Dear Parishioners,

"Ephphatha, be opened!"

Jesus's command that the blindman's ears be opened is a powerful reminder of a fundamental consequence of Jesus's ministry. He was always able to open what was closed, whether it was deafness or the rock that sealed him in a tomb.

We all have aspects of our lives that have been sealed shut, it

could be resentments we hold on to, the inability to get over memories of the past. We can refuse to be open to the changes that have taken place around us. We can refuse to accept that someone has changed, or the circumstances of our life are different.

It takes a leap of faith to "be opened" to new life, new possibilities, new realities. In a parish, people can live in the past and have great difficulty dealing with the fact that things have changed. There can be great resistance in the workplace to new ways of doing things, new technologies. In our society that can be tremendous fear and resistance to the fact that we are far more diverse racially or culturally than we were.

Jesus constantly was calling people to "be open" to the Spirit, to a new moment of God's revelation to us through the birth of his son. We know that Jesus constantly faced resistance to his call to embrace the Word of God, the invitation to embrace the Kingdom, to see the present moment as a fulfillment of what had been prophesized.

The Lord keeps calling us to be open to moving forward in our spiritual journey. We never stop growing spiritually or emotionally. New opportunities keep calling us to rethink the world as we see it. I think of the fast pace of technology; things just keep changing and choosing to seal ourselves off from the world we live in is not a life-giving option.

As a new program year begins, there are a whole host of possibilities to continue our spiritual journey, maybe this is the year to try a semester of scripture study or attend **Fr. Barrett's** book club or attend a retreat at Bellarmine Retreat House in Barrington. Maybe getting involved in the Sharing Room ministry or more regularly attending Mass. Maybe now is the time to renew friendships or embark on forming new friendships. Maybe finding more quality time to be present to one's family is important.

We all too quickly settle into predictable patterns of activity in our lives. The Lord's command, "Ephphatha, be opened!" could be a clarion invitation we might all benefit from.

There is nothing that gets us in the mood for a new beginning like our annual Block Party which takes place this Saturday with Mass at 5:00pm followed by a party in the parking lot. There will be plenty of food and drink and entertainment for all ages. Please Come! The Men's Club has been planning this event for months and it will not disappoint. 

The Adult Festival Choir

- Sings at the 10:30am Mass throughout the year.
- · All singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- · The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15pm in the music office. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 17.
- · Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- · Sings approximately once a month at the Sunday 5:00pm Mass and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students grade 7 through young adult are welcome.
- · No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- · Rehearses in the church before the Mass they are singing at and sometimes on Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). We will have a welcome meeting/ rehearsal on Oct. 1 at 6:45pm in the Church.

The Children's Choir

- · Sings once a month, usually at the 10:30am Mass from October through Mother's Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- · 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesdays, starting Oct. 1, from 5:45-6:30pm

Cantors


· Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors will sing periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) Formerly RCIA

In the spirit of Renew My Church, **OCIA** (the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) — formerly known as RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) — will now be a joint effort between OLPH and our neighboring parishes, St. Catherine Labouré and St. Norbert.

What is OCIA and why is it no longer called RCIA?

OCIA is a program designed for individuals who are

discerning their call to the Catholic faith. Whether you're unbaptized, baptized in another Christian tradition, or a baptized Catholic seeking full communion with the Church, OCIA provides a structured path to explore, understand, and embrace the teachings of Catholicism.

In that sense, it is no different from RCIA. The name was officially changed in 2021 in order to reflect the nature of the process as an ongoing ORDER of rites rather than a singular rite.

OCIA is more than just learning about Catholic doctrines, it is transformative; it's a time of spiritual growth, self-discovery, and conversion. By the end of the process, you'll be prepared to fully embrace the Catholic faith, not just intellectually, but in your heart and soul.
