Dear Parishioners,

"Whoever eats this bread will live forever."

We are continuing our journey through the "Bread of Life" discourse. Every three years the cycle of readings focuses on John's Gospel and the extended meditation Jesus leads us through on the Eucharist.

It is mystical that the timing of this cycle of readings coincided with the conclusion of the Eucharistic

Congress in Indianapolis. As we have focused on the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of the Church, we are guided to the heart of the teachings of the Lord. This week we are presented with the core doctrine on the Eucharist, the "Real Presence."

One of the concerns that led to the Eucharistic Revival called for by the US Bishops of this country was the concern that less Catholics were attending Mass and many not understanding the doctrine on the "Real Presence."

The belief in the Real Presence can be traced to the writings of the early Church Fathers in the second century. These earliest of writings outside the scriptures validate that from the most ancient times Christians believed that Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist not merely symbolically or metaphorically.

Subsequent Councils of the Church reaffirmed the doctrine of the Real Presence. Priests were educated and formed on this core belief. Generation after generation of Christians held firm to this deeply held conviction that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist.

We hold dear to our hearts the transformative power the Eucharist can have on our behaviors, our choices, our values. This central belief can be hard to embrace in an ever-growing secular world where religious convictions are easily dismissed. We need to counter the inclinations of some to move away from this teaching. I pray that we will only deepen our conviction that the Lord is truly present in the Eucharist.

I often am deeply moved by the comfort the reception of the Eucharist can have for someone who is extremely ill or overwhelmed by life. The reception of the Eucharist binds us together as a community, enables us to continue the proclamation of the Good News and to transform the world.

We are deeply committed that in our school, religious education program and youth ministry, we are forming our young people with a solid foundation in the power of and meaning of the eucharist. We are committed to vibrant and life-giving liturgies that celebrate the sacred encounter we have with the Bread of life.

While I am on the topic of the Mass, we are always looking to expand the number of parishioners who are lectors, Eucharistic ministers, ushers, and greeters. Participation in these ministries can really enhance your faith. If you would like to get more information on how to serve the community in any of these ministries, please contact Margie André (mandre@olphglenview.org) at the parish office. If you would like to be part of our Music Ministry, please contact our Director of Music, Russell Stern (rstern@olphglenview.org). Many tell me that their sense of liturgy was deeply impacted by becoming more involved.

We have had several new families move into the parish. If you have children, check out our Sunday Family Mass at 9:30am in McDonnell Hall. It is very child friendly.

We need catechists for our Religious Education Program. This can also be a wonderful opportunity to deepen your faith. You can have a wonderful impact on our young students as they hear and see an adult who is a faithfilled person. Please contact Erin Bretts, our DRE, (ebretts@olphglenview.org) for more information.

This week is "Back to school" for our young people. I pray that this will be a year of many blessings and accomplishments for our students. We begin the year as the largest Catholic grammar school in the archdiocese and one of the largest Religious Education programs. I am so grateful to our teachers and catechists for their dedication and devotion to teaching. We are so blessed.

Last weekend's dedication of the bells and clock tower was terrific. It was great to have Bishop Jeffrey Grob preside. For those who were able to attend you got a bit of a taste of the capabilities of this new system that will call OLPH to prayer for generations to come. There is a plaque that will be in the main vestibule of the Church being prepared. It will mark the day of the dedication and list the principal donors. There is a temporary facsimile hanging in there for the time being. Thank you to all who made the bells possible.

seek, share, rejoice - bells and clock tower dedication...


Sunday, Aug. 11 was the dedication of the newly installed church bells system & clock tower of the church. The installation had been done in June and Sunday's dedication event included a special Mass and blessing outside along the front steps of the church.

Bishop Jeffrey Grob presided over the dedication and blessing ceremony. Accompanying Bishop Grob were our priests Fr. Jeremiah Boland, Fr. Larry Basbas, and Fr. James Barrett.

The event was launched with the Herald Trumpet sounds of **Philip Feo**. After the ceremony, there was a light reception in the Hellerman Garden and a concert of the bells systems. More than 100 parishioners attended the event.

The new bells and clock tower were made possible by the generosity of OLPH parishioners. The major donors of this gift were recognized at the ceremony and a commemorative plaque will be installed in the West Vestibule church lobby with their names.

The old bells system had not been in operation for more than a decade. This new system, made by the Verdin Company of Cincinnati, Ohio, will add to the beauty of the church experience for OLPH parishioners for years to come.





Recently, the National Eucharistic Congress was held in Indianapolis. Some of our parishioners were fortunate to have attended this wonderful event. This week Tom & Madelyn Tirpak share their experience.

Thank you, **Father Boland**, for the invitation to share our family's experience at the 10th National Eucharistic Congress. We'd like to start with a few words about why we decided to participate in the Congress as a family with our six kids (ages 8-19).

When we first learned about plans for the 2024 Congress, we recalled hearing about how Tom's grandfather had attended the International Eucharistic Congress in 1926 in Chicago, and how meaningful and uplifting it was for him to be together, prayerfully with thousands of Catholics in Soldier Field. We also recalled seeing photos from the 1926 gathering and wanted to experience a similar thing in our own times.

Though the word "congress" sounded kind of formal, we assumed that the 2024 gathering in Indianapolis would have something for the whole family. Indeed, when it came time to register for the Congress, we noticed there was a great variety of speakers, sessions and music. In addition to the main sessions in Lucas Oil Stadium, there were numerous breakout sessions, but we kept things simple and flexible. and just planned to attend as many of the main sessions as we could with our kids. We were open for what God wanted to give our family during the Congress. Our expectation was that by participating, we would deepen our Faith and appreciation for Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist.

What did we actually experience? The National Eucharistic Congress was an amazing, grace-filled event, with great speakers and music. It was one of the best-organized events (of any kind) that we've attended. Kudos to the organizers and the participants who were there in the spirit of pilgrimage, giving us peaceful assurance that we were there as family, even when the lines were long.

What were some highlights? Just being there together joyfully with more than 60,000 Catholics was very special. It felt like we were attending a big family reunion, experiencing how our Faith is alive and vibrant, with younger and older people, both laity and religious.


The Congress transformed the Lucas Oil Stadium, the Convention Center and downtown Indianapolis into a friendly Catholic village, with people from across the USA. Especially during the Masses and Eucharistic Adoration, it was a preview of heaven.

Our whole family enjoyed seeing and listening to "superstars" of our Catholic Faith. Top on our list were: Father Mike Schmitz, Bishop Robert Barron, and Jonathan Roumie. We recently finished watching Season 4 of The Chosen, and it was a special gift to hear Jonathan speak about how Faith, the Rosary

and the Eucharist have guided his work as an actor portraying Jesus Christ. It was incredibly moving when "TV Jesus" read the "Bread of Life" passage from the Gospel of John.

On Friday afternoon, during the Relevant Radio – Divine Mercy Session with **Father Rocky Hoffman**, **Patrick Madrid**, **Drew Mariani**, and **Bishop David Ricken**, we had the privilege of sharing our relic of Saint Faustina and giving a testimony about Divine Mercy.

As long-time supporters and friends of Relevant Radio, Father Rocky had asked us to explain how our family learned about the Divine Mercy Devotion, how we acquired the first-class relic, and how praying together with Saint Faustina, we have experienced some amazing moments of grace and mercy. We were on stage together as family, while Tom spoke to the 6,000 people attending this session. Next, Drew

Mariani gave a brief presentation about Divine Mercy and led us praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, as he does daily on Relevant Radio.

We are grateful to the organizers, presenters and participants, and feel fortunate to have been among the 60,000 people gathered in Indianapolis, along with many others on Livestream, united in faith, hope and love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

When our kids asked if we can already sign them up for the 11th National Eucharistic Congress in 2033, we were happy to know they appreciated being a part of this year's Congress.

God willing, we will all be there in 2033.

The Real Presence: The Cross

Weekly 3-Minute Reflections on the Eucharist using excerpts from 30 Day Eucharistic Revival by Fr. Don Calloway, MIC

"The Cross comes from God. He visits us now and then with the grace of Calvary, but also with the strength of His love. It is a comfort to see this love of God sweetening the Cross. It is necessary for the Cross to come to us; otherwise, we should always remain on Mount Tabor.

Fortify yourself well in the love of Jesus Christ and in what are the real tests of love for Him; that is, the Cross, detachment from creatures, and immolation of self to His greater glory, and you will feel as there is new life in you and an ocean of peace."

Reflection

It is necessary for the Cross to come to us.

The Cross, in a certain sense, can be considered as the spiritual wedding ring that Christ wears and gives to His bride, the Church. By wearing this spiritual wedding band—the Cross—on your soul, the loving union between you and Christ is manifested to the world. Never abandon or take off the sign of Christ's love. The Cross is the pledge of your commitment to Christ.

What bride doesn't want to wear a beautiful wedding ring? The Cross is the ultimate "bling" in the spiritual life. It shows the world that you are loved by God.



In 1206, Jesus spoke to St. Francis of Assisi from the Cross in the ruined Chapel of San Damiano and said, "Francis, go repair my house, which, as you can see, is falling

completely to ruin."

Jesus, the divine bridegroom and lover of our souls, invites you to wear the wedding ring of the Cross and follow him faithfully on the Via Crucis (the Way of the Cross): "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me." That's Luke 9:23. If you truly love Christ you will want to wear "the ring" every day. Wearing it is not easy, but it is worth it. Suffering for love of Jesus is always worth it.

The Eucharist gives souls supernatural power to carry the Cross, be faithful to Jesus, and willingly embrace suffering out of love for God and others. The Eucharist fortifies fidelity and will enable you to become a saint. All Catholic prayers and devotions begin with the sign of the commitment, the Sign of the Cross.

The Holy Mass begins this way and so do all truly Catholic prayers and devotions. Praise God today for the gift of the Cross. Praise Him for the gift of the spiritual wedding ring. Promise to love Him in good times and in bad, in health and in sickness, in riches and in poverty, in life and in death "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."
