Dear Parishioners,

"If faith does not have good works, it is dead."

One of the great social scientists of the 20th century was **Margaret Mead**. As an anthropologist her research of ancient civilizations provided tremendous insight into the evolution of the human person.

She was once asked what she thought was the first sign of civilization in a culture. The student expected she was going to refer

to the discovery of clay pots or primitive tools. But no, Margaret Mead said the first sign of civilization in ancient culture was a femur(thigh bone) that had been broken and healed. If you broke your leg, you were dead; you cannot walk, run from danger, or get to a food source. No animal survives a broken bone. A broken femur that was healed is evidence that someone took the time to stay with the one who fell, bound their wound, protected them, and fed them.

This moment of empathy distinguished the animal kingdom from the human kingdom.

The Letter of St. James challenges us to see our instinct for empathy and put it in the context of faith. "If faith does not have good works, it is dead." We must be more than platitudes and cheery thoughts. We must "walk the talk" in our care and concern for the larger world.

There can be a heartless lack of empathy in our culture that is driven by self-interest and self-reliance. In recent years I have seen an evolution in teaching young children to develop empathy in their dealings with others. Kindness and compassion need to be cultivated and nurtured.

As followers of Christ, we see in his vision of the Kingdom of God, that as we take up our cross, we walk in solidarity with all those who suffer or are overwhelmed by the challenges of life. Reflecting on the concrete choices to be empathetic and compassionate, we move away from a self-centered world to one which is "other centered" and Christ like. We can better answer the question posed in the Gospel this weekend, "Who do people say that I am?"

I am always appreciative of the efforts in our parish to reach out to those in need whether within our parish or beyond. A month does not go by that the Women's Club does not challenge us to be empathetic. These drives do not challenge economic systems, but you do not realize what a difference a container of laundry detergent can be for one who cannot afford it.

Each week our Sharing Room reaches out to help with

the most basic of human needs; food, clothing and housewares, most of these contributions find there way into the hands of someone who needs them within hours of being dropped off. Thank you!

In our Religious Education Program and in our School, our students are always encouraged to help others in need.

Sr. Paulanne and the Needy Family Fund assist people in crises in ways you cannot imagine.

One of the more uplifting moments of our weekend liturgies is the procession of children bringing food at the offertory time. Thank you!

This week, let us ask ourselves how often have good works been part of my daily dealing with the world?

Last weekend was for me OLPH at its best and required a lot of last-minute maneuvering to make sure everything from the Scripture Study Seminar, **Sally Corbett's** funeral to the Block Party and a host of other events could happen. Thanks to everyone who made it happen behind the scenes!



The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) Formerly RCIA

In the spirit of Renew My Church, **OCIA** (the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) — formerly known as RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) — will now be a joint effort between OLPH and our neighboring parishes, St. Catherine Labouré and St. Norbert.

What is OCIA and why is it no longer called RCIA?

OCIA is a program designed for individuals who are

discerning their call to the Catholic faith. Whether you're unbaptized, baptized in another Christian tradition, or a baptized Catholic seeking full communion with the Church, OCIA provides a structured path to explore, understand, and embrace the teachings of Catholicism.

In that sense, it is no different from RCIA. The name was officially changed in 2021 in order to reflect the nature of the process as an ongoing ORDER of rites rather than a singular rite.

ARCHDIOCESAN SEMINARY COLLECTION

OLPH supports the educational formation of our archdiocesan seminarians by contributing to the Archdiocesan Seminarian Education collection for their education and formation needs. We do this as part of our parish First Fruits Program, instead of taking up a second collection.

As a reminder, the first 6% of each weekly and holy day offertory collection is set aside for our First Fruits Program. Instead of taking up certain second collections, OLPH splits this 6% among our four sharing parishes and five named Archdiocesan second collections over the course of the year. This Archdiocesan second collection for our seminarians, taken up in the Archdiocese during the weekend of September 21-22, is one of the second collections funded through our First Fruits Program.

If you choose, however, to make a separate gift, there are envelopes available at the entrances to the Church; there is a button open on the GiveCentral OLPH portal; or, you can give directly to the Archdiocese at archchicago.org/seminarianfund.

Let us also remember to pray for our seminarians who are in this important period of formation as they strive to answer God's call to serve.

INSTRUMENTALISTS AND SINGERS OF ALL AGES NEEDED



Anytime is a great time to join one of the choirs and help continue to build the Music Ministry at OLPH. This is a wonderful opportunity to serve God and the parish through sharing your gifts of music and song. And it promises to be a lot of fun as well! The following groups are all directed by our music director, **Russell Stern**. New members are always welcome and encouraged to join throughout the year.

The Adult Festival Choir

- We sing at the 9:00am Mass on Sunday (and sometimes other Masses) until the first week of June. We also sing for Holidays and special occasions. All singers are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesday evenings from 7:45-9:15pm. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 17.

The 10:30 Mass Ensemble

- Sings at the 10:30am Mass throughout the year.
- All singers are welcome and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- The singers rehearse in the church on Tuesdays from 7:45-9:15pm in the music office. The first rehearsal is on Sept. 17.
- Instrumentalists rehearse prior to the Mass or as needed.

The Teen/Young Adult Ensemble

- Sings approximately once a month at the Sunday 5:00pm Mass and for Christmas, Easter and other special occasions, until early June.
- Students grade 7 through young adult are welcome.
- No audition required for singers. Instrumentalists are encouraged to audition.
- Rehearses in the church before the Mass they are singing at and sometimes on Tuesdays, 6:45pm (depending on the teen's availability). We will have a welcome meeting/ rehearsal on Oct. 1 at 6:45pm in the Church.

The Children's Choir

- Sings once a month, usually at the 10:30am Mass from October through Mother's Day. They also sing at the Christmas Eve 3:00pm Mass, and on Easter.
- · 1st thru 7th grade children are welcome.
- Rehearses in the church on Tuesdays, starting Oct. 1, from 5:45-6:30pm

Cantors

 Cantors are auditioned from the choir and are then trained. They are scheduled to sing for 1-3 Masses a month depending upon the church's need and the cantor's availability. A Schola Cantorum made up of our cantors will sing periodically at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass.
