Dear Parishioners,

"Be kind to one another, compassionate."

One of the great movies in recent months has been *Cabrini*. The film tells the story of a Catholic missionary, **Francesca Cabrini** who encountered resistance in her ministry to immigrants. It is now available on cable tv.

While the movie focuses on her experiences in New York City in the 19th century, Mother Cabrini established hospitals, schools,

and orphanages in many places in the United States. She spent a lot of time here in Chicago. She was a frequent Mass goer at my former parish, Holy Family on Roosevelt Road. The first statue acknowledging her canonization is venerated in that church.

There are many legendary stories that are still told about her in Little Italy on Taylor Street. Her hospital was in the neighborhood that cared for the poor. She was a power to be reckoned with, so committed to her sense of mission and purpose.



Founders of religious communities are remarkable people and Mother Cabrini was no exception. As a little girl she almost drowned which resulted in her having a tremendous fear of water and she suffered throughout her life with lung issues. When attempting challenges that would seem unobtainable, she was often told, "stay where you belong," which meant to assume a life of being a semi-invalid. Whenever told this she would rise above everyone's wildest expectations. Her life was an inspiration to the power of perseverance, to never give up on your dreams, and to keep moving forward in life.

The 19th century America was very unwelcoming to immigrants, especially those that did not speak English, one could argue much has not changed,

Mother Cabrini would often say, "you did not choose to enter this world, but you can choose how to live in it."

Mother Cabrini was driven by a deep love of the Eucharist. She was a daily Mass goer that she claimed was essential in her ability to respond to the most basic of needs, to inspire others to join her and to combat the prejudice that tortured recently arrived immigrants.

As we continue to reflect on the Eucharist during these weeks of the "Bread of Life Discourses", Mother Cabrini's legacy reminds us that the fruits of the Eucharist can

be manifested in the ability to "be kind to one another and compassionate" as St. Paul teaches in the second reading.

This weekend we are delighted to welcome **Bishop Jeffrey Grob**, our Vicar, who will preside at the 10:30am Mass and bless and dedicate our new bells and clock tower. Welcome Bishop Grob!

In ancient times when I was a child, we would watch the movie, "The Bells of Saint Mary's" with Bing Crosby. In modern times we can listen to the bells of Our Lady of Perpetual Help!

The original bell system built in 1949 had long been silent due to deterioration over time and the ability to get spare parts. It was parishioner **Jack Horbal** who suggested we get the bells replaced and started a campaign to raise funds. Many parishioners came forward to support the project and several parishioners made major gifts so we could not only replace the bell system but renovate and upgrade the clock tower.

The new bells have a library of hundreds of hymns and special effects. It is bluetooth capable. The clock runs on a digital format. It will serve the community for years to come.

The tradition of church bells goes back to the 4th century and, in a way, was the village's alarm clock. The bells woke you up in the morning, told you when to go to Church, when to pray and when to come home at the end of the day. Bells announced moments of joy and consoled the community at times of death. The bells have become a wonderful addition to our community. Thanks to everyone who has made them possible.

With August, planning for the new program year is in full force. Many of our programs are child-friendly, which I appreciate. Due to changes in our insurance coverage and safety concerns we are not able to have inflatables or bounce houses but there are many other activities for the kids.

Your generosity and support of our outreach to people in need would make Mother Cabrini so proud. I am particularly grateful to **Tom and Kay Hart** who have led so many of our efforts to assist recently arrived immigrants.

seek, share, rejoice - eucharistic pilgimage reflections...

Recently, the National Eucharistic Congress was held in Indianapolis. Some of our parishioners were fortunate to have attended this wonderful event. This week Alyson Ludden shares her experience.

Like always, words cannot do justice in capturing God's grace, peace, and love he gifted me and all those present at the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis; however, I can attempt to describe the personal impact this extraordinary experience had on me.

Like many in college, I have been consumed the past three years in the craziness of academics and social life. Because of this, I have felt more disconnected to my faith than I would have liked to be. Growing up in a strong Catholic family, I held on to the foundational faith I had built at home, continuing to go to Mass while at school every Sunday and becoming a Eucharistic Minister there, but something within my faith-life felt different. This feeling continued to bother me throughout the past three years, so, when given the opportunity to go to the Eucharistic Congress with my dad, I felt a pulling in my heart to go.

Neither of us knew much about the Congress going into it, but we both agreed to go with no expectations and simply go to "be with Jesus." We went in with this

perspective, and of course, God being God, went above and beyond in creating an unforgettable experience for us Catholics. My biggest takeaway from the Congress is that it helped "heal" this stagnation in my faith that I had been feeling throughout college.

It did this in three ways. The first is by giving me the resources to deepen my intellectual understanding of Christianity and, therefore, through knowledge, allowing me to grow in my faith. The second is through my personal growth that came from fully understanding Jesus and God's infinite patience with his children and the love he has for each one of us. Lastly, I felt reconnected to the power of prayer, which I had also felt in Medjugorje (something about gathering with tens of thousands of Catholics praying to our God creates this amazing power within prayer).

If you have not had the chance to listen to the speakers from the Congress on YouTube, I promise it will be well worth your time. (Go to our website at https://olphqlenview.org/experience-eucharistic-congress-home to view all the video content from the Eucharistic Congress.) I have had a thirst in my soul all throughout college for learning more about my faith and coming to a deeper understanding of scripture and God's love. Unfortunately, I have not truly felt that my brain has been stimulated through my theology classes or during the homilies at Mass (I know this is not the purpose of Mass but I always enjoy a more theological but relatable analysis of scripture during the homily). The speakers at the Congress talked about everything from how the Real Presence is what makes the sacrifice at the altar possible to how we need to remind ourselves to not make other people or things our "god." The wide range of topics that were so intellectually, mindfully, and courageously spoken about reignited my awe in God and his Church.

The most impactful part of the Congress for me was Jesus' presence through the Eucharist. Each night ended with Adoration, and there was one night that was especially meaningful. The whole day had been focused on healing, and I found the incredible power that lies in completely allowing God into the wounded areas of your heart. I thought I had let God fully

into my heart, but I hadn't, and the moment I did, I felt the most incredible peace within me. In that moment, I felt God's undeterred patience, as if he had been waiting for me to allow him to work on healing this area within me.

As the priest processed past us in the Lucas Oil Stadium, I looked around and noticed others giving everything to Jesus, similarly crying tears of relief. God was healing and entering into the hearts of all those gathered there who he was patiently waiting for.

I have a tattoo on my ankle that reads "ENOUGH" (anyone who knows my parents are probably asking "Do Dave and Dawn know you have a tattoo??" Haha!). I have this tattoo as a reminder that I am enough as I am. However, this moment with God expanded my meaning for it because I realized I am ENOUGH...with God.

I truly cannot express the beauty of this pilgrimage with tens of thousands of Catholics gathering for one purpose...to be with Jesus. I am forever changed because of the power of the Eucharist, and I know that every Catholic can be as well. I think our world more than anything needs a renewed hope

in our Church and each other, and this is exactly what the Congress did.

As my last year of college approaches, I am excited to bring this experience back with me to school. Although the Congress itself was one weekend, the impact of it is meant to extend outside of Indianapolis and infiltrate our daily lives, which is exactly what I plan to do.

At the end of the Congress, we were all challenged to reflect on who we would walk with on their faith journey upon returning to reality. As I reflected on who my "Walk with One" would be, I realized my school itself could be my "one."

I am looking forward to returning to school with a refreshed hope in the Church, a deeper understanding of God's love, and a desire to share it with others. I am beyond grateful for the opportunity to have attended the Congress and hope to gather with many more Catholics who feel called to simply "be with Jesus" and let him work within them at the next Congress in 2033!






