Dear Parishioners,

"Welcome the word that is planted in you."

Happy Labor Day weekend!

The establishment of the first Monday in September as a national holiday honoring the contributions of workers was proclaimed in 1894 by **President Grover Cleveland**. A day devoted to honoring the contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and well-being.

The early 19th century was plagued by much strife between workers and their employers. Great strides were made to improve the working conditions of employees, child labor laws were enacted as well as the 40-hour work week. Since then, much has been done to respect and improve the working conditions of employees, but new realities require constant vigilance.

While many associate Labor Day with the end of summer, with BBQs and parades, we need to also call to mind the meaning of Labor Day.

The Catholic Church has a long and influential tradition in advocating for the rights and human dignity of those who labor. The first pope to address the rights of workers was Pope Leo XIII with his extraordinary encyclical, Rerum Novarum.

Church teaching begins with a reflection traced back to the Book of Genesis. We are to cultivate and care for the earth which the Lord God has entrusted to us. In our work we contribute to the ongoing transformation of the world. We become co-creators with the Lord.

Every human being as the Church has taught has a God given right to a just wage, a safe working environment and guarantee to be treated with dignity and respect.

There continue to be global challenges in which human trafficking - modern day enslavement - is very real. The tremendous inequity in wealth and the oppression of poverty call out to us as followers of the Lord Jesus.

As the Letter of St. James proclaims this weekend, "the Word has been planted in us!" God is at work in us as we work in the world. Our Christian identity continues to challenge us to continue the work of redemption and transformation.

I encourage you to consider participating in this semester's Scripture Study program. The focus will be on St. Paul's letters that were written during the many times he was imprisoned. They provide a powerful insight into the theology and the humanity of one of the most consequential Christians. Our Scripture Study program is

one of OLPH's great blessings. It has had a tremendous impact on hundreds of parishioners. No matter how many times you have heard passages from the scriptures, you get a group of folks sharing their reflections and you often see and hear things you would have never thought of.

Can't wait for next weekend's Block Party, it is the official beginning of the new parish year. Nobody does a better job like our Men's Club. After last week's impressive Golf Outing, we will have a wonderful time celebrating the friendships that grace this parish. If you are new to OLPH please come! 

INSTRUMENTALISTS AND SINGERS OF ALL AGES NEEDED



Anytime is a great time to join one of the choirs and help continue to build the Music Ministry at OLPH. This is a wonderful opportunity to serve God and the parish through sharing your gifts of music and song. And it promises to be a lot of fun as well! The following groups are all directed by our music director, **Russell Stern**. New members are always welcome and encouraged to join throughout the year.

The Adult Festival Choir

- We sing at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesday evenings from 7:45-9:15pm. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 10.

The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- Sings at the 10:30am Mass throughout the year.
- All singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15 PM in the music office The first rehearsal is on Sept. 10.
- Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month at the Sunday 5:00pm Mass and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students grade 7 through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearses in the church before the Mass they are singing at and sometimes on Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). We will have a welcome meeting/ rehearsal on Oct. 1 at 6:45pm in the Church.

The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, usually at the 10:30am Mass from October through Mother's Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- · 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesdays, starting Oct. 1, from 5:45-6:30pm

Cantors

 Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors will sing periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) Formerly RCIA

In the spirit of Renew My Church, OCIA (the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) — formerly known as RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) — will now be a joint effort between OLPH and our neighboring parishes, St. Catherine Labouré and St. Norbert.

What is OCIA and why is it no longer called RCIA?

OCIA is a program designed for individuals who are discerning their call to the Catholic faith.

Whether you're unbaptized, baptized in another Christian tradition, or a baptized Catholic seeking full communion with the Church, OCIA provides a structured path to explore, understand, and embrace the teachings of Catholicism. In that sense, it is no different from RCIA. The name was officially changed in 2021 in order to reflect the nature of the process as an ongoing ORDER of rites rather than a singular rite.

OCIA is more than just learning about Catholic doctrines, it is transformative;

it's a time of spiritual growth, self-discovery, and conversion. By the end of the process, you'll be prepared to fully embrace the Catholic faith, not just intellectually, but in your heart and soul.

We are also looking for additional facilitators/catechists. (A class manual will be provided for you.) If you are eager to help others on their path to faith, we want and need you!
