convey the Hope that is in the hearts of those that experienced this great moment for our Church. It was, without a doubt, the greatest moment our Church here in the United States has experienced in my lifetime.

Along with that Hope, I would like to end with a bit of Good News and Bad News...

First the Good News...At the end of the closing Mass on Sunday, Bishop Cozzens (who was in charge of this Congress) asked all of us a question. He said, "So, your Bishops want to know, should we do another National Eucharistic Congress?" The 60,000+ Catholics stood on their feet and gave a resounding "YES"! With that affirmation, the discernment process was over for the Bishops and Bishop Cozzens announced that the Church would not wait 83 more years for the next Eucharistic Congress, but only 9 years!!!

The next National Eucharistic Congress will take place in 2033 to commentate the 2000 anniversary of the Year of Redemption, the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ!!

When this news was announced, I was overcome with excitement, gratitude, and joy that all my loved ones and all of our beautiful parishioners of this great parish will have the opportunity to experience a National Eucharistic Congress (God Willing). I could not be filled with more Joy to know that this opportunity may come to fulfillment in your life!

The bad news...I don't know if there is a venue in the U.S. that will hold the amount of Catholics that will want to attend in 2033!!!!

## The Real Presence: St. Joseph, the Faithful Adorer

Weekly 3-Minute Reflections on the Eucharist using excerpts from 30 Day Eucharistic Revival by Fr. Don Calloway, MIC

"At Nazareth, Joseph's days were filled with work which necessarily took him away at times from Jesus and Mary. When evening brought him home again, he would pass the entire night in adoration, never tiring, only too happy for the chance to contemplate the hidden riches of Jesus' divinity. For he pierced the rough garments the child wore until his faith touched the Sacred Heart.

Among the graces which Jesus gave to St. Joseph is that special grace given to an adorer of the Blessed Sacrament. That is the one we must ask of St. Joseph for ourselves: to have strong confidence in him. Take him as the patron and the model of your life of adoration."

#### Reflection

What makes St. Joseph our model of adoration is his great faith. His faith pierced the veil of heaven and beheld mysteries beyond human comprehension on a daily basis. What mysteries must have been revealed to him as he adored Jesus asleep at his feet, at the family table, and as Jesus received a thousand kisses from his immaculate mother?

Saint Joseph's adoration of Jesus must have born tremendous fruit and flooded his chaste heart with indescribable graces. These graces were not for him alone, but for all his spiritual children because

St. Joseph is our spiritual father. Is he not worthy of our imitation? St. Joseph provides for us a most worthy model of how to live in perpetual adoration of Jesus.



#### Hi Gabriella!


It was a small world attending Mass in Bergen, Norway and finding out that the celebrant was also from Chicago!




## **Marian Day of Prayer & Reflection**






